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ABSTRACT

This report presents data and findings from a 5-year follow-up study to an earlier 16-year (1974-1989) longitudinal study of trends in the hiring and promotion of female faculty within the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education. The two studies have produced an information base on full-time faculty in the state system from 1974-75 through 1994-95. After brief sections on the study's purpose, history, and method, tables present detailed findings for: (1) number, percentage, and distribution of full-time total faculty by institution and sex; (2) number, percentage, and distribution of full-time professors, associate professors, assistant professors, and instructors by institution and sex; (3) number, percentage, and distribution of full-time total faculty at the professor rank by institution and sex; (4) number, percentage, and distribution of graduate student full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment by institution and sex; (5) number, percentage, and distribution of undergraduate FTE enrollment by institution and sex; and (6) ratio of undergraduate student FTE enrollment to full-time total faculty by institution and sex. Discussion of the data notes the continuing lack of gender parity among college faculty and presents a nine-item call for action. Extensive appendices provide further detailed tables for each institution, graphs comparing institutions, and a set of guidelines. (Contains 35 references.) (DB)

FOREWORD



Five years ago the Institute for Women published a 16-year longitudinal study, *"The Status of Female Faculty in Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education: An Historical Perspective, 1974-1989 (Keetz, 1991),"* which was the first report by any group or individual within Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education (State System) to examine female faculty's equitable representation in the State System. The study provided important historical background and data which documented the low number and status of female faculty in the State System during the time period examined. The study concluded with A Call for Action which included eight recommendations, one of which noted the need for subsequent studies. One of the recommended studies was to "conduct follow-up studies to this study [1991] every five years to ensure that 'progress' is really being made in the hiring and promotion of female faculty (Keetz, 1991, p. 34)." Thus, data reported in the five-year extension (1990-1994) of the original study (1974-1989) will serve as a basis for determining the extent to which women are present and equitably represented on the faculty within the State System and at each of its 14 universities.

A lengthy study such as this could not have been completed without the support of a number of individuals and offices. 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I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this study is to establish an information base from 1974-75 through 1994-95 on full-time faculty in the State System and separately at each of its 14 universities. The information base will permit longitudinal comparisons to be made with the findings of the original 16-year study (Keetz, 1991) and the 5-year extension, 1990-91 through 1994-95, about the following:

- (1) the numbers and percentages of full-time faculty by sex as related to the numbers and percentages within the State System and a sample of similar national Category II-A and II-B public universities (characterized by diverse post-baccalaureate programs but do not engage in significant doctoral-level education),
- (2) the distribution of full-time faculty among professorial ranks by sex as related to the numbers and percentages within the State System and a sample of similar national Category II-A and II-B public universities,
- (3) the numbers and percentages of full-time faculty at full professor rank by sex as related to the numbers and percentages within the State System and a sample of similar national Category II-A and II-B public universities,
- (4) student full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment by enrollment status and sex within the State System, and
- (5) ratios of undergraduate student FTE enrollment to full-time total faculty by sex within the State System.

These comparisons will indicate the extent to which the number, percentage, and distribution among ranks of State System female faculty have increased or decreased over a period of time and are representative of female faculty at similar Category II-A and II-B public universities nationally. The analyses will also show the degree to which student enrollment and ratios of undergraduate student FTE enrollment to full-time total faculty by sex have fluctuated since 1974-75.

II. HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE

Women were formally recognized as an equity group on April 19, 1988 when the State System of Higher Education Board of Governors approved the "*Affirmative Action and Equal Opportunity Plan: A Prospectus (Prospectus)*." Each State System university was charged to use the *Prospectus* (1988) as a guide in developing its affirmative action plan for the following groups: Blacks (Whites at Cheyney University), Hispanics, Asians/Pacific Islanders, Native Americans, Women, Vietnam Veterans, and the Disabled. The 14 plans were then to comprise the State System's Affirmative Action Plan for the academic years 1988-89 through 1992-93.

No explanation or documentation was given to explain the inclusion of women with the other equity groups in the *Prospectus* (1988). Rather, the *Prospectus* (1988) suggested that the numbers of female faculty were inadequate and their professional advancement was limited. The *Prospectus*' (1988) three-page chapter, "*The State System Commitment to Women in Higher Education*," recommended that the American Council on Education Commission on Women in Higher Education's 15 guidelines should be adopted by the State System "*as standards against which to develop policy and procedures*" (p. 37). The second of the 15 guidelines stated: "*Identify and correct inequities that may exist in hiring, promotion, tenure, and salary of women faculty administrators, and staff*" (p. 38).

A review of documents published by the State System and the faculty union, Association of Pennsylvania State College and University Faculty (APSCUF), suggests the historical significance of the 1988 *Prospectus* as the document relates to women. It appears that neither the Pennsylvania Department of Education prior to 1983 and the Chancellor's Office after 1983 nor APSCUF mentioned women as a separate equity group prior to the publication of the System-wide affirmative action policy in 1988. Nor can evidence be found that either group has analyzed or publicized information about gender equity in the State System's faculty since the publication of *Prospectus* (1988), despite the availability of data.

The first State System planning document, "*The Mission and the Strategic Direction Statements for the State System of Higher Education*" (1984), did not mention a gender-balanced faculty when it identified eight strategic direction statements for subsequent System-wide planning. However, the seventh strategic direction statement did deal with the System's need to attract, serve, and retain minority students. The latter part of the seventh statement also addressed minority faculty: "*Each university will intensify efforts to attract and retain minority faculty and staff, and to seek cooperation with local business and industry to improve educational opportunities for minority employees. The universities will share expertise and successes in cultural integration and support*" (p. 9).

There does not appear to have been any APSCUF overt recognition of gender issues during the 1970s. Then, in the early 1980s, APSCUF formed a committee on

the Quality of Higher Education which published three reports. The first two reports, *"Excellence in Public Higher Education, A Call for Action: Comments and Recommendations"* (March, 1984, Revised May, 1984) and *"Faculty Development in the State System of Higher Education, An Agenda for Reform: Comments and Recommendations"* (April, 1986), did not address gender issues. However, the third report, *"With Quality for All: Comments and Recommendations for Being Responsive to Students"* (Summer, 1988), noted in passing the importance of educating *"the many, including women, the economically disadvantaged, minorities, and older students"* (p. 2), and a possible emerging trend, *"the second generation of post-World War II male professors is being replaced by a post-1960's generation of women"* (p. 16). The Committee's third report made 27 recommendations, none of which pertained to gender equity issues.

In contrast to the first State System planning document (1984), the second planning document, *"Priorities for Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education during the 1990s"* (Priorities, 1990), was more specific about the relatively low number of female faculty than was suggested in the 1988 *Prospectus*. It recommended that each university *"should establish a special committee or commission of faculty and administrators to develop goals, criteria, guidelines, and procedures for the recruitment of new faculty"* (p. 36). Tasks which might be assigned to such a committee included:

- 1) providing *"leadership in educating colleagues about the need for greater diversity within the faculty to enrich the campus community and enhance the education of our students; diversity encompasses racial, ethnic and socio-economic background, age, gender, and atypical work or life experiences"* (p. 36), and
- 2) developing *"awareness of the comparatively low ratio of female faculty to the increasing numbers of female students (1 to 42) and to the increasing availability of female doctorates; recommend particular strategies for recruiting and retaining women faculty, such as child care, flexible course scheduling for single parents, dual appointments, spousal appointments at sister universities, and other appropriate initiatives"* (p. 37).

It was not clear when and how the low ratio of female faculty to female students was determined. What were the definitions of the terms *"female faculty"* and *"female students?"* What time period was cited for the ratio? How was the ratio calculated? How did this ratio compare to ratios for earlier and/or later time periods?

In the five-year period from 1990-91 to 1994-95, the State System issued two publications. The first was *"Emphasis on Values: A Priority for Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education during the 1990s"* (Values, 1991). Its purpose was to *"consider and recommend a variety of strategies that might be employed at System universities to implement the new priorities [Priorities, 1990] focusing on the ethical dimensions of the curriculum and the processes by which students develop, test and*

articulate personal values" (p. 8). The *Values* (1991) document notes that the *Priorities* (1990) report "does call for greater attention to what is taught at System universities, both in and out of the classroom, with regard to certain values: respect for individual and cultural differences, social justice, academic integrity, the democratic process, and service to others" (p. 10). So it provides a definition of "Values Education", the need for increased emphasis on Values Education, and suggested strategies which could be employed to strengthen Values Education within the State System. These strategies are quite comprehensive and encompass the System level and institutional initiatives; curriculum and co-curricular strategies; and issues of academic integrity and multiculturalism, pluralism, and diversity. Nowhere in the report, however, is the low status of female faculty within the State System or the disproportionate ratios of female and male students to female faculty mentioned.

The second publication was the State System's Affirmative Action Plan for the 1990s, "*Excellence and Equity - A Plan for Building Community in Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education (Equity Plan, 1994)*." The State System reaffirmed "*its responsibility to address specific needs of this segment [women] of the university population*" (*Equity Plan, 1994, p.23*) and the commitment it initially made in the *Prospectus* (1988) to adoption of the guidelines developed by the ACE (American Council on Education) Commission on Women in Higher Education (*Equity Plan, 1994, p.23*; listed in Appendix C). The *Equity Plan* (1994) further states:

While it may not be feasible for each university to immediately respond to each guideline, the Equity Plan urges the System's institutional leadership to ensure that, over the lifetime of the Equity Plan, priorities and time frames for addressing all these areas are established. (p.24)
[*Equity Plan's emphasis*]

Thus, the guidelines are to be used as standards against which university policies and procedures are to be developed to redress the need "*to increase the number of race/ethnic minority and women teaching [Equity Plan's emphasis] faculty, and differential grade/rank in initial appointments, promotion, and retention (p. 22).*"

The *Equity Plan* (1994) also includes continuing assessment as an important part of the State System's commitment to its equity initiatives. Equity assessment, as defined in the *Equity Plan* (1994), includes Annual Reports, Equity Program Reviews every four to five years, and Equity Symposia every other year, beginning in 1996.

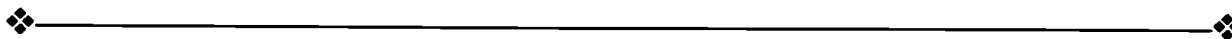
There have been several significant events related to APSCUF's Legislative Assembly which reflect that organization's increased responsiveness to gender equity in the State System. Keetz was invited to make two presentations related to her research about the status of female faculty in the State System: the first was in November, 1989 when she presented her study, "*The Status of Women in the State System and APSCUF*" (1989) and a second time in November 1991 when her original state study, "*The Status of Female Faculty in Pennsylvania's State System of Higher*

Education: An Historical Perspective, 1974 - 1989", (1991) was presented. Then, in April, 1992 the Assembly's Women's Caucus motion to establish a Gender Issues Standing Committee was approved by the Assembly. Concurrent with these events was a significant increase in the number and percentage of elected female Legislative Assembly delegates (Keetz, 1995): there was an increase from 11 (15%), a percentage which is below the percentage of full-time female faculty (22%), in 1980-81 to a high of 27 (30%) in 1994-95, an increase which is slightly lower than the percentage of full-time female faculty (34%). This significant increase in number and percentage (of elected female Legislative Assembly delegates) began four years ago and continued through 1994-95. However, women continue to be underrepresented in leadership positions within the organization, although committee membership has increased. (Keetz, 1989; *1994-95 APSCUF Leadership Directory*)

This longitudinal study examines the readily available data about State System faculty to answer the following series of significant questions related to the inclusion of women in the 1988 *Prospectus* as an equity group, concerns expressed in *Priorities* (1990), omission of gender equity issues in *Values* (1991), and affirmative action plans for the 1990s in *Equity Plan* (1994).

- 1) What are the numbers and percentages of full-time female faculty at each professorial rank prior to and subsequent to the State System's 1988 affirmative action plan (*Prospectus*)?
- 2) Have the number and percentage of female faculty increased since *Prospectus* (1988) was adopted?
- 3) Are female faculty represented equitably in number and percentage at each professorial rank?
- 4) Has the ratio of female undergraduate FTE enrollment to female full-time total faculty decreased significantly since *Prospectus* (1988) was adopted?

These and other questions concerning faculty gender equity within the State System and at each of the 14 State System Universities will be examined in this study.



III. METHOD

The author has collected State System data about full-time faculty by rank and gender and students by enrollment status and gender. The State System Universities are classified as Category II-A or II-B institutions in the American Association of University Professors' (AAUP) annual report on the economic status of the profession. This classification system permits comparative analyses between the State System, national averages, and a sample of similar national public colleges/universities.

Data about full-time faculty in the State System were obtained from the following sources:

1974 - 1975

AAUP's annual report on the economic status of the profession. This was the first year that AAUP reported faculty at each professorial rank by sex. No faculty data were available from the Pennsylvania Department of Education for this year.

1975-76 through 1985-86 and 1987-88 through 1994-95

Division of Data Services, Pennsylvania Department of Education.

1986 - 1987

Central Management Information Center Data Base. Complete data were not available from the Pennsylvania Department of Education or AAUP's annual report on the economic status of the profession.

Linear interpolation was used to estimate full-time faculty for Cheyney University in 1976-77 and 1977-78 and for Mansfield University in 1975-76 as no data were reported by these institutions for these time periods. Estimated numbers for full-time faculty at Cheyney and Mansfield were rounded to the nearest whole numbers in *Tables 1-5*; this explained the slight differences in total numbers for Cheyney (1976-77 and 1977-78) and Mansfield (1975-76) in *Appendix A Table 1*.

Data about full-time and part-time undergraduate students enrolled in the State System from 1974-75 through 1994-95 were obtained from the Division of Data Services, Pennsylvania Department of Education. Full-time equivalent (FTE) for students was calculated as:

$$\text{FTE} = \text{Number of full-time students} + 1/2 \text{ Number of part-time students.}$$

Fractional student FTE enrollment figures were rounded to the nearest whole numbers in *Tables 7 and 8*; this explained the slight differences in total numbers in *Appendix A Tables 4*.

The term "status" was defined as the number of full-time faculty and their distribution among the four professorial ranks: professor, associate professor, assistant professor and instructor.

The definitions for Category II-A or II-B public colleges/universities were the same as those used by AAUP in its annual reports on the economic status of the profession:

Category II-A (*Comprehensive Institutions*)

These institutions are characterized by diverse post-baccalaureate programs (including first professional) but do not engage in significant doctoral-level education.

Category II-B (*General Baccalaureate*)

These institutions are characterized by their primary emphasis on general undergraduate baccalaureate level education. These institutions are not significantly engaged in post-baccalaureate education.

Comparative data about full-time faculty at selected Category II-A and II-B public colleges/universities were obtained from the following sources:

California

1989-90

Information about 17 of the 19 California State Universities was obtained from AAUP's Annual Report on the Economic Status of the Profession, 1989-90 (*Academe: Bulletin of the AAUP, 1990*). Two universities were excluded because they were polytechnic institutions.

1994-95

Information about 17 of the 20 California State Universities was obtained from AAUP's Annual Report on the Economic Status of the Profession, 1994-95 (*Academe: Bulletin of the AAUP, 1995*). Two universities were excluded because they were polytechnic institutions and a third university was excluded because it was not cited in AAUP's 1989-90 Report (1990).

New York

Data for the 12 State University of New York (SUNY) Colleges in these Categories were obtained from AAUP's Annual Reports on the Economic Status of the Profession, 1989-90 (1990) and 1994-95 (1995).

New Jersey

Data for the eight State Colleges were obtained from the New Jersey Department of Higher Education.

National Totals

Data were tabulated by Maryse Eymonerie Associates and based on information provided by institutions for the purpose of the AAUP Annual Reports on the Economic Status of the Profession, 1989-90 (*Academe: Bulletin of the AAUP, 1990*) and 1994-95 (*Academe: Bulletin of the AAUP, 1995*).

IV. FINDINGS REGARDING SYSTEM-WIDE DATA



1. *Number, Percentage and Distribution of Full-time Total Faculty by Institution and Sex*

(Table 1, Figure 1, Appendix A Tables 1, and Appendix B Figures 1)

During the 21-year period, the number of full-time State System total faculty grew in number from 4,095 to 4,558, an increase of 463 positions (*Table 1*). Female total faculty numbered 890 in 1974-75 and 1,552 in 1994-95, an increase of 662 women. During the same period, the number of male faculty declined from 3,205 to 3,006, a decrease of 199 males. The increase in the number of female total faculty in the State System averaged 31.5 positions per year since 1974-75, whereas the number of male faculty has decreased an average of 9.5 positions in the same time period.

During the five-year period from 1990-91 to 1994-95, the number of full-time State System total faculty decreased in number from 4,577 to 4,558, a loss of 19 positions (*Table 1*). Female faculty numbered 1,404 in 1990-91 and 1,552 in 1994-95, an increase of 148 women. During the same period, the number of male total faculty declined from 3,173 to 3,006, a decrease of 167 males. The increase in the number of female total faculty averaged 29.6 positions per year since 1990-91; however, the number of male faculty decreased an average of 33.4 positions in the same time period.

 PA State System of Higher Education 1983-94

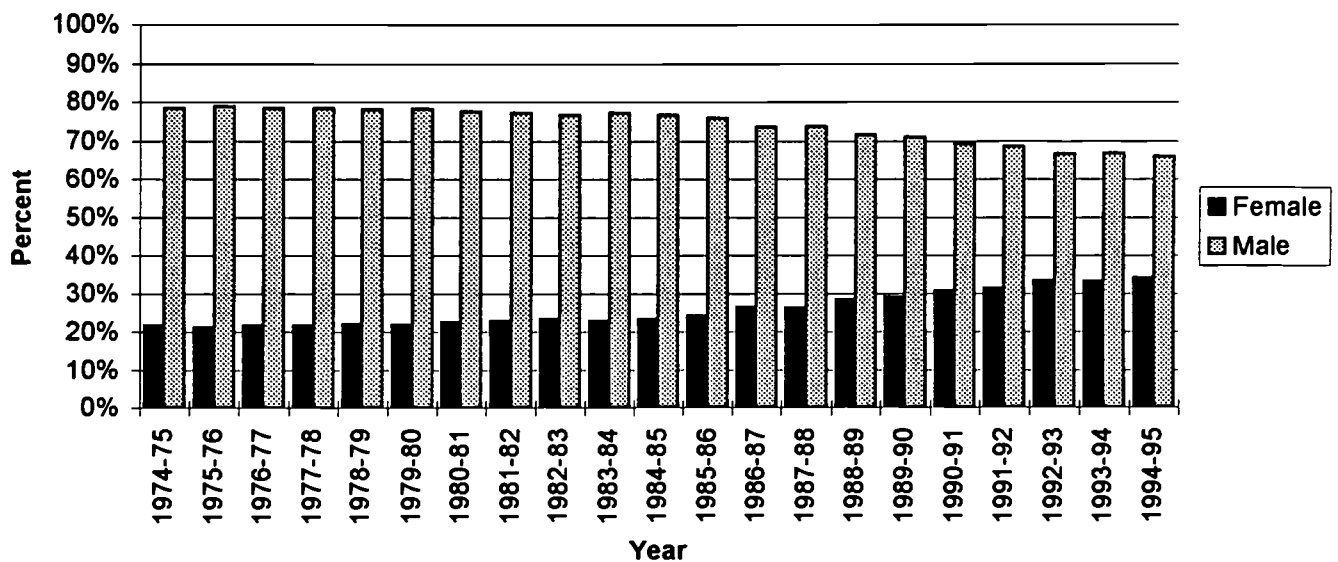

During the 21-year period the percentage of female total faculty increased at the individual campuses: Edinboro (18%), Bloomsburg (16%), Slippery Rock (16%), Clarion (15%), Kutztown (15%), Lock Haven (15%), California (12%), Indiana (12%), Millersville (10%), West Chester (10%), Shippensburg (8%), Cheyney (7%), East Stroudsburg (6%), and Mansfield (5%). The overall percentage increase of female total faculty in the State System was 12 percent from 1974-75 (22%) to 1994-95 (34%), an average of 0.60 percent per year.

During the five-year period from 1990-91 to 1994-95, the percentage of female total faculty increased at 12 universities: Bloomsburg (6%), Cheyney (6%), Slippery Rock (6%), Indiana (5%), Millersville (5%), Lock Haven (4%), West Chester (4%), Edinboro (3%), Kutztown (3%), Mansfield (3%), Shippensburg (3%), and California (2%). The percentage remained the same at Clarion and decreased at East Stroudsburg (3%). *Table 1, Appendix A Table 1* for each university and *Appendix B Figure 1* for each university should be examined carefully to determine the variability of numbers and percentages of full-time State System total faculty by sex from 1974-75 through 1994-95.

2. *Number, Percentage, and Distribution of Full-time Professors by Institution and Sex*

(Table 2, Figure 2, Appendix A Tables 1, and Appendix B Figures 2)

The number of State System full-time faculty at the highest rank has increased from 1,167 to 1,548, an increase of 381 positions during the 21-year time period (Table 2). The number of faculty at the professor rank has increased for both women and men; however, the increase in the number of male faculty is greater. Female professors numbered 130 in 1974-75 and 273 in 1994-95, an increase of 143 women since 1974-75. During the same time period, the number of male professors increased from 1,037 to 1,275, an increase of 238 males since 1974-75. This data shows that approximately one in three faculty hired or advanced to the professor level since 1974-75 were women.

During the five-year period from 1990-91 to 1994-95, full-time State System total faculty at the full professor level has decreased from 1,553 to 1,548, a loss of five positions (Table 2). Female full professors numbered 224 in 1990-91 and 273 in 1994-95, an increase of 49 women. During the same time period, the number of male full professors declined from 1,329 to 1,275, a decrease of 54 males. Figure 2 shows a slow, steady decline in the number of male full professors since 1990-91 whereas there has been a slow increase of female full professors.

PA State System of Higher Education 1983-94

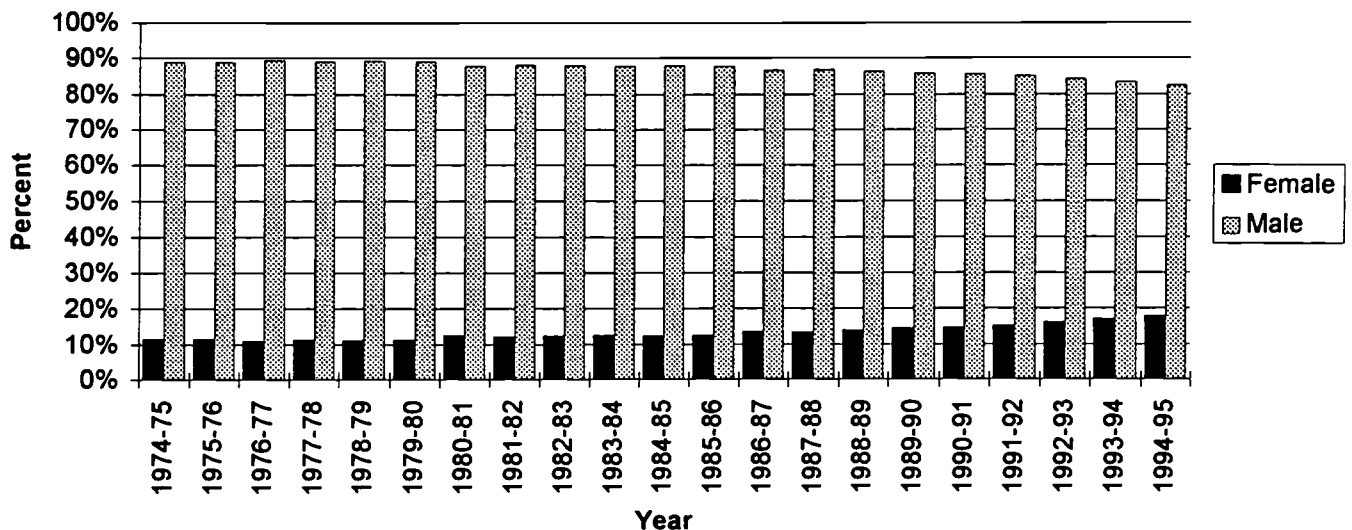

The percentage of female professors increased at 12 universities during the 21-year period: Cheyney (17%), California (12%), East Stroudsburg (12%), Slippery Rock (9%), Bloomsburg (8%), Indiana (7%), Millersville (7%), Clarion (6%), Edinboro (5%), Shippensburg (5%), West Chester (4%), and Mansfield (1%). The percentage of female professors declined at one campus, Lock Haven (1%), and remained about the same at another university, Kutztown.

During the 5-year period from 1990-91 to 1994-95 there was a percentage increase of female full professors at 13 universities: Cheyney (12%), Mansfield (6%), Clarion (5%), Bloomsburg (4%), East Stroudsburg (4%), Indiana (4%), Slippery Rock (4%), West Chester (3%), California (2%), Millersville (2%), Shippensburg (2%), Kutztown (1%), and Edinboro (1%). The female professors declined at one university, Lock Haven (3%). *Table 2, Appendix A Table 1* for each university, and *Appendix B Figure 2* for each university should be examined carefully to determine the variability of numbers and percentages of full-time State System faculty at the professor rank by sex from 1974-75 through 1994-95.

3. *Number, Percentage, and Distribution of Full-time Associate Professors by Institution and Sex*

(Table 3, Figure 3, Appendix A Tables 1, and Appendix B Figures 3)

The number of State System full-time faculty at the second highest rank has decreased from 1,616 to 1,322, a decrease of 294 positions during the 21-year period (Table 3). The number of female associate professors increased from 309 in 1974-75 to 429 in 1994-95, an increase of 120 women. During the same period, the number of male associate professors declined from 1,307 to 893, a decrease of 414 males. The increase in the number of female associate professors and the decrease in the number of male associate professors has continued steadily since 1986-87 (Figure 3).

During the five-year period from 1990-91 to 1994-95, the number of full-time associate professors decreased from 1,380 to 1,322, a loss of 58 positions (Table 3). Female associate professors numbered 365 in 1990-91 and 429 in 1994-95, an increase of 64 women. During the same time period, the number of male associate professors declined from 1,015 to 893, a loss of 122 positions. Figure 3 shows that there has been a slow and consistent decline in the number of male associate professors since 1990-91 whereas the number of female associate professors has increased steadily.

PA State System of Higher Education 1983-94

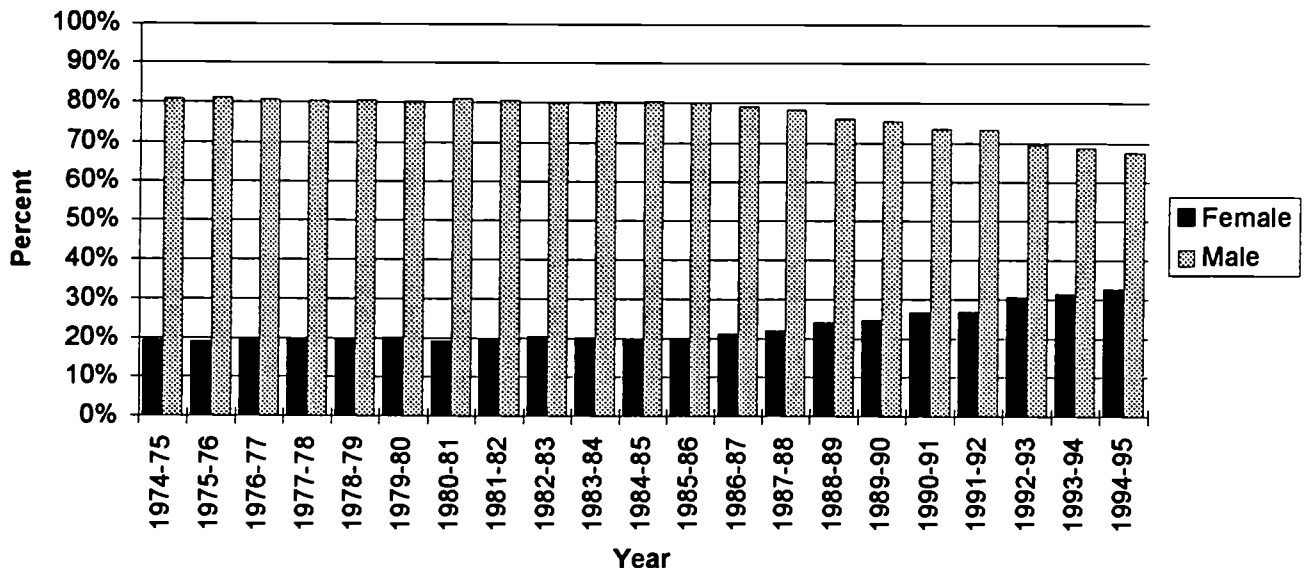

During the 21-year period, the percentage of female associate professors increased at all 14 universities: Slippery Rock (26%), Clarion (22%), Shippensburg (22%), Edinboro (16%), Mansfield (14%), Bloomsburg (13%), Indiana (13%), East Stroudsburg (11%), California (10%), Kutztown (10%), Millersville (10%), Lock Haven (9%), West Chester (7%), and Cheyney (3%). The overall percentage increase of female associate professors was 13 percent from 1974-75 (19%) to 1994-95 (32%), an average of 0.64 percent per year.

During the five-year period from 1990-91 to 1994-95, female associate professors increased at 13 campuses: Cheyney (15%), Slippery Rock (14%), California (9%), Indiana (9%), Clarion (8%), Lock Haven (8%), Mansfield (8%), Bloomsburg (6%), Edinboro (4%), West Chester (3%), Kutztown (2%), Millersville (2%), and Shippensburg (2%). The percentage of female associate professors decreased at one university, East Stroudsburg (3%). *Table 3, Appendix A Table 1* for each university, and *Appendix B Figure 3* for each university should be examined carefully to determine the variability of numbers and percentages of full-time State System faculty at the associate professor rank by sex for the 21-year period.

4. Number, Percentage, and Distribution of Full-time Assistant Professors by Institution and Sex

(Table 4, Figure 4, Appendix A Tables 1, and Appendix B Figures 4)

The number of State System full-time assistant professors has increased from 1,076 to 1,452, an increase of 376 positions since 1974-75 (Table 4). The number of female assistant professors increased from 329 to 692, an increase of 363 women during the 21-year period. During the same time period, the number of male assistant professors increased from 747 to 760, an increase of 13 males. The increase in the number of female assistant professors and the smaller increase of male assistant professors began in the mid-1980s, peaked in 1992-93 and declined slightly since then. The aggregate percentage increase of female assistant professors was 17 percent from 1974-75 (31%) to 1994-95 (48%), an average gain of 0.8 percent per year.

During the five-year period from 1990-91 to 1994-95, the number of female assistant professors increased from 630 to 692, a gain of 62 positions (Table 4). During the same time period, the number of male assistant professors increased from 716 to 760, an increase of 44 males. Figure 4 shows the pattern of increases for both females and males during the five-year period.

PA State System of Higher Education 1983-94

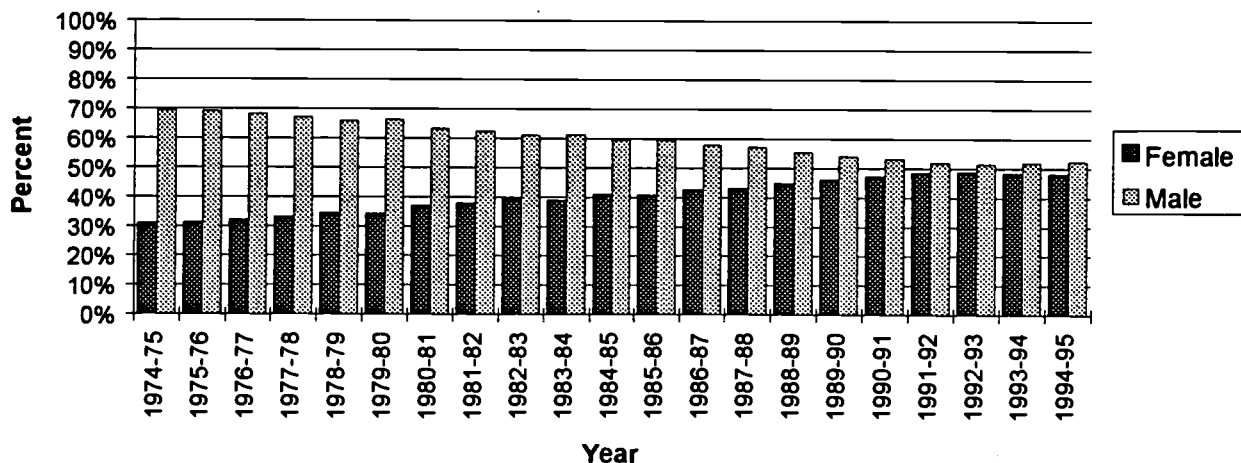

The percentage of female assistant professors increased at 13 universities and declined at one university from 1974-75 through 1994-95. There were sizable percentage increases of female assistant professors at five universities: Bloomsburg (24%), Edinboro (23%), Kutztown (22%), Millersville (22%), and Lock Haven (21%). Slightly smaller percentage increases of female assistant professors occurred at six universities: Slippery Rock (19%), Shippensburg (18%), West Chester (16%), Clarion (14%), Indiana (14%), and California (11%). Two campuses, Cheyney (9%) and East Stroudsburg (9%), had the smallest percentage increases of female assistant professors. Female assistant professors declined at one university, Mansfield (7%).

During the five-year period from 1990-91 to 1994-95, the percentage of female assistant professors increased at seven campuses: Millersville (12%), Bloomsburg (9%), California (4%), Edinboro (2%), Slippery Rock (2%), Shippensburg (1%), and West Chester (1%). The percentage of female assistant professors declined at six universities: Cheyney (29%), Mansfield (10%), Clarion (5%), Lock Haven (5%), East Stroudsburg (2%), and Indiana (1%). The percentage of female assistant professors remained about the same at Kutztown University. *Table 4, Appendix A Table 1* for each university and *Appendix B Figure 4* for each university should be examined carefully to determine the variability of numbers and percentages of full-time State System faculty at the assistant professor rank by sex from 1974-75 through 1994-95.

5. *Number, Percentage, and Distribution of Full-time Instructors by Institution and Sex*

(*Table 5, Figure 5, Appendix A Tables 1, and Appendix B Figures 5*)

The number of full-time instructors in the State System remained the same, 236, since 1974-75 (*Table 5*). The number of female instructors has increased from 122 to 158, an increase of 36 women during the 21-year period of time. During the same time period, male instructors numbered 114 in 1974-75 and 78 in 1994-95, a decrease of 36 males. *Figure 5* shows the fluctuations of the percentages of full-time State System instructors by sex from 1974-75 through 1994-95.

 PA State System of Higher Education 1983-94

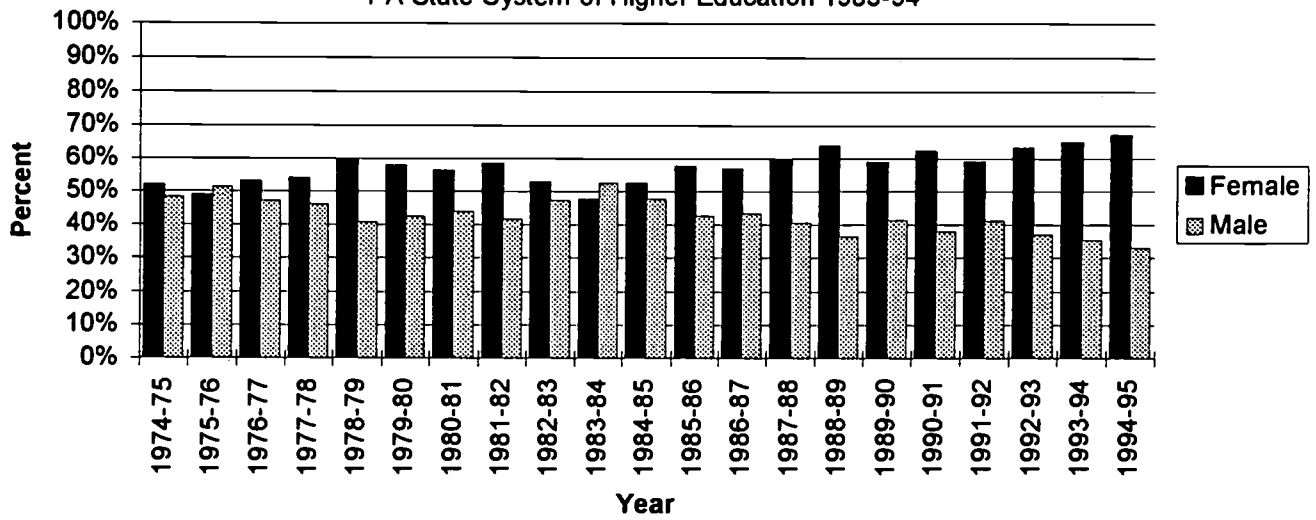

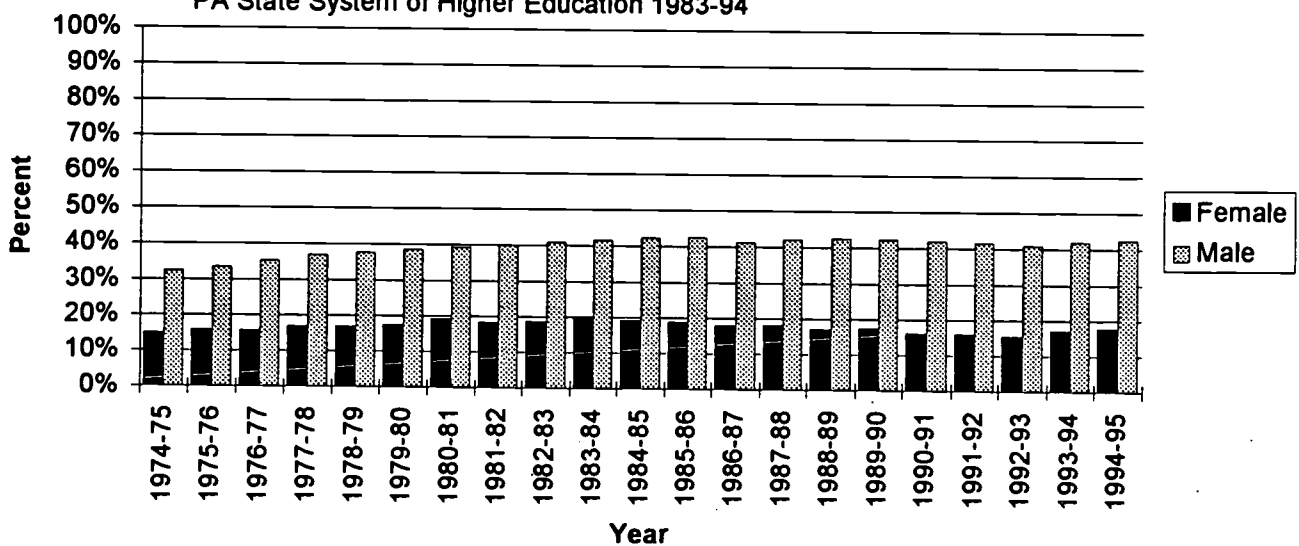

During the 21-year period, the percentage of female full-time total faculty at the professor rank increased from 1974-75 (14.61%) to 1994-95 (17.59%), an increase of 2.98 percentage points (Table 6). During the same period, the percentage of male full-time faculty at the professor level increased from 32.36% to 42.42%, an increase of 10.06 percentage points. The percentage of female full-time total faculty at the professor rank peaked in 1983-84 (19.81%), gradually declined again through 1992-93 to 15.23%, just slightly above its low in 1974-75 (14.61%), and then rose again to 17.59% in 1994-95. The percentage of male full-time total faculty at the professor rank was in the 32 - 39% range during the 1970s before leveling off through 1994-95 in the 41-42% range. Figure 6 depicts the fluctuations of the percentages of full-time total State System faculty at the professor rank by sex from 1974-75 through 1994-95.

During the five-year period from 1990-91 to 1994-95, the percentage of female total faculty at the professor rank increased from 15.95% to 17.59%, a gain of 1.64 percentage points (Table 6). Male full-time total faculty at the professor rank increased slightly from 1990-91 (41.88%) to 1994-95 (42.42%), an increase of 0.54 percentage points. Figure 6 depicts the fluctuations of the percentages of full-time total State System faculty at the professor rank by sex from 1974-75 through 1994-95.

The percentage of full-time female faculty at the professor rank was determined by dividing the number of full-time female professors by the total number of full-time female faculty. The same calculation was used for male faculty.

During the 21-year period, the percentages of full-time total female faculty at the professor rank increased at nine universities: East Stroudsburg (17%), Cheyney (18%), California (13%), Shippensburg (11%), Millersville (7%), Slippery Rock (5%), Indiana (4%), Clarion (3%) and Mansfield (2%). The percentages of total female faculty at the professor rank decreased at five universities: Lock Haven (8%), Kutztown (7%), West Chester (5%), Bloomsburg (2%), and Edinboro (2%). During the same time period, there were percentage increases for male full-time total faculty at the professor rank at 13 universities: Shippensburg (29%), Millersville (15%), Clarion (14%), East Stroudsburg (12%), Kutztown (12%), Indiana (11%), Slippery Rock (11%), Edinboro (10%), Mansfield (10%), Cheyney (7%), Lock Haven (6%), California (4%), and Bloomsburg (3%). There was a two percent decrease of male total faculty at the professor rank at West Chester (*Appendix A Tables 2*).

During the five-year period from 1990-91 to 1994-95, there were percentage increases for female full-time total faculty at the professor rank at seven universities: East Stroudsburg (10%), Clarion (6%), California (5%), Mansfield (5%), Cheyney (2%), Indiana (2%), and Millersville (2%). The female percentages stayed about the same at three universities (Bloomsburg, Kutztown, and Slippery Rock) and decreased at four universities: Lock Haven (6%), Shippensburg (2%), Edinboro (1%), and West Chester (1%). During the same time period there were percentage increases for male full-time total faculty at the professor rank at seven universities: California (6%), Millersville (6%), Clarion (4%), East Stroudsburg (4%), Indiana (3%), Kutztown (2%), and Bloomsburg (1%). There were decreases in male percentages at seven universities: Cheyney (10%), Shippensburg (5%), Mansfield (4%), Edinboro (3%), Lock Haven (3%), West Chester (3%), and Slippery Rock (1%). *Table 6, Appendix A Table 2* for each university and *Appendix B Figure 6* for each university should be examined carefully to determine the variability of the numbers and percentages of full-time State System total faculty at the professor rank by sex from 1974-75 through 1994-95.

7. Number, Percentages, and Distribution of Graduate Student FTE Enrollment by Institution and Sex

(Table 7, Figure 7, Appendix A Tables 4, and Appendix B Figures 7)

The number of graduate student FTE enrollment increased from 5,787 to 7,170, an increase of 1,383 graduate student FTE enrollment during the 21-year time period (Table 7). Female graduate student FTE enrollment totaled 3,275 in 1974-75 and 4,701 in 1994-95, an increase of 1,426 female graduate student FTE enrollment. During the same time period, the number of male graduate student FTE enrollment decreased from 2,513 to 2,469, a decrease of 44 male graduate student FTE enrollment.

During the five-year period from 1990-91 to 1994-95, the number of graduate student FTE enrollment increased from 7,015 to 7,170, an increase of 155 graduate student FTE enrollment. Female graduate student FTE enrollment numbered 4,609 in 1990-91 and 4,701 in 1994-95, an increase of 92 female graduate student FTE enrollment, and male graduate student FTE enrollment grew from 2,406 to 2,469, an increase of 63 male graduate student FTE enrollment in the same time period. Figure 7 shows the pattern of graduate student FTE enrollment by sex for the State System from 1974-75 through 1994-95.

PA State System of Higher Education 1983-94

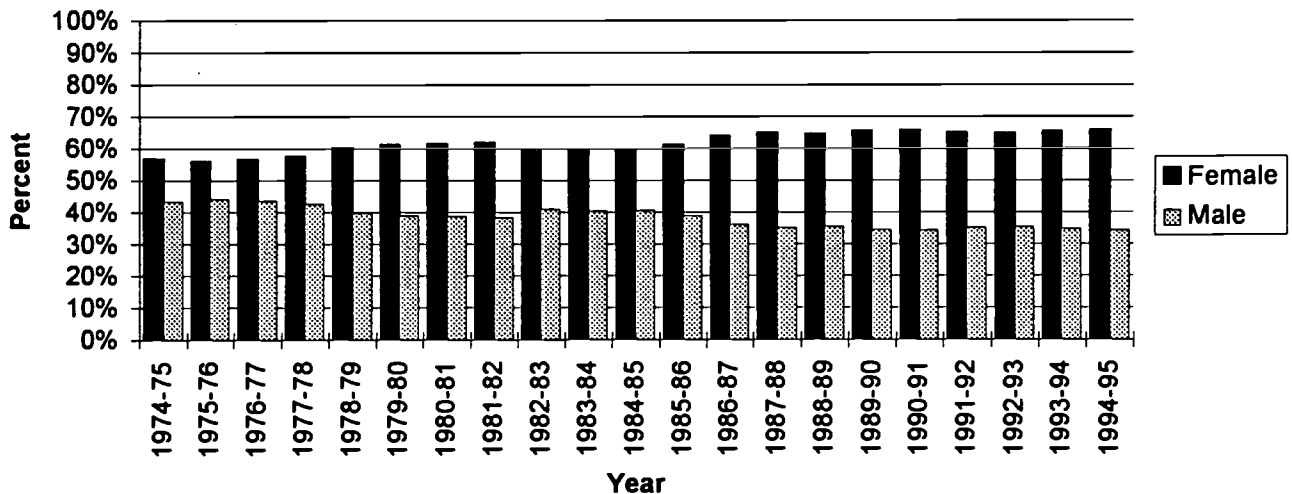

The majority of graduate student FTE enrollment were women at 12 State System universities in 1974-75; one university (Cheyney) had a majority of male graduate student FTE enrollment. Lock Haven did not offer graduate courses. In 1994-95, all 13 universities had a majority of female graduate student FTE enrollment. Female graduate student FTE enrollment increased at each of the 13 campuses: Cheyney (20%), Edinboro (16%), Millersville (15%), Kutztown (12%), West Chester (12%), East Stroudsburg (11%), Clarion (10%), Mansfield (11%), Bloomsburg (6%), Indiana (6%), Slippery Rock (6%), Shippensburg (5%), and California (4%).

During the five-year period from 1990-91 to 1994-95, the percentage of female graduate student FTE enrollment increased at six universities: California (4%), Slippery Rock (4%), Kutztown (3%), Mansfield (3%), West Chester (2%), and Edinboro (1%). The percentage of female graduate student FTE enrollment stayed about the same at one university (Indiana), and decreased at six universities: Bloomsburg (5%), Cheyney (4%), Clarion (4%), East Stroudsburg (3%), Millersville (2%), and Shippensburg (2%). *Table 7, Appendix A Table 4* for each university, and *Appendix B Figure 7* for each university should be examined carefully to determine the variability of numbers and percentages of graduate student FTE enrollment by sex at individual universities and in the State System from 1974-75 through 1994-95.

8. *Number, Percentage, and Distribution of Undergraduate FTE Enrollment by Institution and Sex*

(Table 8, Figure 8, Appendix A Tables 4, and Appendix B Figures 8)

The number of undergraduate student FTE enrollment in the State System increased from 64,042 to 78,418, an increase of 14,376 undergraduate student FTE enrollment during the 21-year period (Table 8). Female undergraduate student FTE enrollment totaled 35,491 in 1974-75 and 44,532 in 1994-95, an increase of 9,041 female undergraduate student FTE enrollment. During the same time period, male undergraduate FTE enrollment increased from 28,551 to 33,886, an increase of 5,335 male undergraduate student FTE enrollment since 1974-75.

During the five-year period from 1990-91 to 1994-95, the number of undergraduate student FTE enrollment decreased from 81,552 to 78,418, a decrease of 3,134 undergraduate FTE enrollment. Female undergraduate FTE enrollment numbered 46,812 in 1990-91 and 44,532 in 1994-95, a decrease of 2,280 female undergraduate student FTE enrollment. Male undergraduate FTE enrollment also decreased in the same five-year period from 34,740 to 33,886, a decrease of 854 male undergraduate student FTE enrollment. Figure 8 shows the pattern of undergraduate student FTE enrollment by sex for the State System from 1974-75 through 1994-95.

 PA State System of Higher Education 1983-94

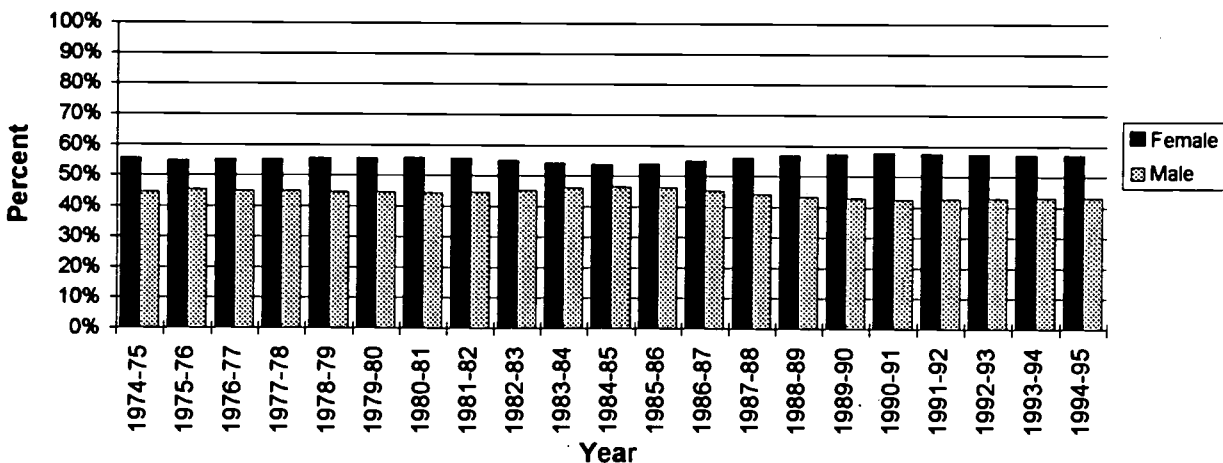

In 1974-75, the majority of undergraduate student FTE enrollment were women at 11 campuses whereas three campuses (California, Cheyney, and Clarion) had a majority of male undergraduate student FTE enrollment. In 1994-95, 12 campuses has a majority of female undergraduate student FTE enrollment and two campuses (California and Cheyney) had a few more female undergraduate FTE than male undergraduate FTE. From 1974-75 through 1994-95, the percentage of female undergraduate FTE enrollment increased at seven universities: Clarion (13%), Bloomsburg (4%), California (3%), Cheyney (3%), Millersville (3%), Edinboro (2%), and Shippensburg (2%). The percentage of female undergraduate FTE enrollment remained about the same at Mansfield and declined at six universities: Slippery Rock (3%), Indiana (3%), East Stroudsburg (2%), Kutztown (1%), Lock Haven (1%), and West Chester (1%).

During the five-year period from 1990-91 to 1994-95, the percentage of female undergraduate student FTE enrollment increased at two universities, Clarion (2%) and Cheyney (1%). The percentage of female undergraduate FTE enrollment remained about the same at five universities (Bloomsburg, East Stroudsburg, Edinboro, Lock Haven, and Slippery Rock), and declined at seven universities (Kutztown 3%; California 2%; Mansfield 2%; Millersville 2%; Shippensburg 2%; Indiana 1%; and West Chester 1%). *Table 8, Appendix A Table 4* for each university, and *Appendix B Figure 8* for each university should be examined carefully to ascertain the variability of the numbers and percentages of undergraduate student FTE enrollment at individual universities and in the State System from 1974-75 through 1994-95.

9. *Ratio of Undergraduate Student FTE Enrollment to Full-time Total Faculty by Sex*

(Table 9, Figure 9, Appendix A Tables 3, and Appendix B Figures 9)

In 1974-75, the ratios of State System female undergraduate student FTE enrollment to female full-time total faculty averaged 39.88 with a range at individual universities from 20.18 to 60.61 (*Table 9, Appendix A Tables 3*). In 1994-95, the female ratio average was 28.69 with a range at individual campuses from 13.05 to 34.88, an average decrease of 11.19 during the 21-year period. Conversely, in 1974-75, the ratio of male undergraduate student FTE enrollment to male full-time faculty averaged 8.91 with a range from 7.23 to 12.21. In 1994-95, the male ratios averaged 11.27 with a range at individual universities from 8.76 to 12.56, an average ratio increase of 2.36 since 1974-75. Overall, the relationship between the average same-sex ratio of female undergraduate student FTE to faculty with that of male undergraduate student FTE to faculty was approximately 4.5 times greater in 1974-75 (39.88 to 8.91) and about 2.5 times greater in 1994-95 (28.69 to 11.27). *Figure 9* shows the average State System ratios of undergraduate student FTE enrollment to full-time total faculty by sex from 1974-75 through 1994-95.

During the five-year period from 1990-91 to 1994-95, the average ratios of State System female undergraduate student FTE enrollment to female full-time total faculty decreased from 33.34 to 28.69 (*Table 9*). During the same period, the average ratio of male undergraduate student FTE enrollment to male full-time total faculty increased from 10.95 to 11.27. Overall, the relationship between the average same-sex ratio of female undergraduate FTE to faculty with that of male undergraduate student FTE to faculty was approximately 3.0 times greater in 1990-91 (33.34 to 10.95) and about 2.5 times greater in 1994-95 (28.69 to 11.27).

During the 21-year period, the average of the female ratios decreased at each of the 14 State System universities: Bloomsburg (60.52 to 33.39), Slippery Rock (48.24 to 24.79), Edinboro (52.93 to 30.08), Indiana (44.79 to 27.86), Clarion (43.41 to 30.20), Millersville (42.21 to 34.56), Kutztown (40.95 to 24.35), Shippensburg (39.39 to 34.88), California (37.26 to 30.23), Lock Haven (37.13 to 26.06), East Stroudsburg (34.53 to 31.28), West Chester (31.19 to 28.88), Mansfield (27.23 to 26.93), and Cheyney (20.18 to 13.05).

The same sex ratio of male undergraduate FTE enrollment to faculty for the same time period, 1974-75 through 1994-95, increased at 12 universities: East Stroudsburg (9.86 to 12.56), Millersville (9.80 to 11.91), Slippery Rock (9.77 to 11.95), Indiana (9.53 to 11.98), Bloomsburg (9.10 to 10.44), Shippensburg (8.70 to 11.53), Kutztown (8.62 to 11.07), Lock Haven (8.18 to 12.22), Mansfield (7.76 to 9.50), Edinboro (7.71 to 11.33), California (7.63 to 10.75), and West Chester (7.23 to 11.09). Male ratios decreased at two campuses: Cheyney (12.21 to 8.76) and Clarion (11.86 to 10.14).

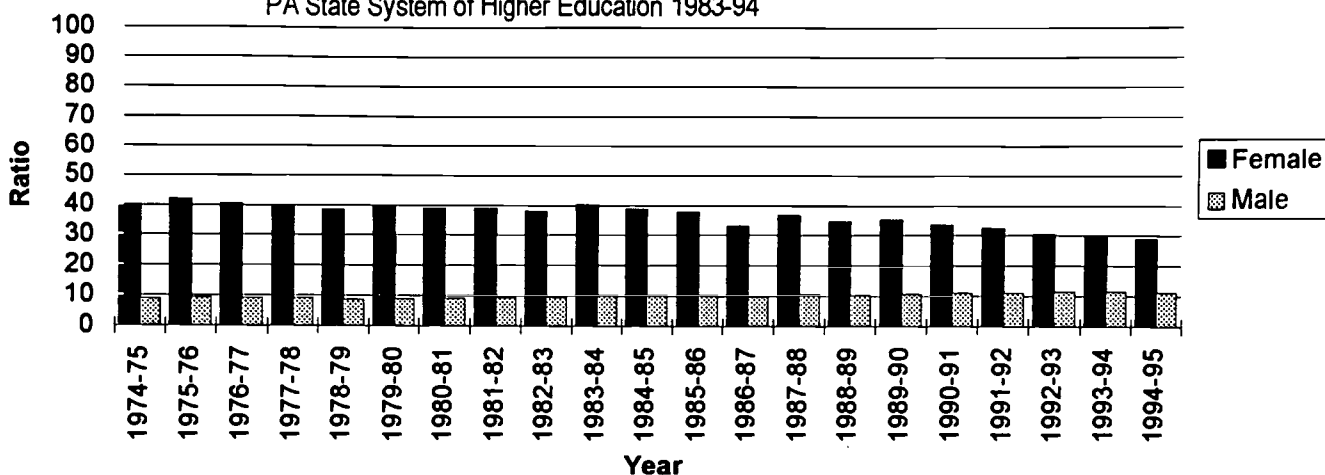

The female ratio of undergraduate female FTE to one full-time female faculty was determined by dividing the number of undergraduate female FTE by the number of full-time female faculty. The same calculation was used to determine the male ratio.

During the five-year period from 1990-91 to 1994-95, the average of the female ratios decreased at 12 universities: Cheyney (31.23 to 13.05), Bloomsburg (42.55 to 33.39), Indiana (35.32 to 27.86), West Chester (35.05 to 28.88), Slippery Rock (30.92 to 24.79), Shippensburg (40.89 to 34.88), Mansfield (32.10 to 26.93), Kutztown (29.13 to 24.35), Millersville (39.29 to 34.56), California (34.03 to 30.23), Edinboro (32.42 to 30.08), and Lock Haven (28.35 to 26.06). The female ratios increased at two campuses: East Stroudsburg (26.03 to 31.28) and Clarion (28.10 to 30.20).

Male ratios during the same time period, 1990-91 to 1994-95, increased at nine campuses: Millersville (10.22 to 11.91), East Stroudsburg (11.32 to 12.56), Shippensburg (10.58 to 11.53), Lock Haven (11.48 to 12.22), Kutztown (10.42 to 11.07), Mansfield (8.90 to 9.50), Bloomsburg (9.99 to 10.44), Edinboro (10.99 to 11.33), and Indiana (11.71 to 11.98). The male ratios remained about the same at three campuses (California, Slippery Rock, and West Chester) and declined at two campuses: Cheyney (17.59 to 8.76) and Clarion (10.53 to 10.14). *Table 9, Appendix A Table 3* for each campus, and *Appendix B Figure 9* for each campus should be examined carefully to determine the variability of the ratios of undergraduate student FTE enrollment to full-time total faculty by sex from 1974-75 through 1994-95.

V. DISCUSSION

The findings of this study show that full-time female faculty continue to be a minority within the State System. While the percentage of full-time female faculty has increased since 1974-75 (22%), most noticeably since 1986-87, they still are a distinct minority in 1994-95 (34%), concentrated in the lower professorial ranks (*Tables 1-5, Figures 1-5*). State System (PA) female faculty has increased at the full professor rank from 11% in 1974-75 to 18% in 1994-95 (*Table 2, Figure 2*); associate professor rank from 19% in 1974-75 to 32% in 1994-95 (*Table 3, Figure 3*); assistant professor level from 31% in 1974-75 to 48% in 1994-95 (*Table 4, Figure 4*), and instructor rank from 52% in 1974-75 to 67% in 1994-95 (*Table 5, Figure 5*). The increases average less than one per cent over the 21-year time period even though the number of women earning Ph.D.s has increased dramatically during the same time period (*Table 12, Figure 16*). This pattern confirms what other studies such as the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching's 1989 National Survey of Faculty (1990) and selected data from AAUP's Annual Report on the Economic Status of the Profession 1989-90 (1990, *Table 10*) and 1994-95 (1995, *Table 10*) have found about Category II-A and II-B state colleges/universities which are similar to those in the State System (PA).

Further analysis of Table 10 shows that during the five-year period from 1989-90 to 1994-95, the percentage of women increased for the five national samples of Category II-A and II-B public universities for total faculty (range 3.11 to 5.55 percentage points) and the professor (range 2.62 to 4.09 percentage points), associate professor (4.26 to 8.04 percentage points), and assistant professor (range 1.83 to 6.36 percentage points) ranks. The percentage of women at the instructor rank during the same time period increased in three national samples (New York, Pennsylvania, and National Total) and decreased in two national samples (California and New Jersey). In 1994-95, the State System (PA) fell below the national percentage average for women at the professor rank (0.63 percentage points) but exceeded the national percentage averages for women for total faculty (1.17 percentage points) and the associate (0.53 percentage points), assistant (2.13 percentage points) and instructor (6.83 percentage points) ranks.

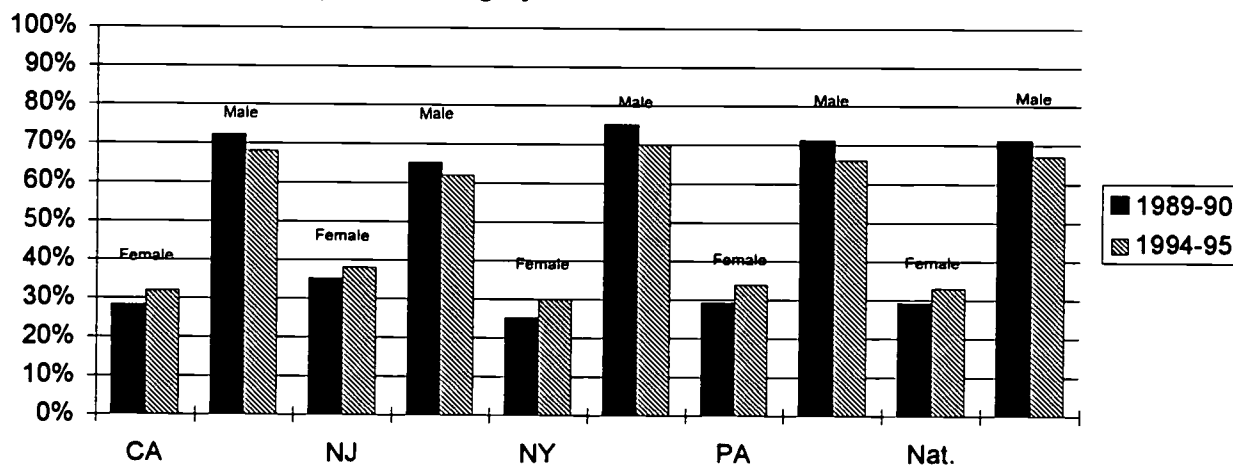


Figure 11 - Full-time Professor by Sex 1989-90 and 1994-95

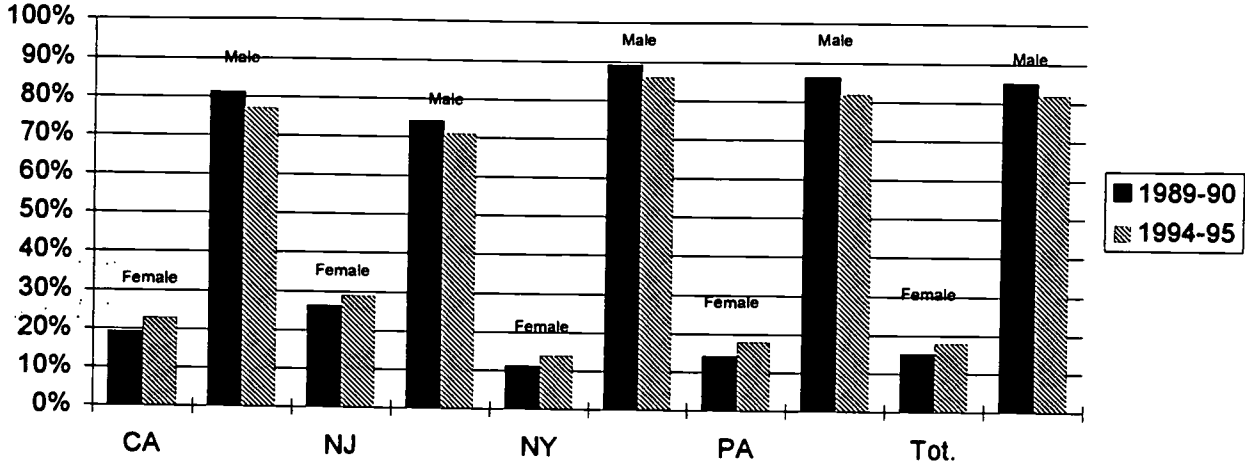


Figure 12 - Full-time Associate Professor by Sex 1989-90 and 1994-95

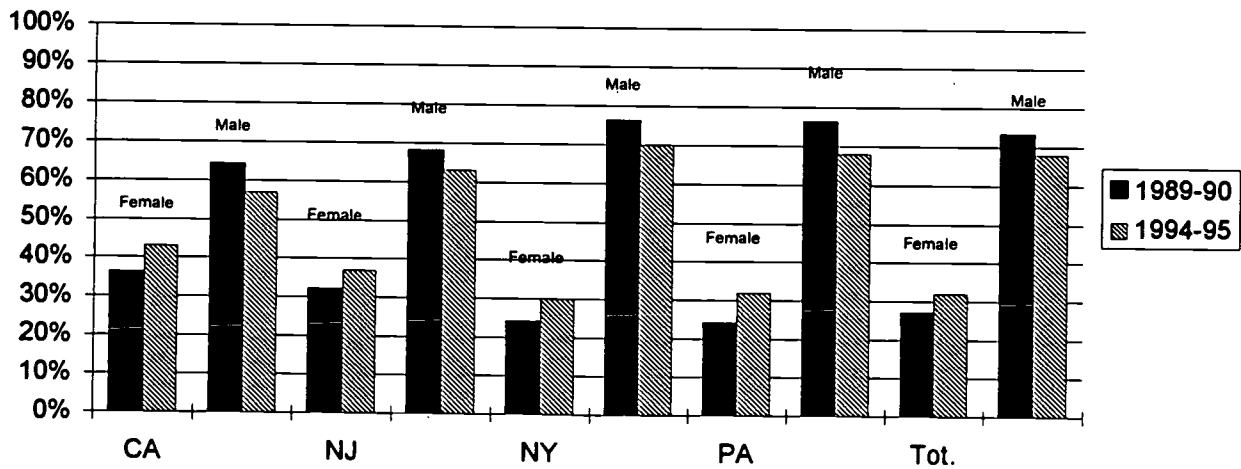


Figure 13 - Full-time Assistant Professor by Sex 1989-90 and 1994-95

Comparisons among the national samples in 1994-95 show a significantly higher percentage of total female faculty at the professor rank in the California and New Jersey State Systems than in the Pennsylvania State System (Table 11, Figure 15). These two State Systems also have a significantly higher percentage of female faculty at the professor (Table 10, Figure 11) and associate professor (Table 10, Figure 12) levels than the State System (PA). The percentage increase of State System female faculty at the professor rank (0.68% yearly average) and at the associate professor level (1.60% yearly average) from 1989-90 to 1994-95 are small. These data suggest that the percentage of female faculty at the higher professorial ranks will not approach parity until well into the next century. Each national sample's percentage of female faculty increased at the assistant professor rank during the five-year period; however, the smallest increase (1.83%) occurred in the (PA) State System (Table 10, Figure 13). The State System (PA) has not hired or advanced female faculty to the higher professional ranks as successfully as the California and New Jersey State Systems have. As Conway observed, "The mere fact of entry does not create opportunity" (in Bloch, 1992, p.6)

National Samples of Category II-A and II-B Public Universities

National Samples of Category II-A and II-B Public Universities

National Samples of Category II-A and II-B Public Universities

National Samples of Category II-A and II-B Public Universities

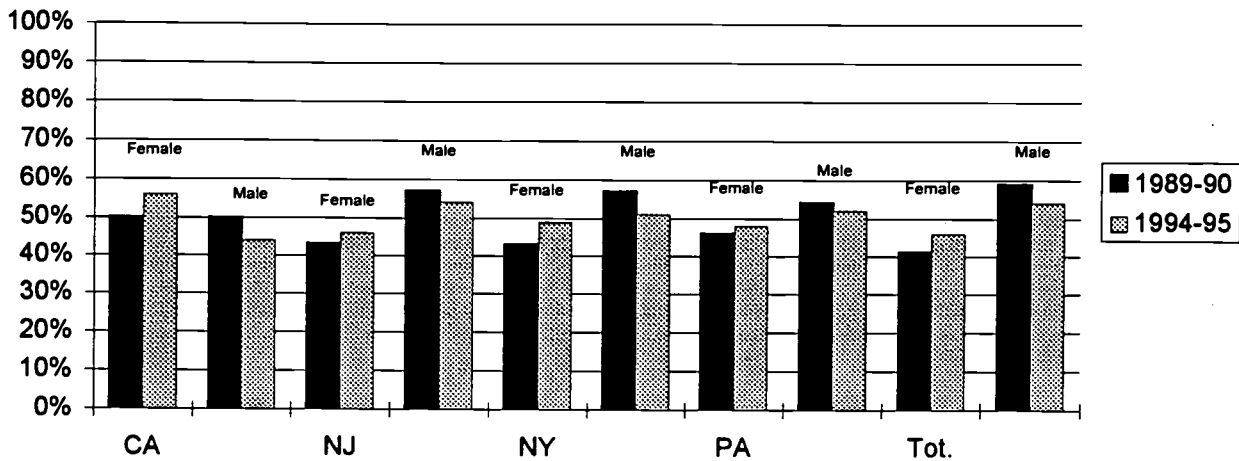
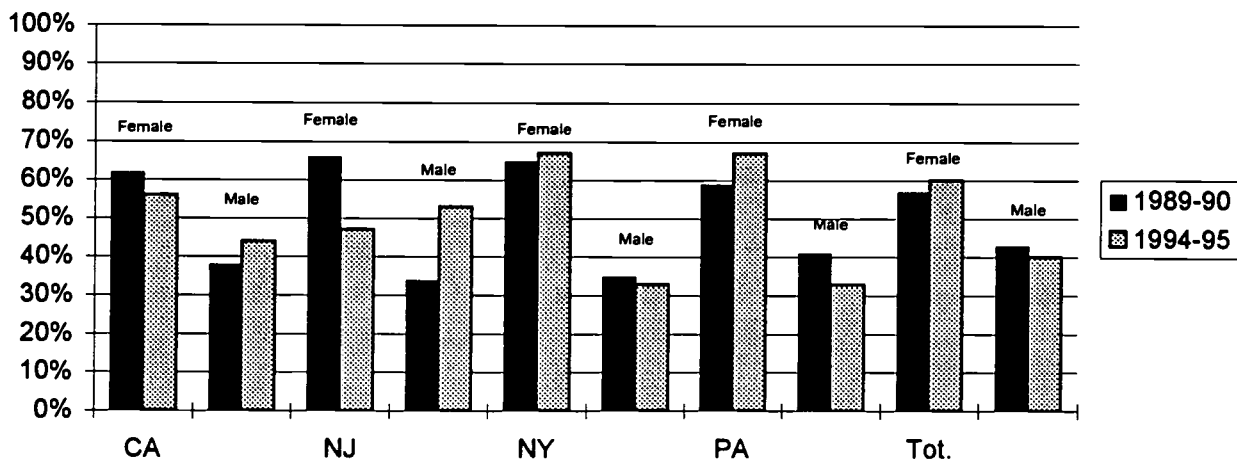
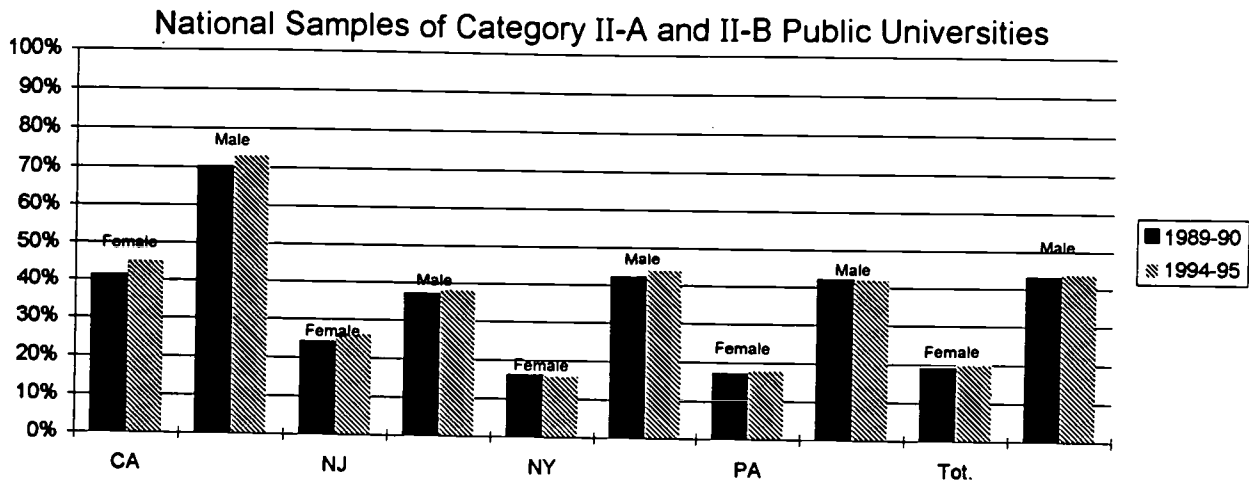


Figure 14 - Full-time Instructor by Sex 1989-90 and 1994-95

There are a number of possible reasons for the underrepresentation of female faculty in the higher academic ranks (e.g., Sandler, 1992; Tierney & Rhoads, 1994); however, little evidence has been found in this study to explain why this phenomenon has occurred:

- 1) female faculty have been hired in the State System (PA) at the lower ranks (*Tables 2-4, Figures 2-4*), and/or
- 2) promotion policies and procedures within the State System (PA) may discriminate against female faculty (e.g., *Curry v. Slippery Rock State College, Watrel, President, 1972; Howard v. Slippery Rock State College, Watrel, President, 1972; Schmidt v. Slippery Rock State College, Watrel President, 1972; Keef, Petkofsky, Chern and Crawford v. West Chester University and the Association of Pennsylvania State College and University Faculties, 1984*).

There apparently have been no studies to determine why women are underrepresented in the higher professorial ranks in the State System (PA). The Institute for Women has worked with the Chancellor's Office for several years to

establish a data base to gather information about initial appointment, retention and promotion which could be used to determine the extent of, or lack of, gender differential among these variables. A pilot study involving two campuses was discussed; however, the study, which would have provided data about these variables, never materialized.

A recent doctoral dissertation (Fulmer, 1995), theoretical in nature, suggests another factor, organizational culture, may be instrumental in the existence of "glass ceilings" (metaphor for transparent level beyond which white men may progress but where others, in this case women, have difficulty advancing) within 13 of the 14 State System universities (Cheyney was excluded from the study because of its uniqueness). The researcher theorizes that the State System has three distinctive types of "glass ceilings" for female faculty members: low and impervious (traditional); medium and semi-porous (transitional); and high and porous (renaissance). Each type is composed of three to five universities. Fulmer used historical information, questionnaires, interviews, and observations to code, classify, and compare the culture of each university. Then, the researcher examined all 13 universities by administering questionnaires to faculty leadership, observing, and analyzing each university's written policies and procedures. Based on these findings, Fulmer concluded that distinct types of organizational cultures are related to distinctive "glass ceiling" heights and porosity and recommended changes within each type to eliminate the "ceilings."

Moreover, the low number and status of State System academic women also affect the campus environment. Women continue to comprise a significant majority of undergraduate FTE enrollment throughout the 21-year period examined in the study. When these two phenomena—low number and status of full-time female faculty and a large number of female undergraduates—are compared, one finds the ratios of undergraduate student FTE enrollment to full-time faculty by gender (*Table 9, Figure 9*) indicates a disproportionately smaller number of same-sex role models for female students (39.88 in 1974-75 and 28.69 in 1994-95) than for male students (8.91 in 1974-75 and 11.77 in 1994-95). These factors contribute to a campus climate which has been characterized in studies by the American Council on Education's Project on the Status and Education of Women (e.g., Hall & Sandler, 1982; Sandler and Hall, 1986) and other researchers (e.g., Toth, 1988; Thorne, 1989) as a "chilly" one for female students and female faculty. The findings of Tidball's research (1989) about women's colleges, for example, suggest that the professional development and career aspirations of female students and female faculty may be adversely affected by the absence of or limited number of same-sex role models. Tidball further concluded: "*Clearly, there cannot be an appropriate environment for women students in the absence of an appropriate environment for women faculty, administrators, trustees, guests, and alumnae*" (p. 169).

Related to the increased presence of female students in higher education, the "new majority," is the increased awareness of their needs. A growing body of research supports the notion that women and men experience and react to the world differently (e.g., Gilligan, 1982; Harris, Silverstein & Andrews, 1989; Stage & Maple, 1996). Thus, concerns about such matters as the inclusion of women in the curriculum, the teaching/learning process, the relationship of faculty to students, a gender-balanced faculty and workplace, and the campus environment become important for all students, women and men alike, if they are to live and work in a pluralistic society.

Why has this disparity between female and male faculty persisted for 21 years? Did State System policies and practices contribute to the continued gender imbalance of the faculty? Were hiring, tenure and promotion policies and procedures at individual campuses related to the disproportionate number of women at the lower professorial ranks? Were the ratios of students to faculty by sex considered when educational programs and policies were planned and acted upon by the State System and the 14 Universities? The paucity of data and information about this 21-year time period prevents the author from answering these and other questions about policies and procedures of the State System and individual universities relating to the continued imbalance of female to male faculty. However, we can examine with some certainty factors relating to the availability of a pool of female candidates with doctorates and the commitment of the State System to improving the number and professorial rank of female faculty.

Part of the explanation may be related to the disproportionate number of men who were hired in the 1950s and 1960s, even in fields which historically had a sizable pool of female doctorates (Biology, Education, English, Foreign Languages, and Psychology). It was legal in that era to advertise for male applicants. Nor were there a significant number of female administrators at that time (See Pennsylvania State College and University Bulletins/Catalogs). Deans of Women were usually the only female administrators in this period. This noticeable lack of women in academic leadership positions may have contributed to the continued pattern of male self-perpetuation throughout the 1950s and 1960s. During the 1970s and early 1980s, the job market for faculty dried up but beginning in the mid-1980s and continuing into the early 1990s, more vacancies occurred in higher education as the faculty hired in the 1950s and 1960s retired (Magner, 1996). Now, economic restraints have contributed to a tight academic job market again. A substantial increase in female doctorates occurred concurrently during this time period (*Table 12*).

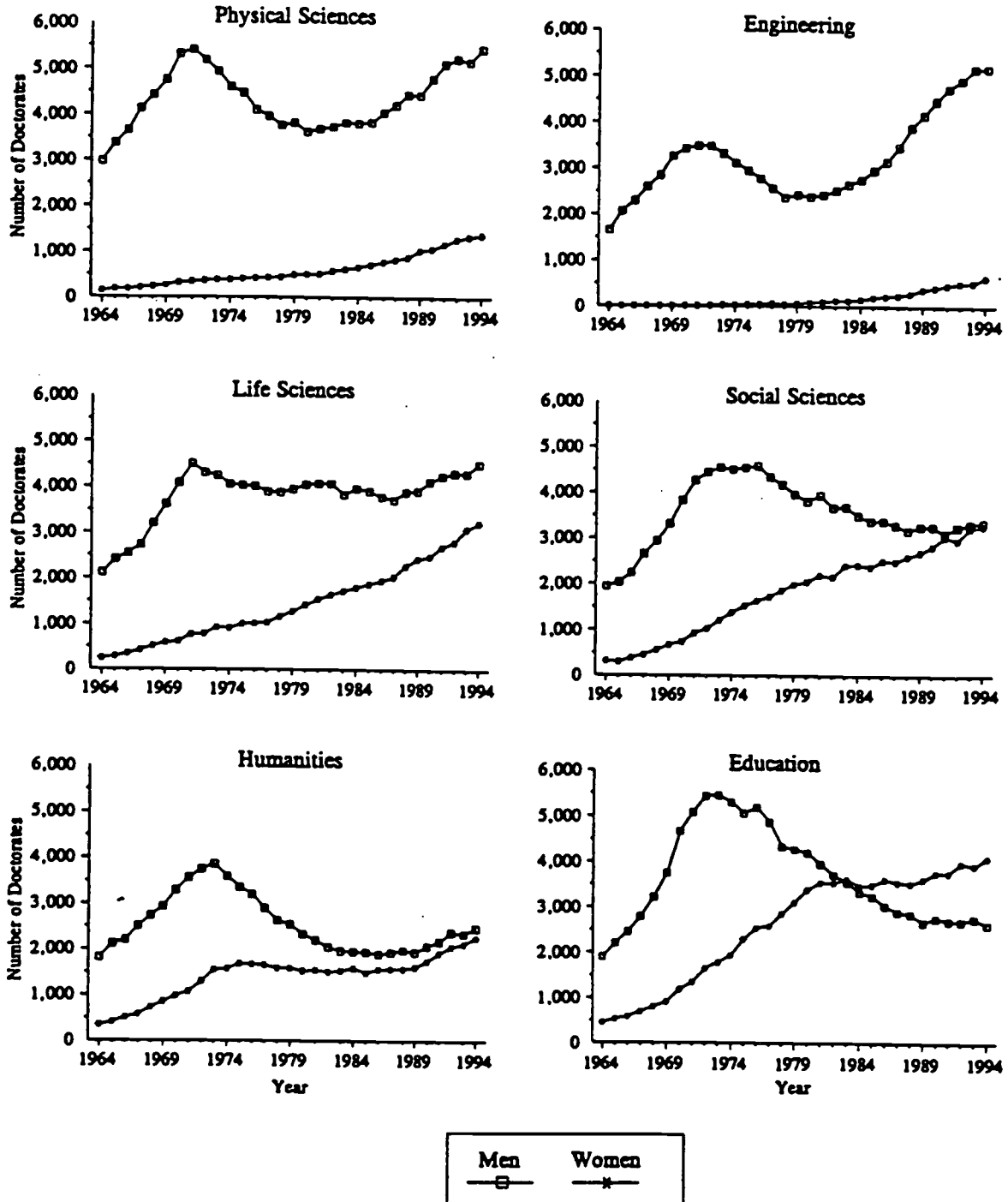

With the advent of the second women's movement in the United States in the 1960s, an increasing number of women have completed doctoral studies in traditional female fields as well as in traditional male fields of study (*Table 12, Figure 16*); however, disparities persist between the sexes within specific areas. Simmons & Thurgood (1995) found the following trends when they prepared the summary of 1994 doctorate recipients:

- *Women once again earned a record number of Ph.D.s (15,806 in 1994), while men fell short of their record number of doctorates in 1972 (25,205 in 1994 compared to 27,754 in 1972).*
- *While the number of male Ph.D.s in 1994 roughly doubled from 12,764 in 1964, the number of female Ph.D.s in 1994 increased more than ten-fold from 1,561 in 1964. Women's representation jumped from 11 percent in 1964 to an all-time high of 39 percent in 1994 (p. 3).*

Simmons & Thurgood (1995) found as well:

- *In 1994, doctoral awards to men surpassed those to women in all but one broad field -- education. Women predominated in the field of education with 61 percent of all doctorates and were near parity in social sciences and humanities. However, women remained substantially outnumbered in the fields of life sciences (42 percent of Ph.D.s), physical sciences (20 percent), and engineering (11 percent).*
- *Although women Ph.D.s increased in every broad field over the last 30 years, men experienced major declines after the early 1970's in social sciences, humanities, and education. While men's numbers in social sciences have stabilized in recent years, and their numbers in humanities have slowly risen, their decline in the field of education has continued. The number of education doctorates awarded to men in 1994 was less than half the number in 1974 (p. 8).*

Thus, there have been significant increases in the percentage of female doctorates since 1964. Their percentages have exceeded the percentages of male doctorates in Education and are approaching the percentages of male doctorates in all broad fields except Physical Sciences and Engineering. However, this fact is not reflected in the proportion of total female faculty (*Table 1, Figure 1*) or in the faculty

complements of State System Universities. (*Appendix A Tables 1; Appendix B Figures 1*). As Astin and Malik noted:

... *the trends* [increased enrollment of women in graduate schools and earned doctorates] *appear to suggest that educational equality may be achieved sooner than equality in academic employment with respect to position and rewards.* (1993. p.186)

The State System's earlier inactivity in the area of affirmative action for women may also be related to its failure to formally recognize women in its affirmative action plans until the Board of Governors approved *the Affirmative Action and Equal Opportunity Plan: A Prospectus (Prospectus)* on April 19, 1988. The *Prospectus* (1988) specifically included women among the groups for which each University was to develop an affirmative action plan. The 14 plans were then to comprise the State System's five-year Affirmative Action Plan from 1988-89 through 1992-93. No historical data or other explanation was given for the addition of women to the other equity groups mentioned in the *Prospectus* (1988). However, in retrospect, this document can be viewed as the foundation for three later documents (*Priorities*, 1990; *Values*, 1991; and *Equity Plan*, 1994) which have further reinforced the State System's commitment to gender equity for the remainder of the decade.

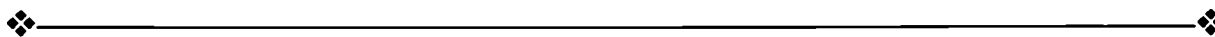
Additionally, APSCUF's establishment of the Gender Issues Standing Committee in 1992 ensures that there is a mechanism for all faculty to address concerns related to contractual equity issues. The Committee members, both female and male, are representative of each campus; the Committee reports regularly to the Delegate Assembly. This past year, for example, the Committee recommended items for the Union's Negotiating Team to consider when meeting with the State System's bargaining group.

In summary, then, although parity has not been achieved and academic women continue to be underrepresented on faculties and in the higher professorial ranks, there is no doubt that the status of female faculty has improved in the past 21 years. The percentage of full-time female faculty has increased from 22% in 1974-75 to 34% in 1994-95 (*Table 1*). During this same time period the pool of women Ph.D. recipients has more than doubled (*Table 12*). Furthermore, women's participation in all fields has increased, approaching parity in the Humanities, Life Sciences and Social Sciences and exceeding parity in Education (*Table 12, Figure 16*). State System (PA) hiring practices have not reflected the availability of an ever increasing number of female doctorate recipients. Additionally, the percentage of State System (PA) female faculty at the professor rank (11% in 1974-75 and 18% in 1994-95) and associate professor level (19% in 1974-75 and 32% in 1994-95) indicates that professional advancement within ranks is difficult for female faculty (*Tables 2 and 3*).

The establishment of such groups as the Commissions on the Status of Women, Gender Issues Committees, and Women's Centers on most campuses; the proliferation of Women's Studies Programs throughout the State System; and the increased representation of women on APSCUF state-wide committees are evidence of the progress that has been made. This author agrees with Astin & Malik (1994) that the future is problematic.

Currently, demographic and economic trends are producing a mixed message about the future of academic women. On the one hand, the growing number of faculty reaching retirement age should increase the number of positions available. On the other hand, economic difficulties and budgetary constraints faced by many institutions of higher education may portend a decline in academic employment. The heightened competition for these positions which do become available will provide an opportunity to test the strength and depth of the commitment to gender equality in higher education. (p. 193)

It is hoped that the present commitment of APSCUF and the State System will not weaken and the State System is among the vanguard of public universities which achieve gender parity within its faculties and academic divisions.



VI. A CALL FOR ACTION

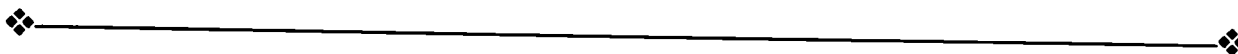
- 1) Efforts to improve the status of female faculty should be communicated throughout the State System so that the entire System is aware and knowledgeable about what has been done, what is being done, and what needs to be done to ensure a gender-balanced faculty in all divisions, departments, and professorial ranks at each of the 14 Universities. Informed constituencies are a prerequisite for equity to become a reality in the State System.
- 2) The *Equity Plan's* (1994) assessment is comprehensive and has the potential to identify factors, both perceived and real, related to equity issues within the State System. However, the *Equity Plan* (1994) will achieve its goals only if faculty and staff are informed about and involved in the process and outcomes. For example, most faculty are unaware of the information contained in the annual reports which were to be submitted by individual campuses by February 1, 1995 (beginning date) and each subsequent year. Was an Equity Symposium held in 1996 as scheduled and its work disseminated within the State System? Nor is the faculty knowledgeable about the comparative analyses the Office of the Chancellor may have completed on data collected to date. How, then, can the assessment plan be monitored, common concerns identified, and lessons learned shared as noted in the *Equity Plan* (1994, p.35)?
- 3) A critical component of the assessment plan as it relates to female faculty are the ACE Commission on Women in Higher Education Guidelines (listed in Appendix C) because they are the standards against which university policy and procedures should be developed (*Equity Plan*, 1994, p. 47). However, most faculty, both female and male, are unfamiliar with these Guidelines. The State System should develop an awareness of these Guidelines and how they are being met at individual campuses and throughout the State System.
- 4) The State System should strengthen its efforts to develop a consensus within the academic community about the rapidly increasing knowledge about gender differences and the importance of same-sex and cross-sex mentors and role models for female and male students and faculty. For example, programs which develop faculty and administrators' awareness of equity issues and identify and destroy stereotypical assumptions about female and male ways of viewing the world should be continued and expanded.
- 5) The State System's equity planning should utilize the survey of earned doctorates (Simmons & Thurgood, 1995) which is conducted annually for the National Science Foundation, U.S. Department of Education, National Institutes of Health, National Endowment for the Humanities, and U.S. Department of Agriculture. The annual reports identify the availability of women in specific fields and document the increasing number of female doctorate recipients as well as gender differences which may exist in fields and subfields.

- 6) Individual campuses within the State System should increase their efforts to hire female faculty at the professor and associate professor ranks. Unless this effort is made, female faculty will continue to be disproportionately distributed in the lower professorial ranks well into the 21st century.
- 7) The State System and individual campuses should contact the California and New Jersey State Systems to find out why there is a higher percentage of female faculty at the professor and associate professor ranks in their respective Systems. This information would help the State System (PA) to establish targets and determine what it could do to be as successful in hiring and furthering the professional advancement of female faculty and establish realistic targets which achieve this.
- 8) The State System and APSCUF should also review the committees which are formed to ensure that female faculty are equitably represented as members and in leadership roles.
- 9) Subsequent studies should use data collected at each of the 14 campuses to accomplish the following:
 - a) Identify the factors that have contributed to the disproportionate distribution of female faculty in the lower ranks,
 - b) determine whether hiring procedures and policies are proper,
 - c) verify that affirmative action procedures and policies are being followed,
 - d) ascertain the extent to which departmental complements are gender-balanced in each rank,
 - e) examine the degree to which departments are involved in affirmative action programs,
 - f) investigate the retention rate of faculty to determine if there are gender differences,
 - g) learn the degree to which female faculty have a voice in the governance structures at their respective universities and in the State System and APSCUF, and
 - h) conduct follow-up studies to this study every five years to ensure that "progress" is really being made in the hiring and promotion of female faculty.

The original study (Keetz, 1991) and its extension (Keetz, 1997) exemplify the importance of longitudinal studies and wide dissemination of information and findings. They inform the State System and its 14 campuses about the history of gender inequality within the System and the progress that has been made to date in improving the status of women. It is hoped that the Chancellor's Office will support the follow-up studies that are necessary to determine if there are significant differences among female and male faculty as to rank and step hired, retention, and promotion. As Conway (in Bloch, 1992, p. 6) has noted, "*It is the terms on which women enter occupations that govern their opportunities.*" Only then will we know with certainty that gender parity exists for faculty retention and advancement within the State System.

In the author's view, many of the changes in the climate of the individual campuses and the status of female faculty in the State System since the early 1970s have come about because female faculty have pressed for them collectively through the establishment and actions of such groups as the Women's Consortium of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, Women's Centers, Women's Studies Programs, Institute for Women, Child Care Centers, and most recently, the Commissions on the Status of Women and the Women's Caucus in APSCUF's Legislative Assembly. It is heartening to know that their importance in implementing the *Equity Plan* (1994, p.23) is now being recognized within the State System. The commitment, energy, resources, and experience that these groups offer should continue to provide direction to address the issues raised in this report.

It has been said that reality only has value when it is transformed. This study should stimulate a new awareness about gender inequality in the State System and help to set the agenda for the increased hiring and professional advancement of female faculty in the State System. Quality education in the State System demands nothing less.



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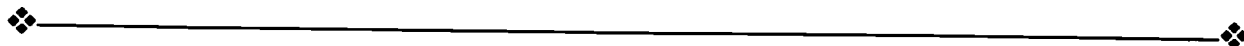

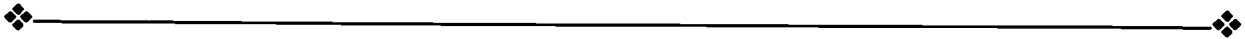

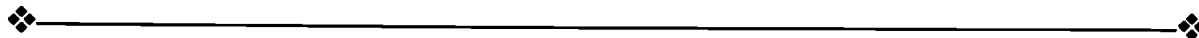

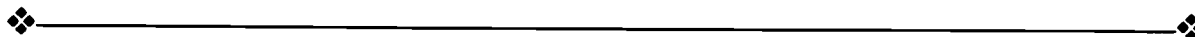

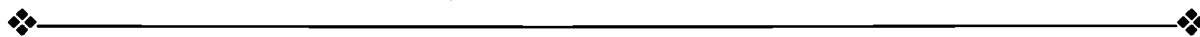

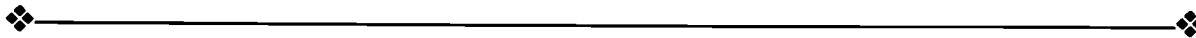

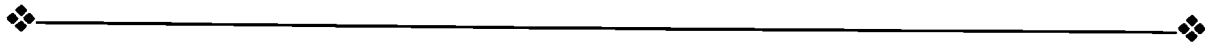

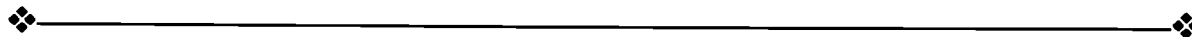

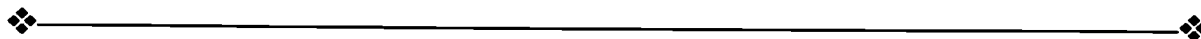

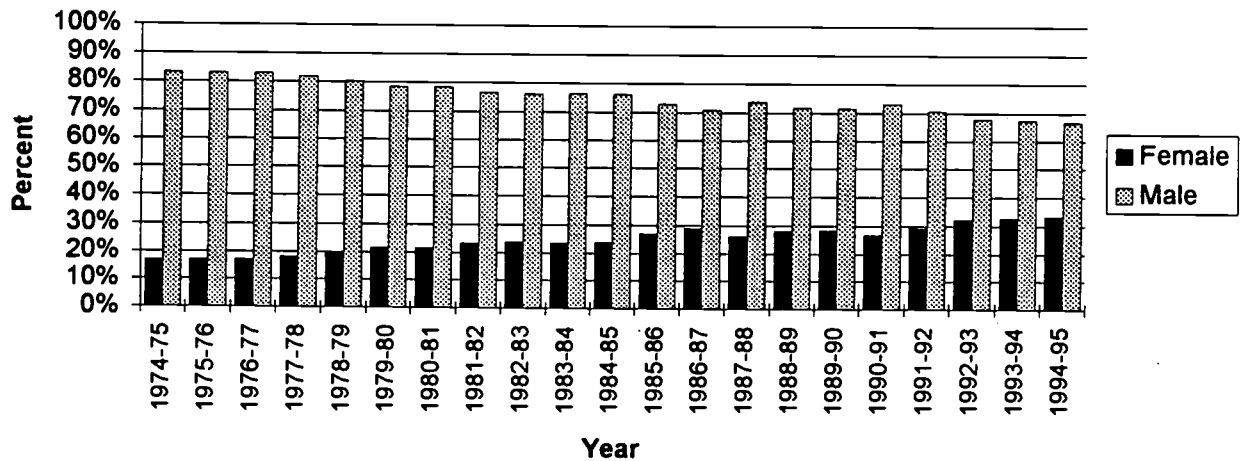

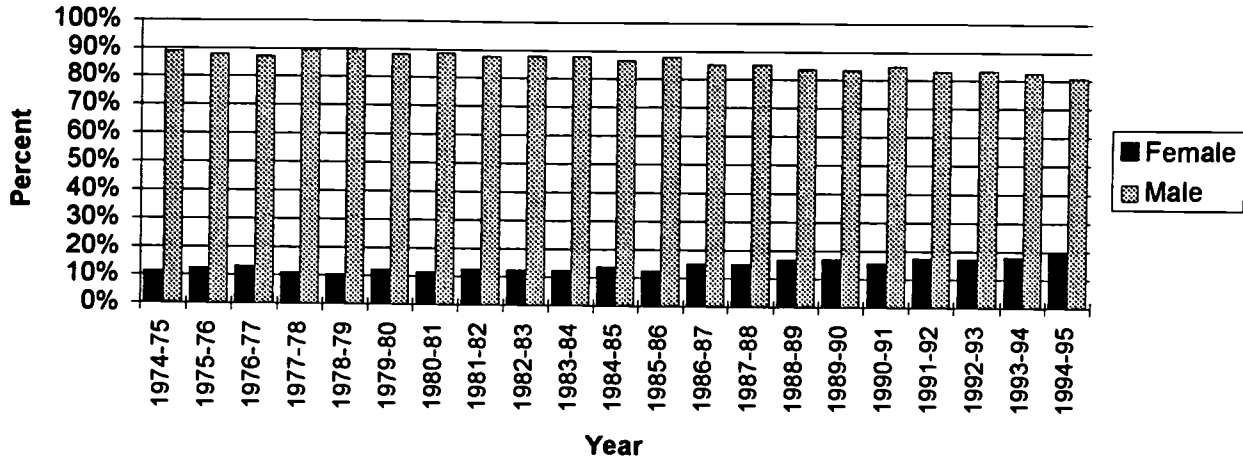

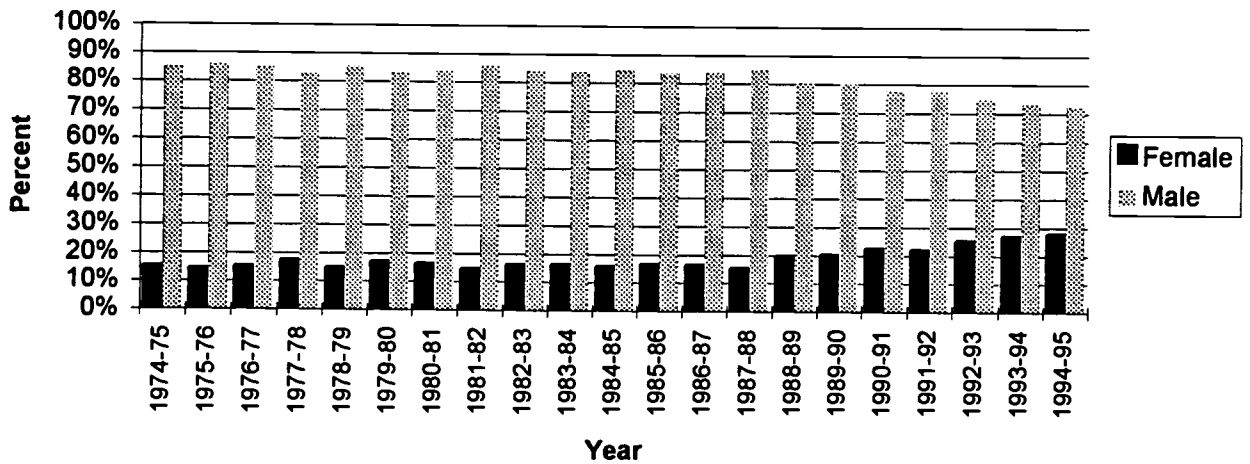

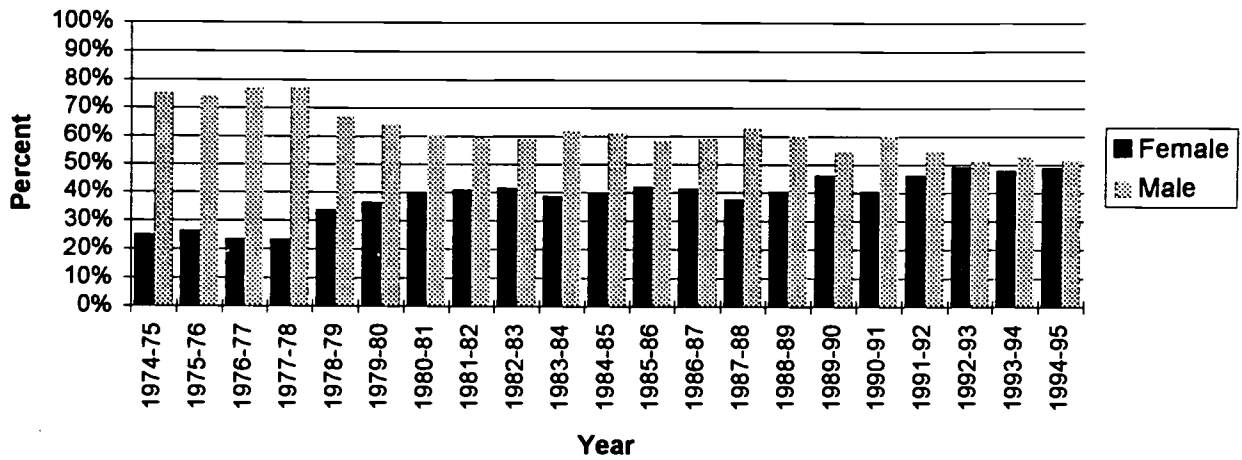

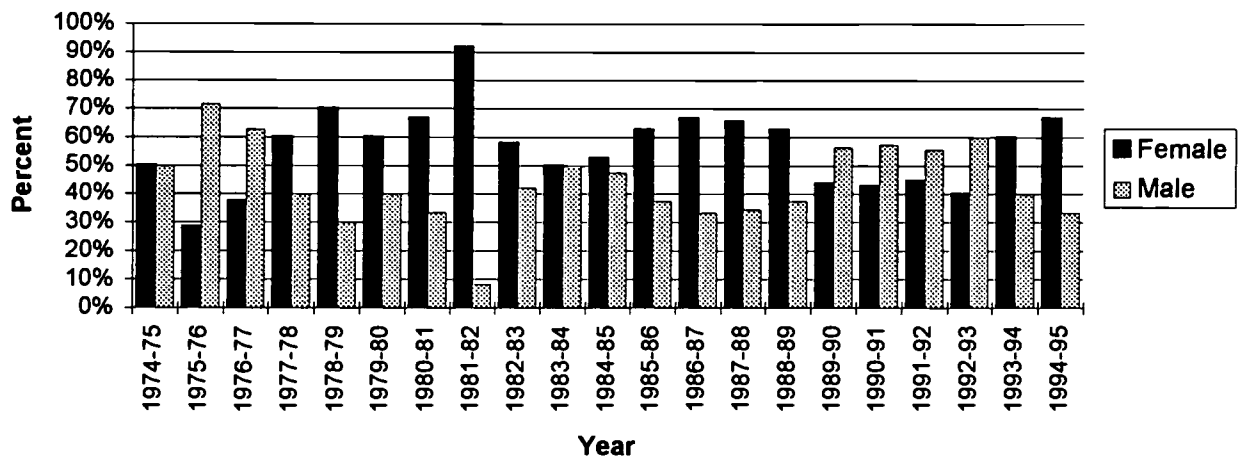
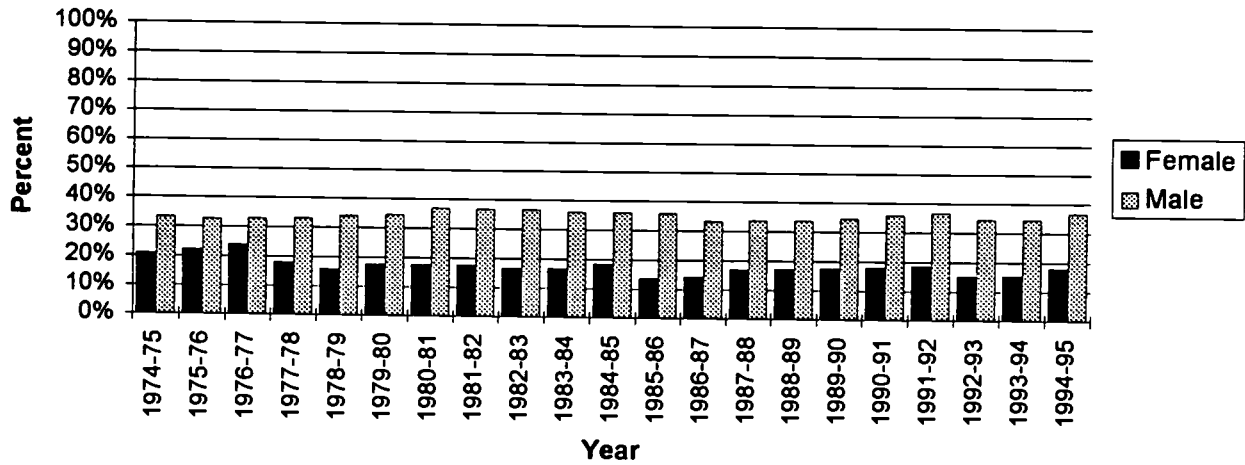

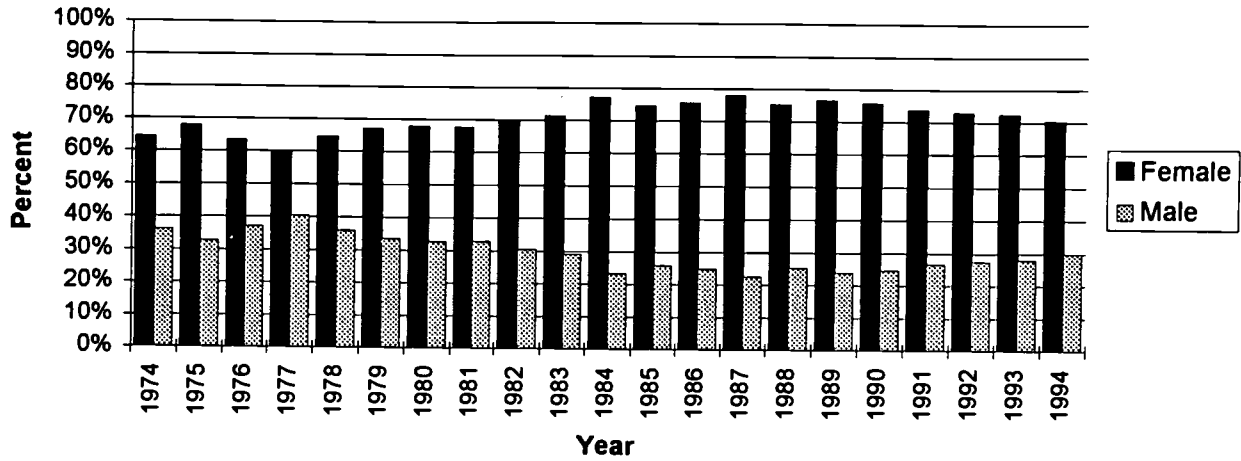

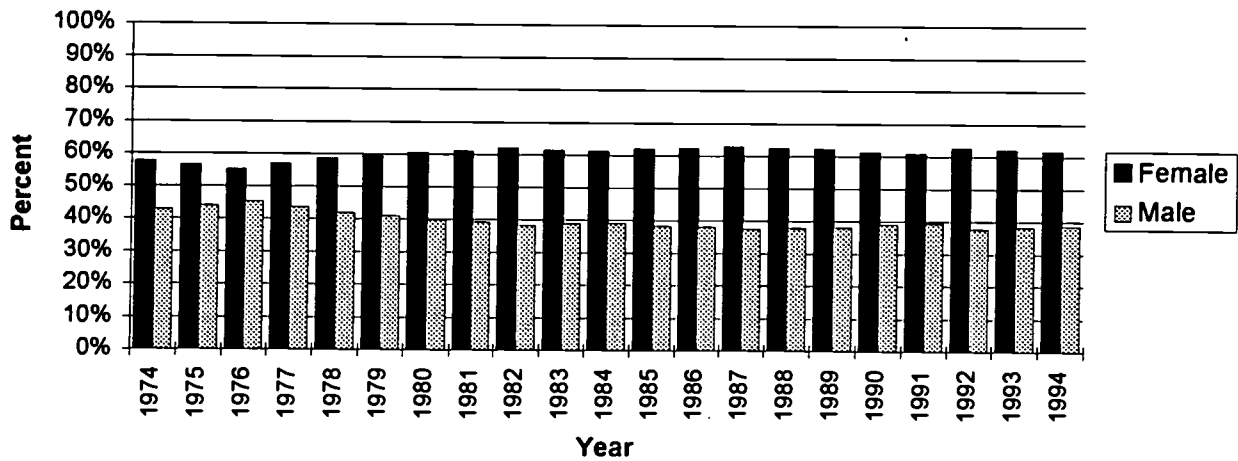
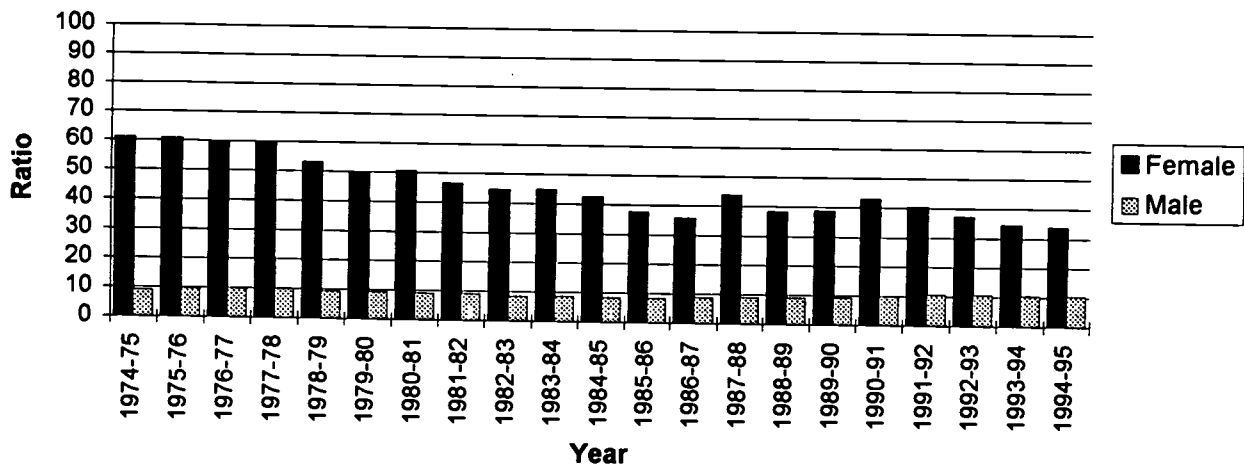

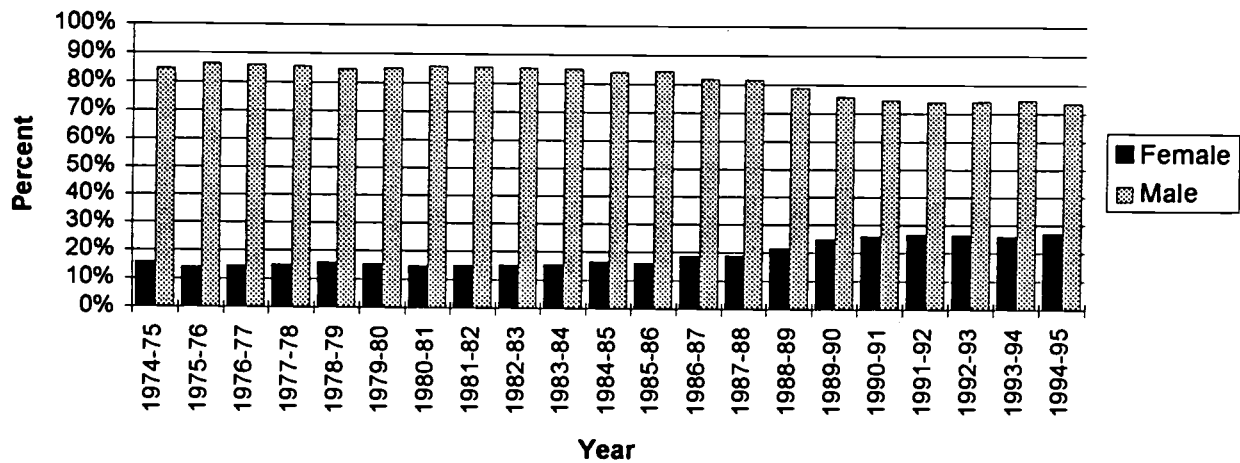

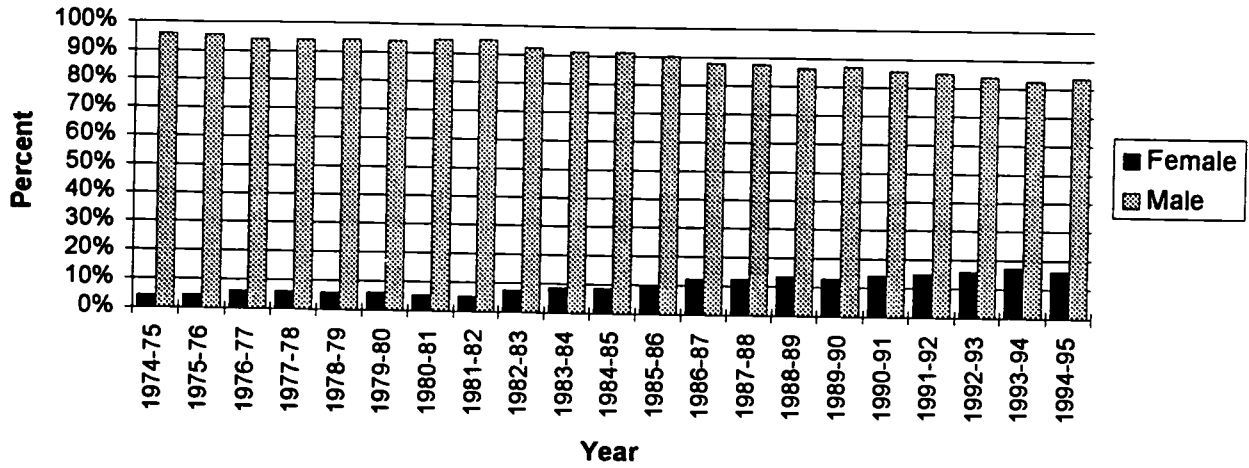

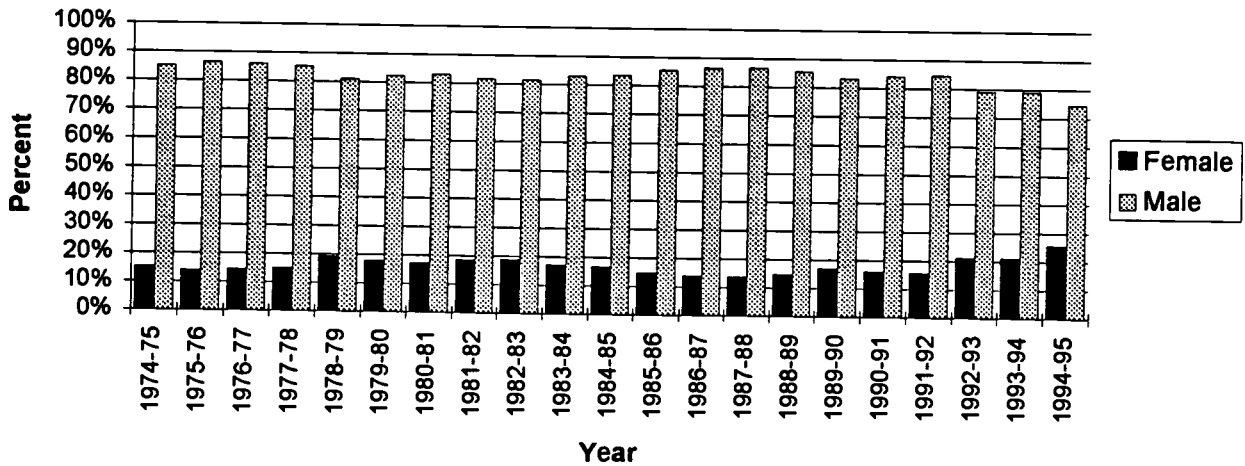

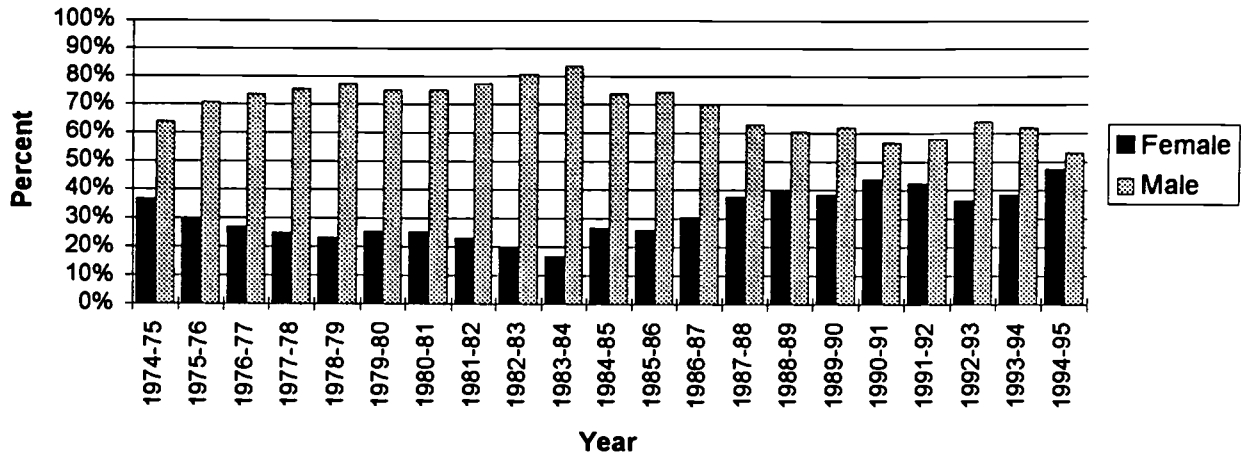

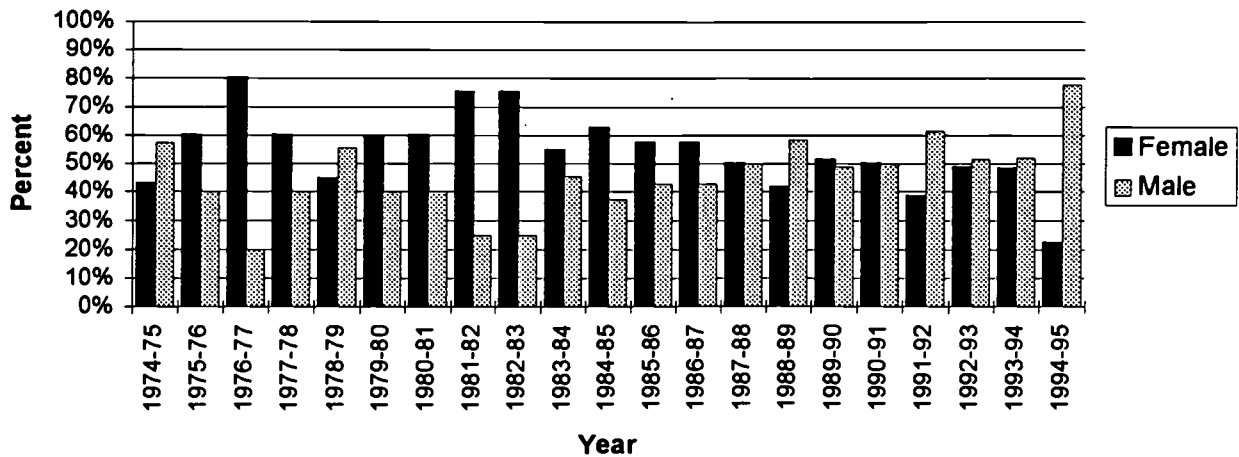
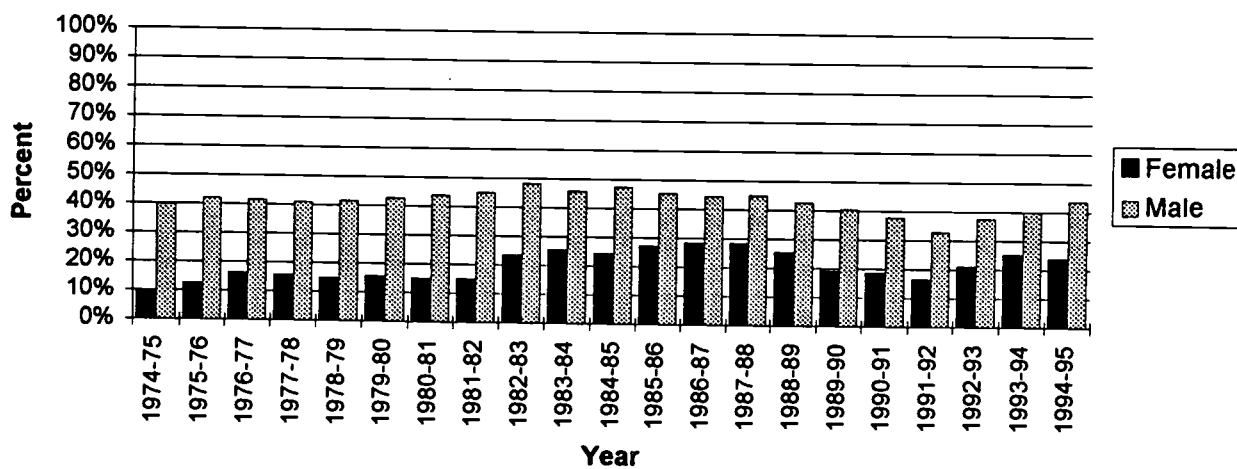

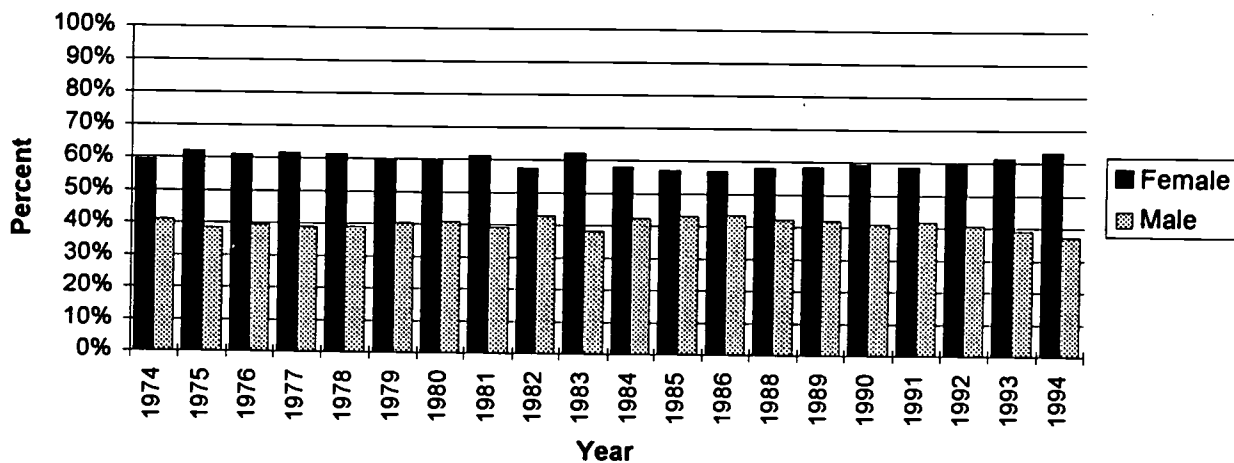

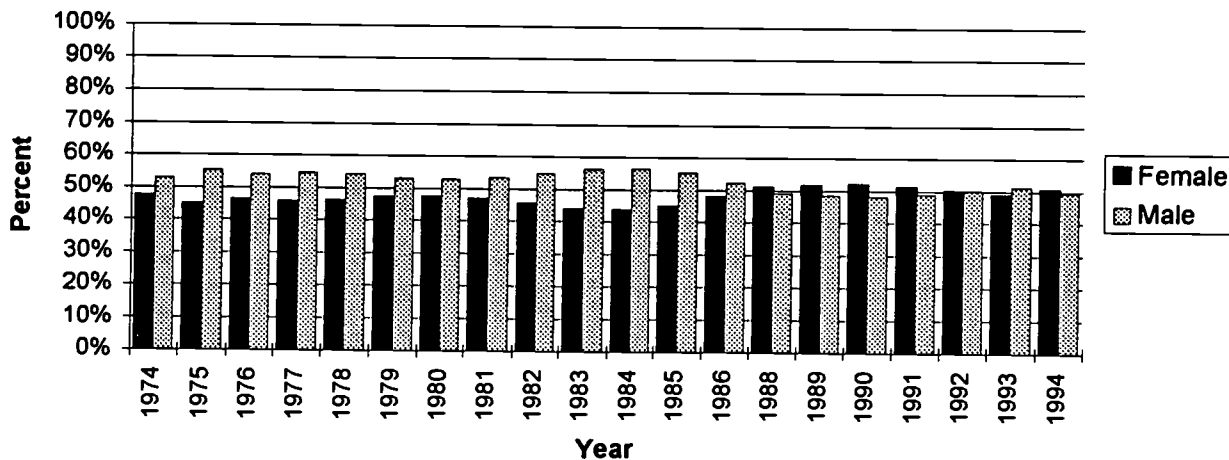
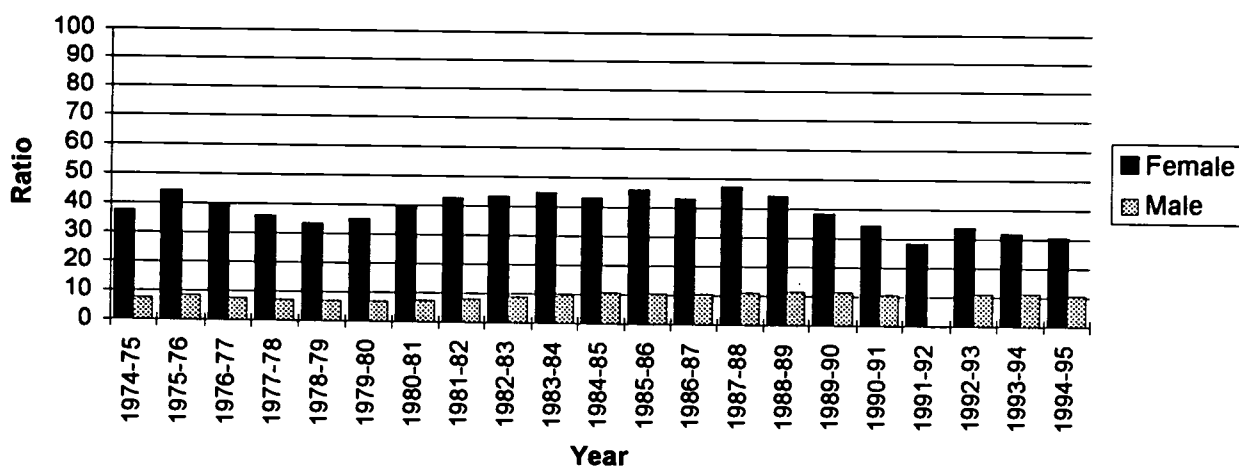

Full-time Total Faculty by Sex, 1974 - 1994

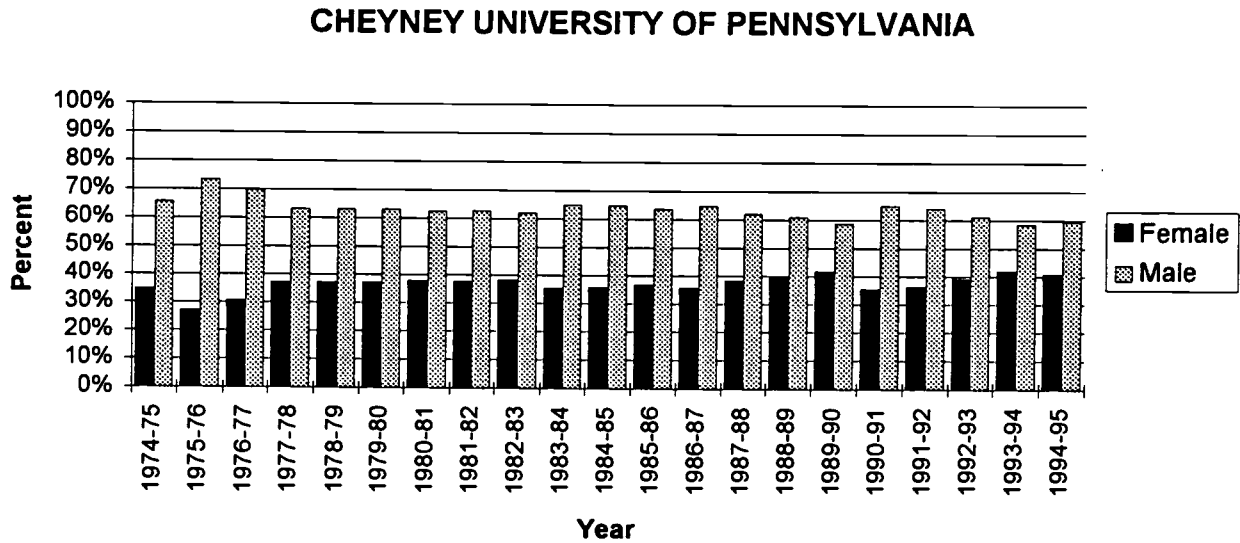

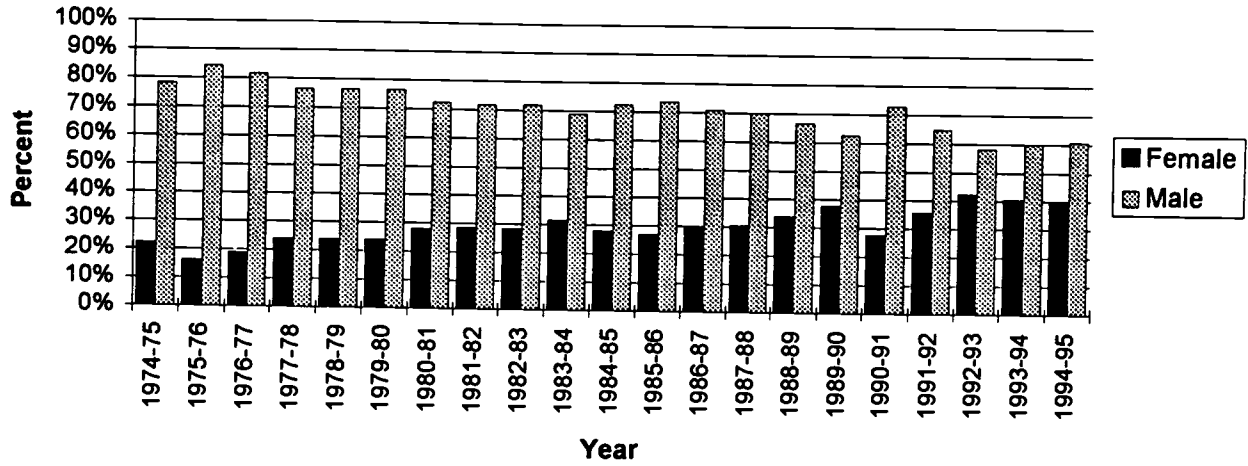

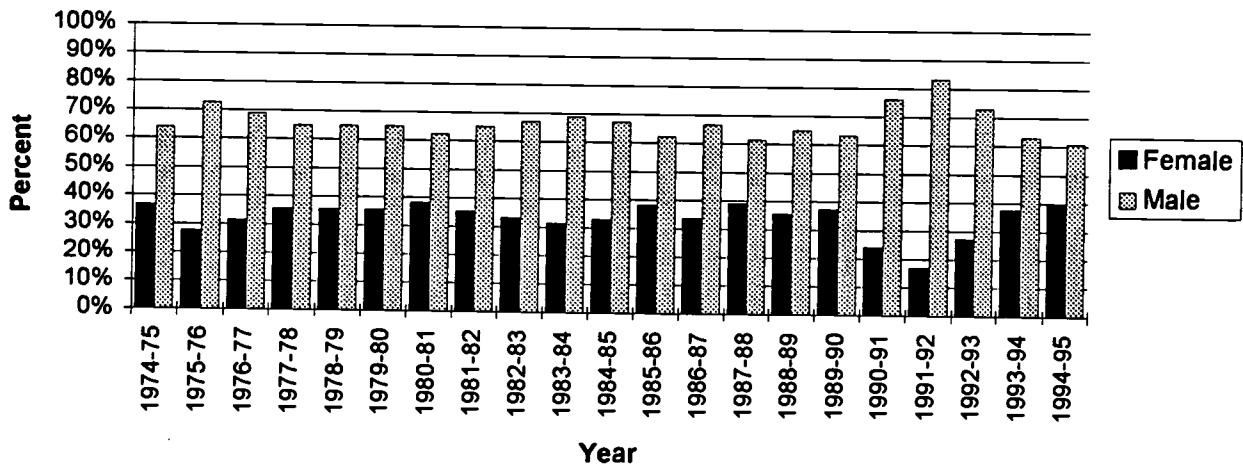

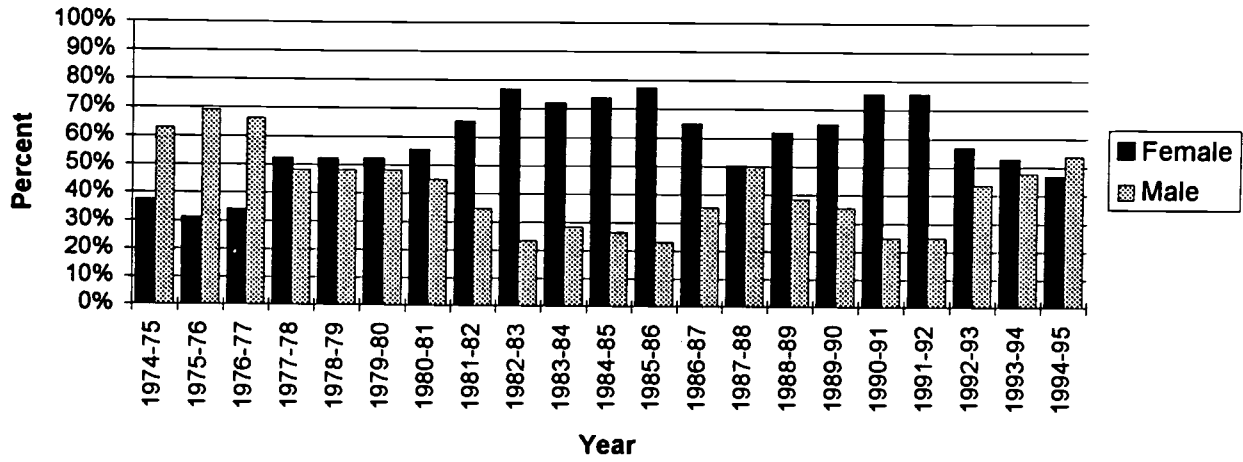

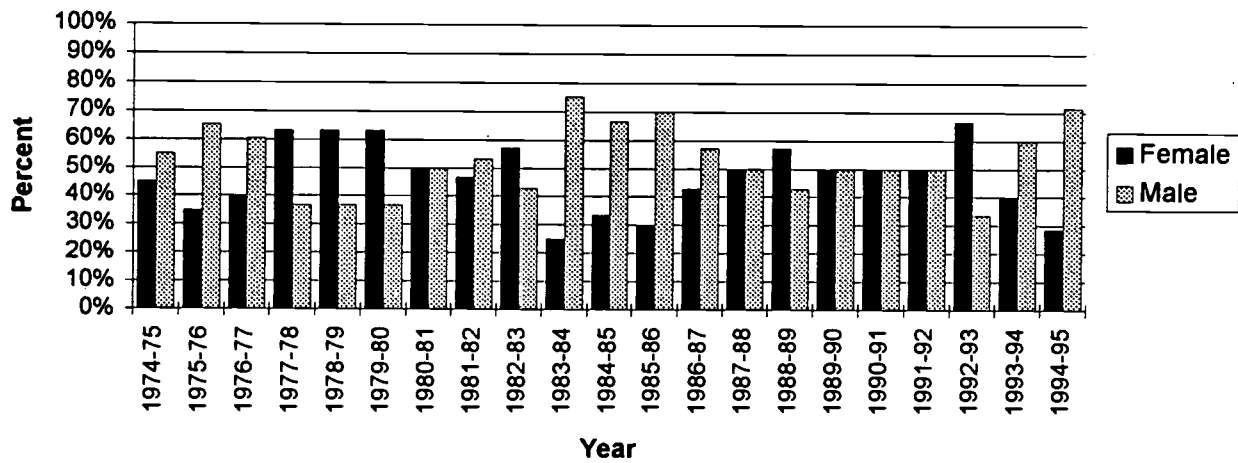
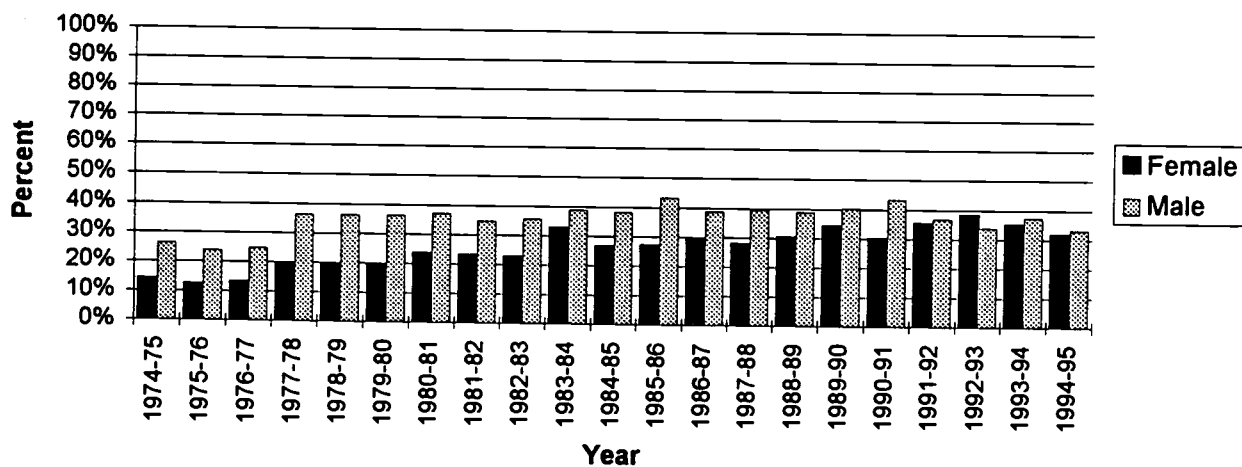

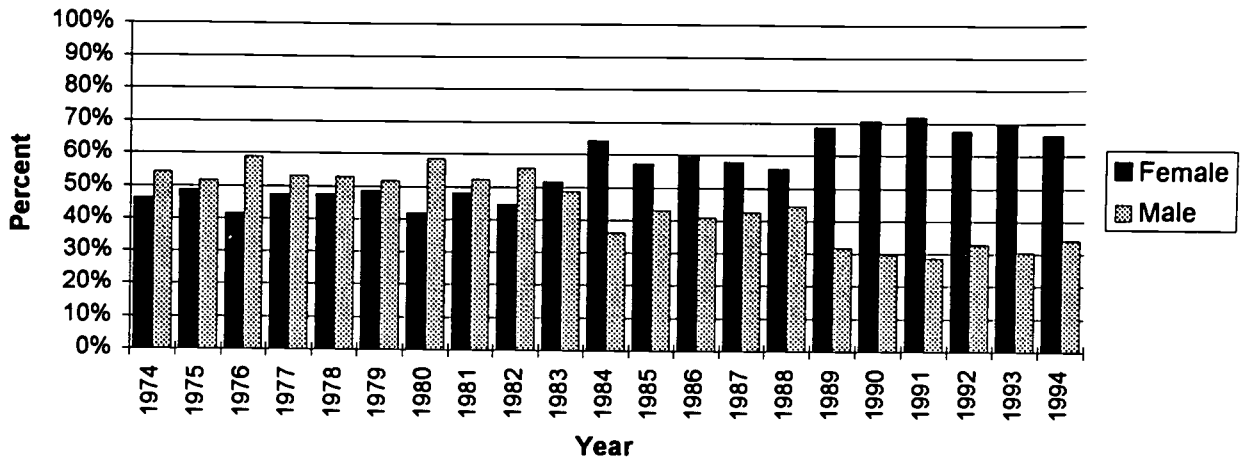

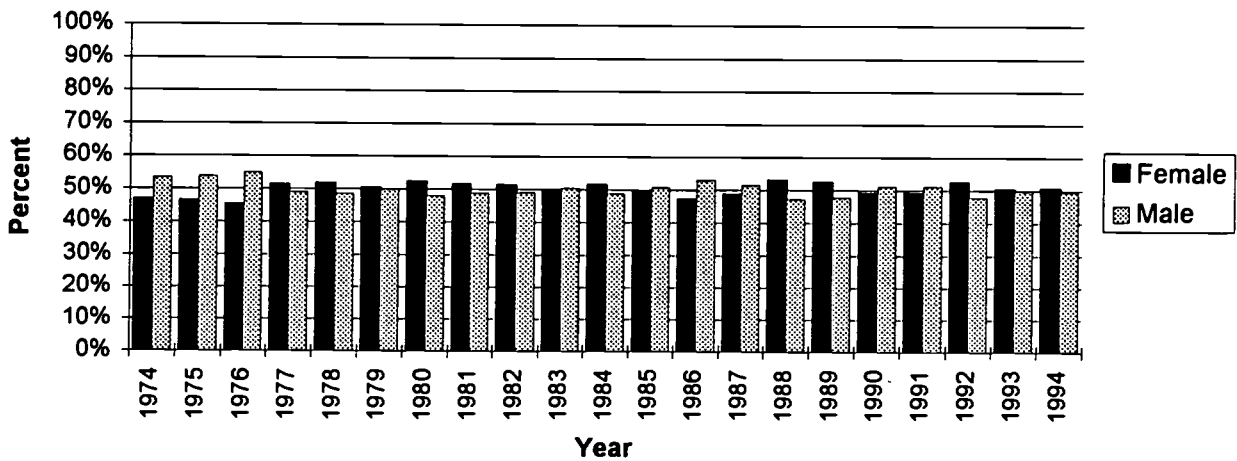
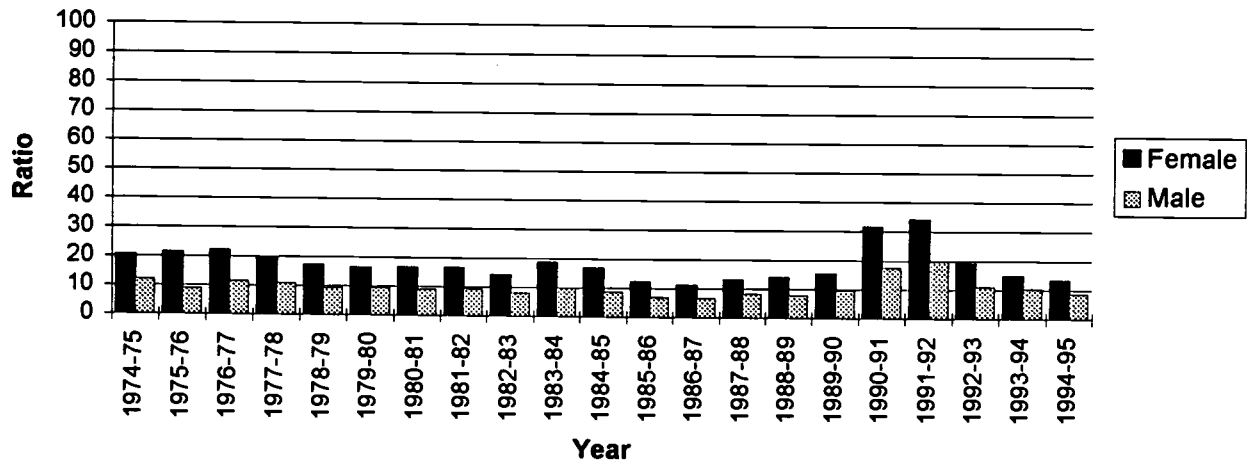

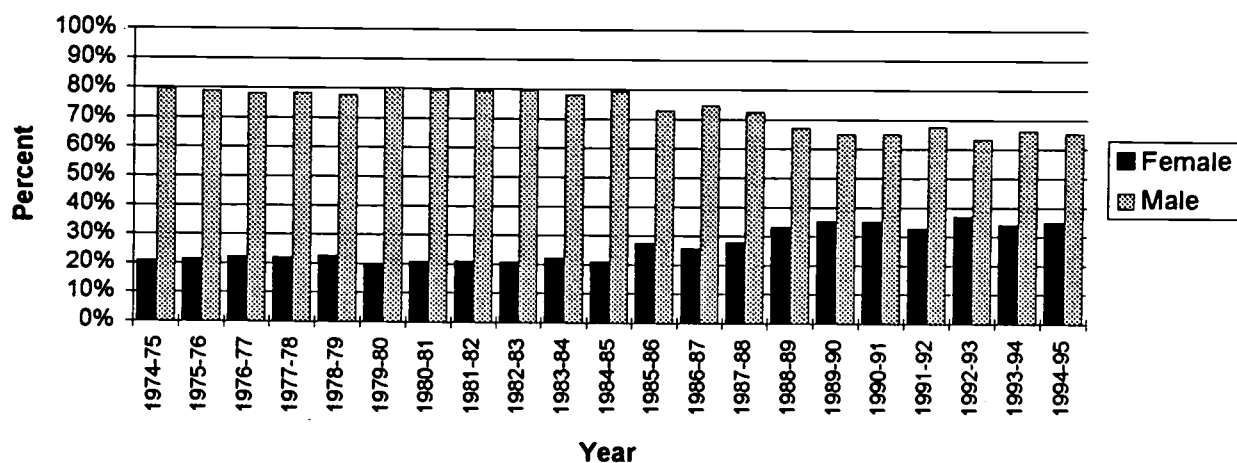

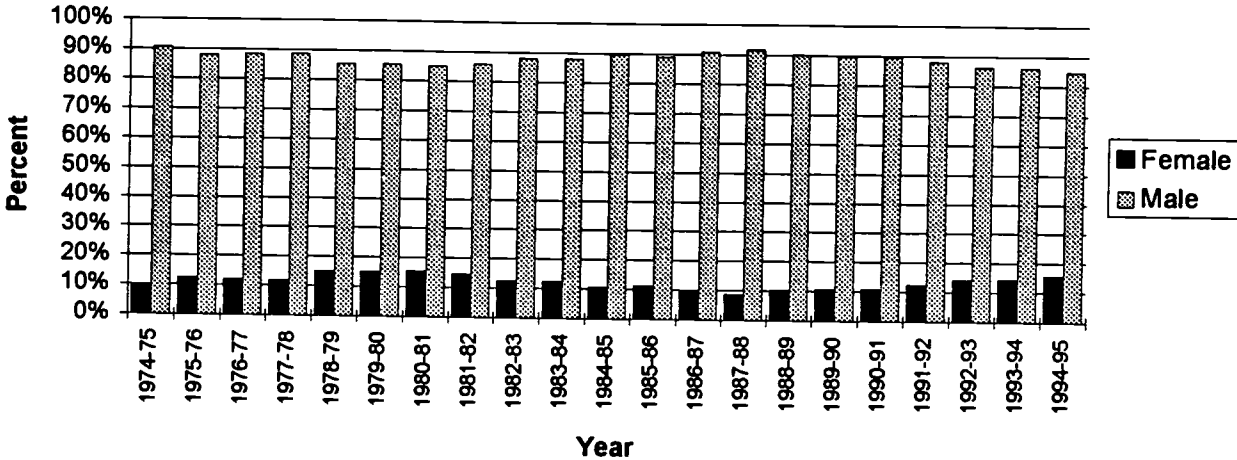

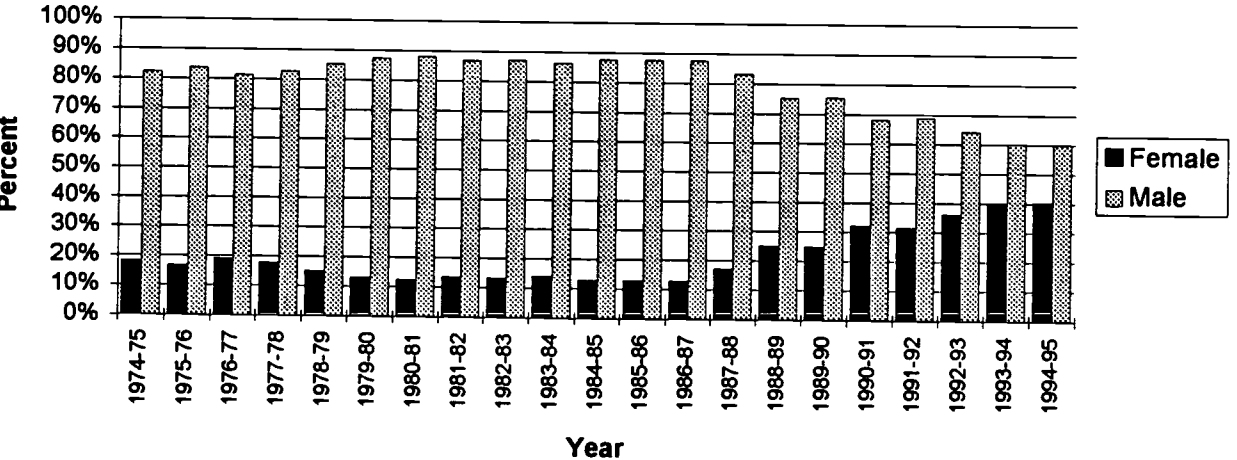

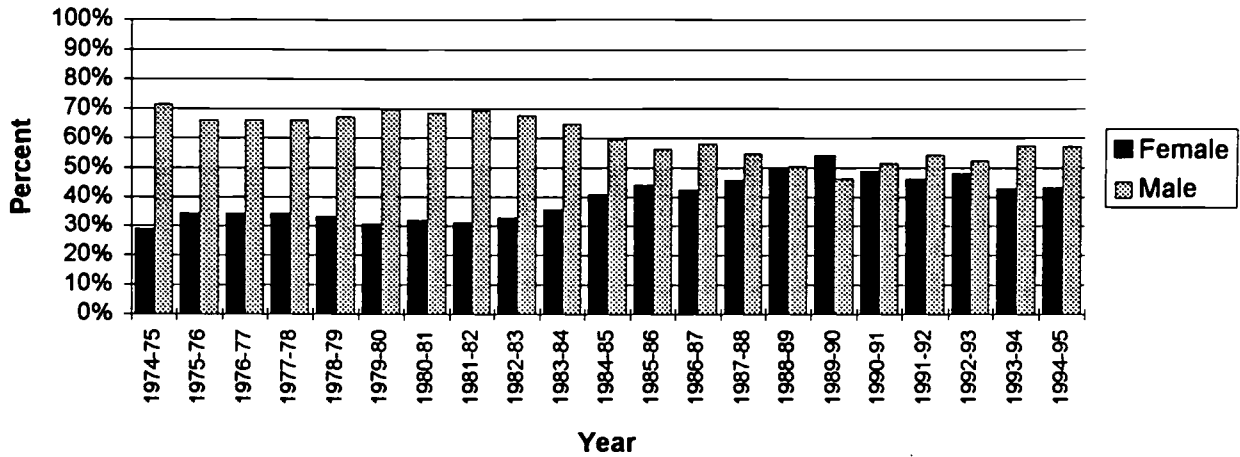

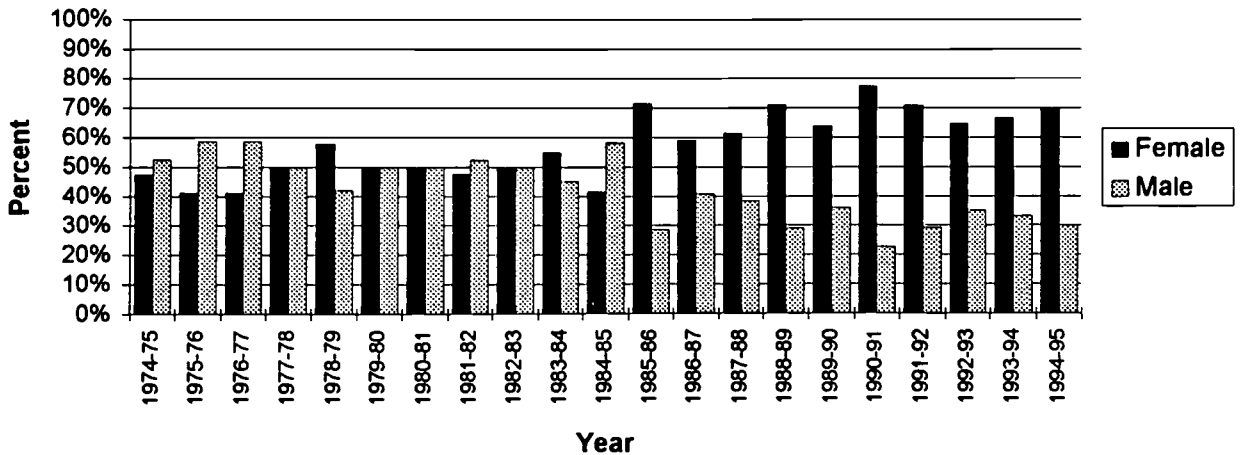
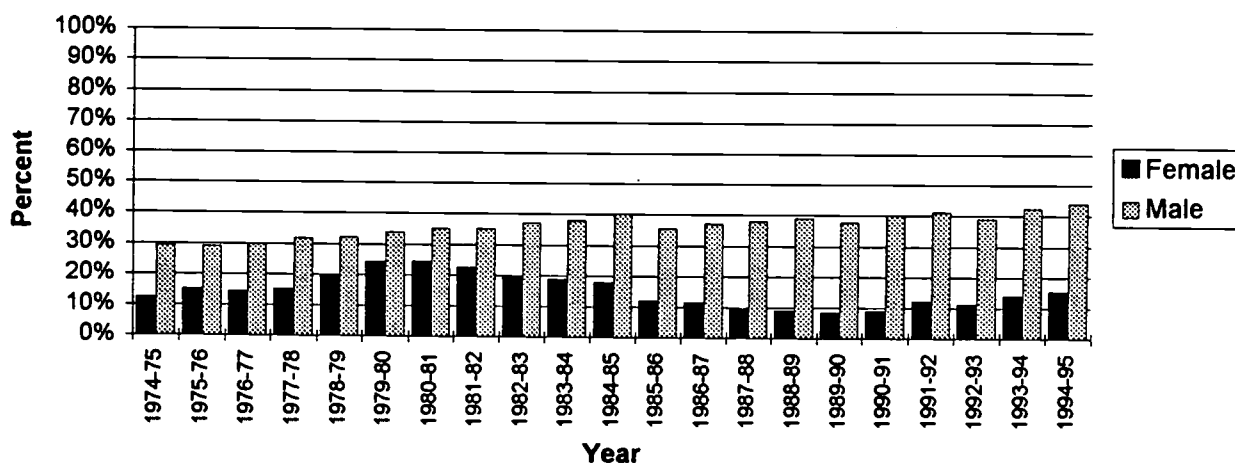

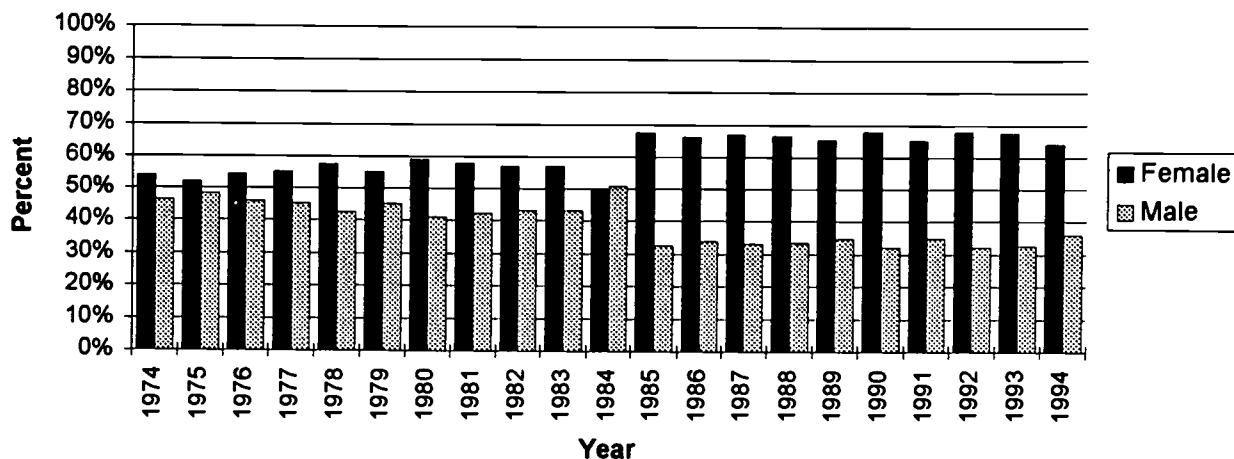

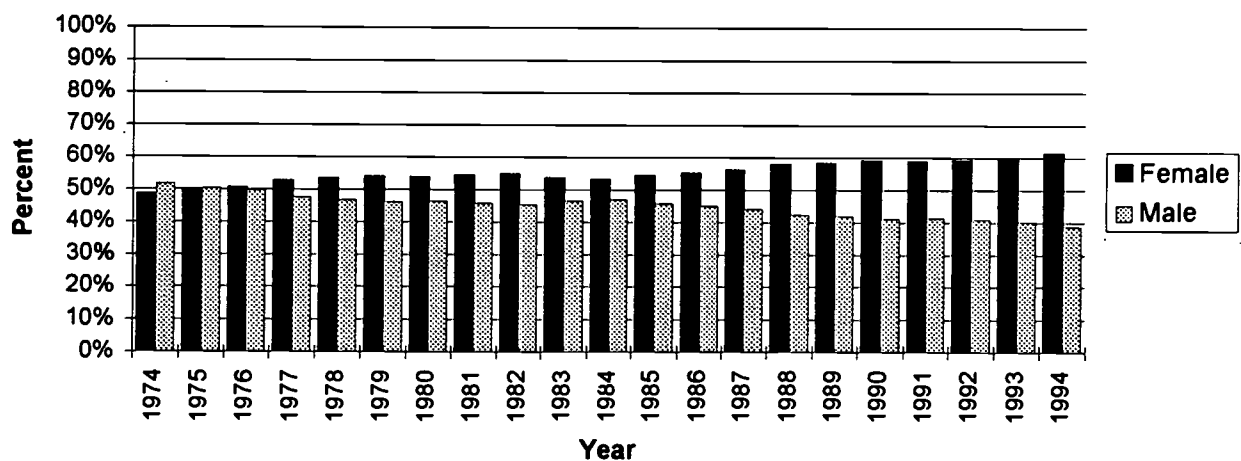
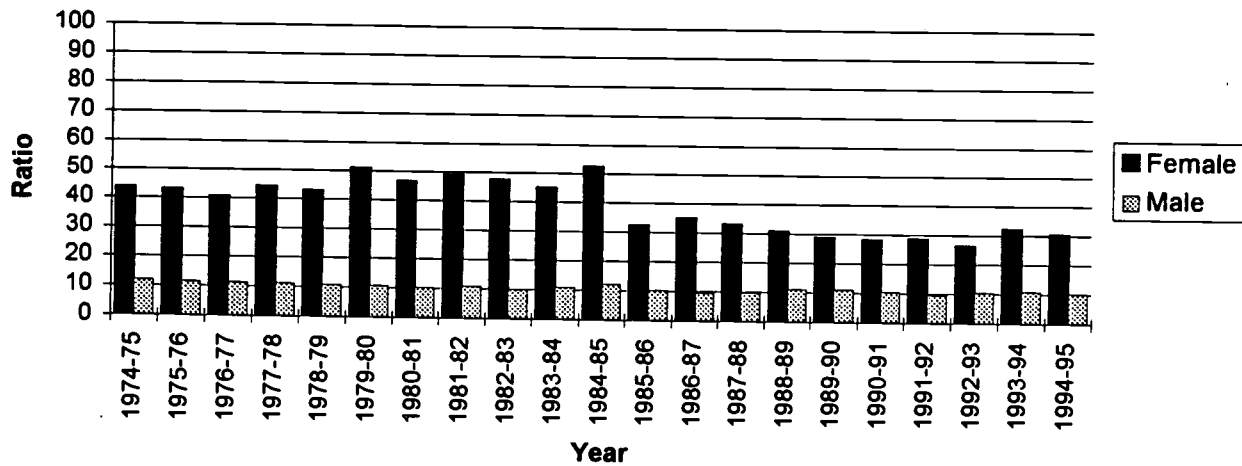

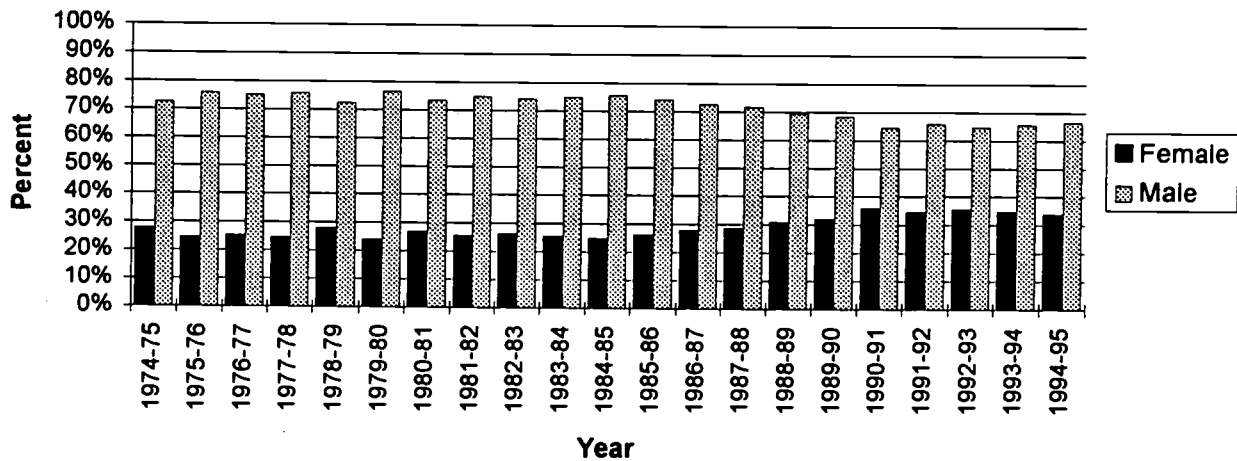

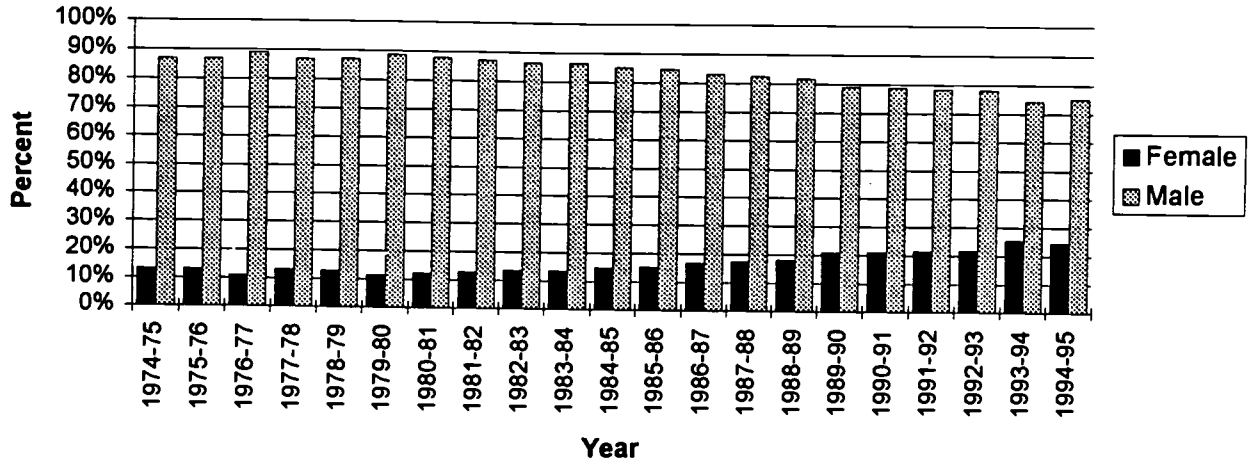

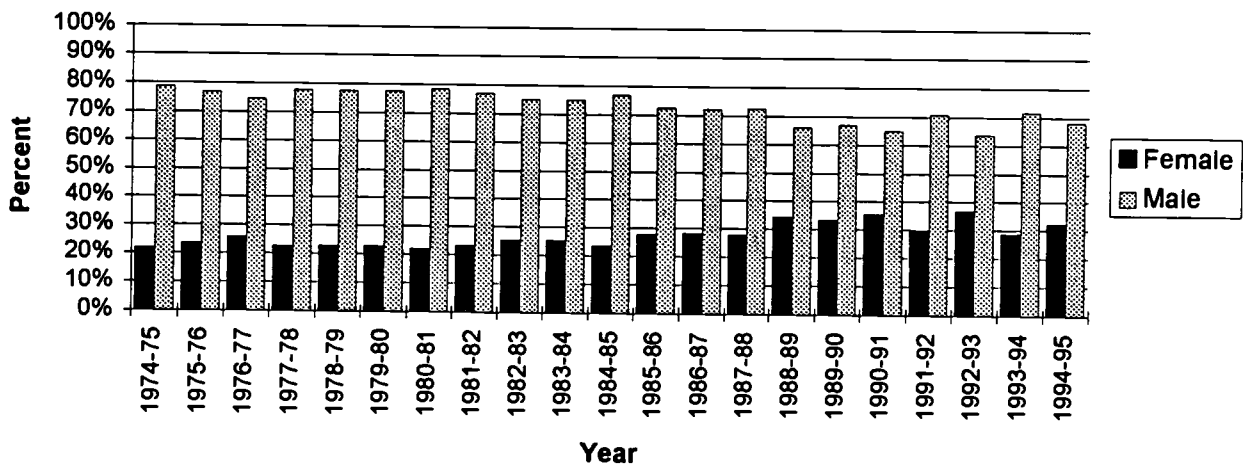

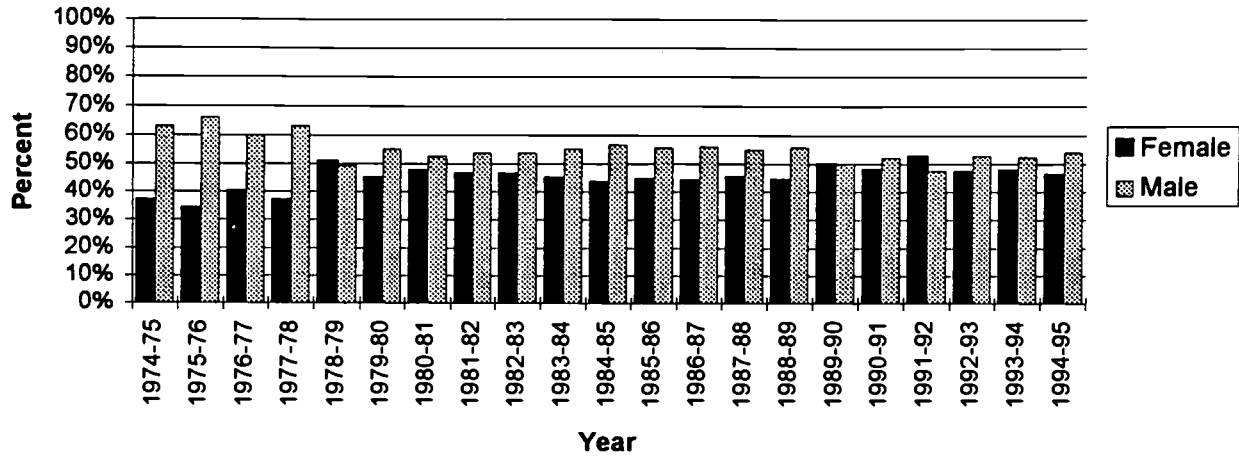

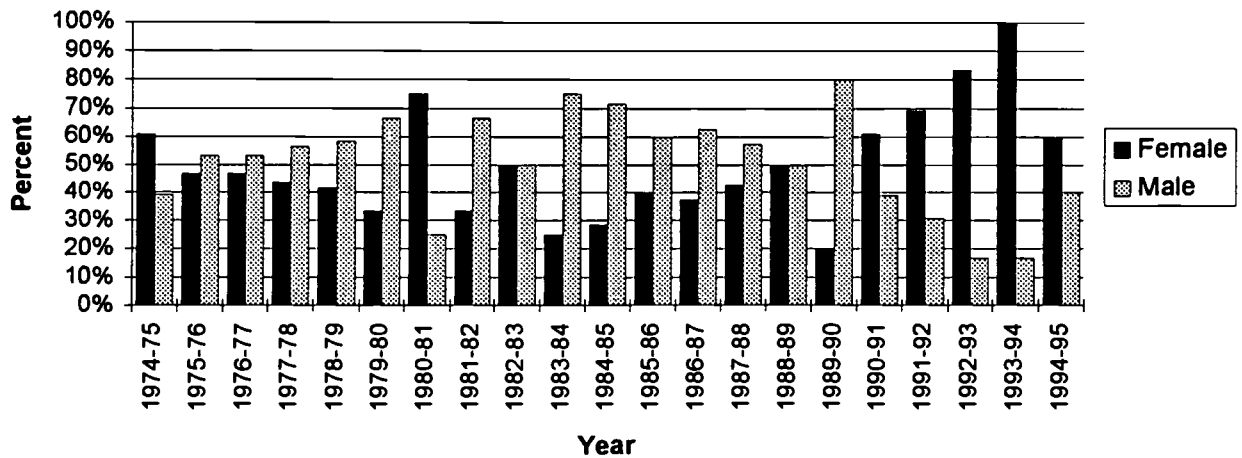
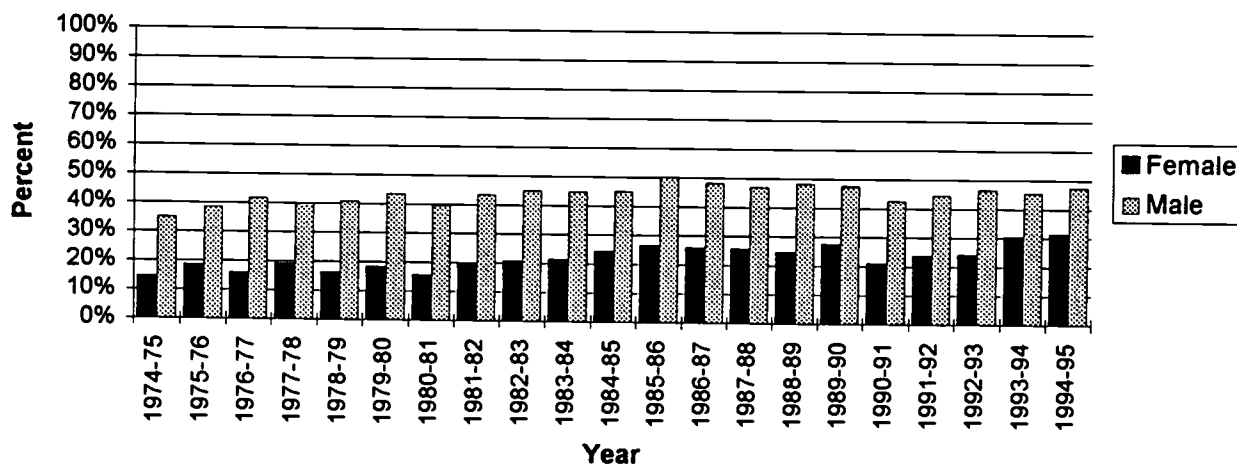

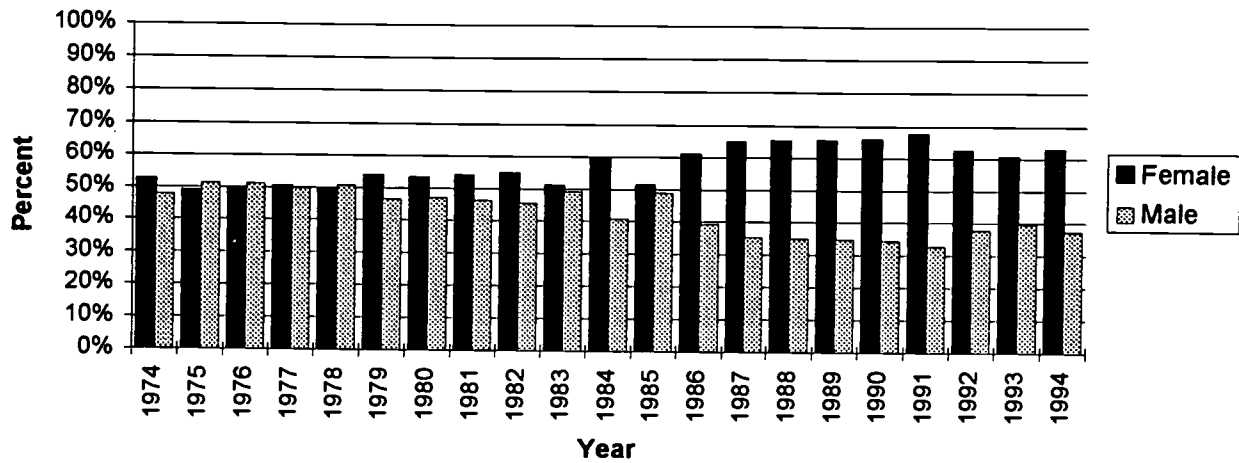

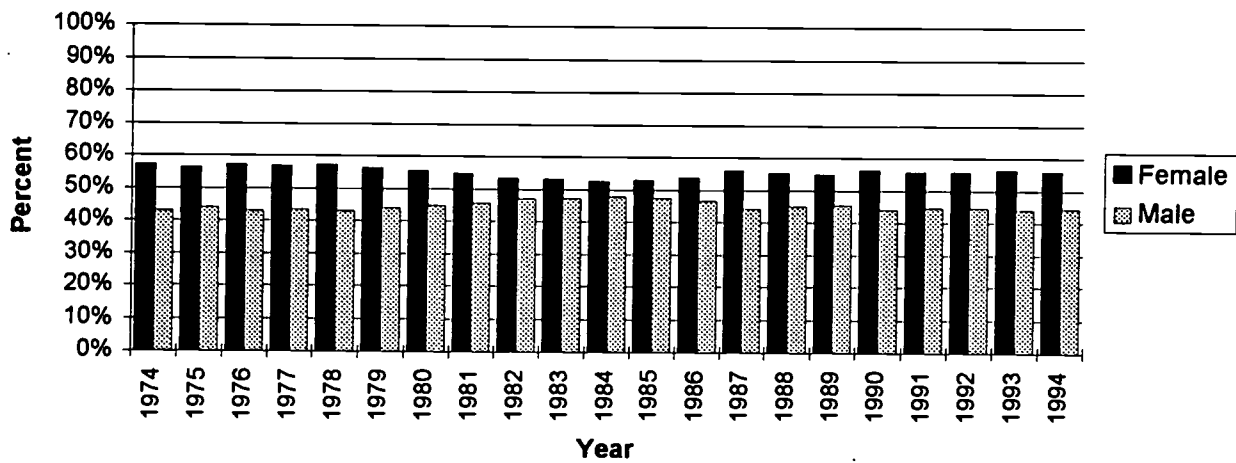
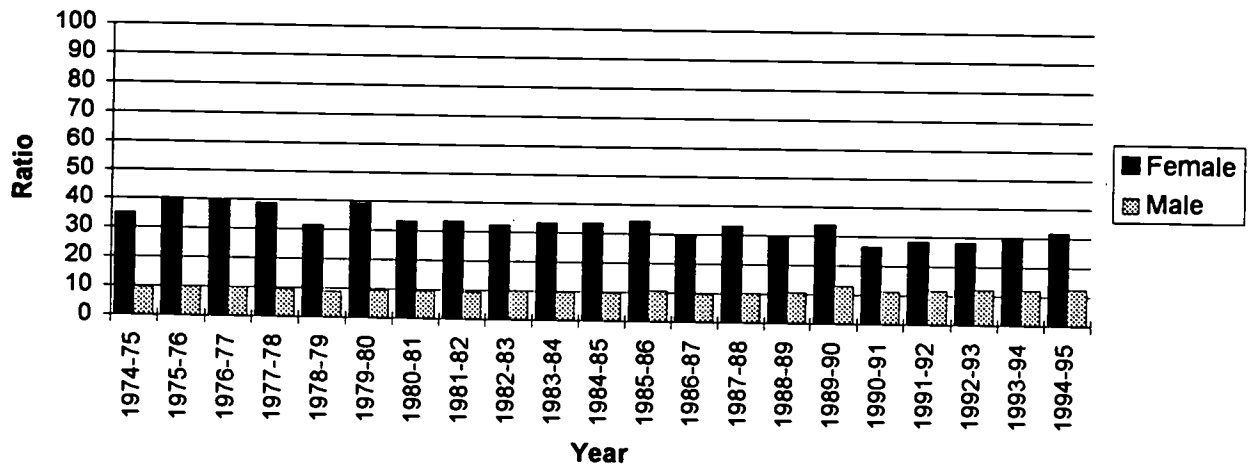

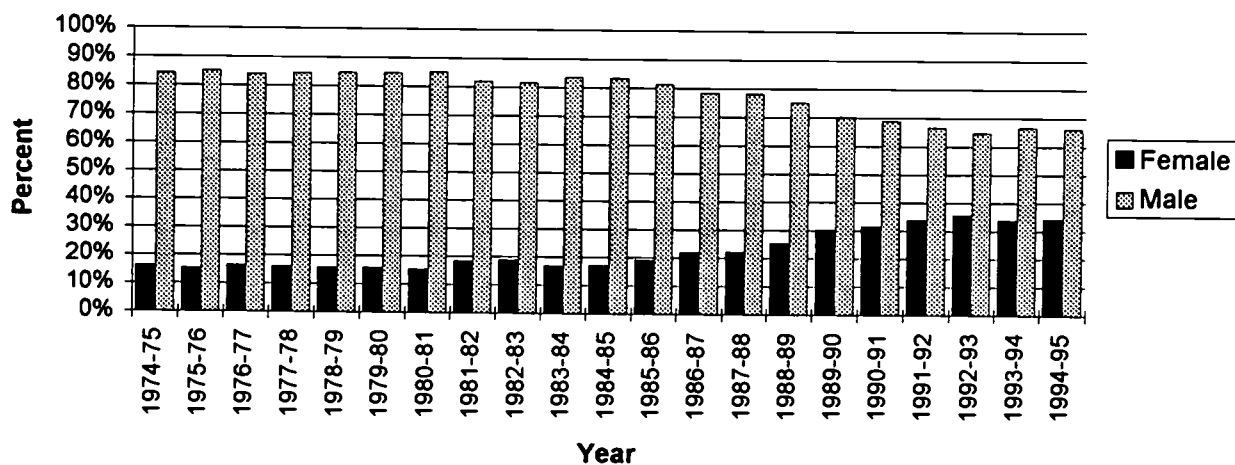

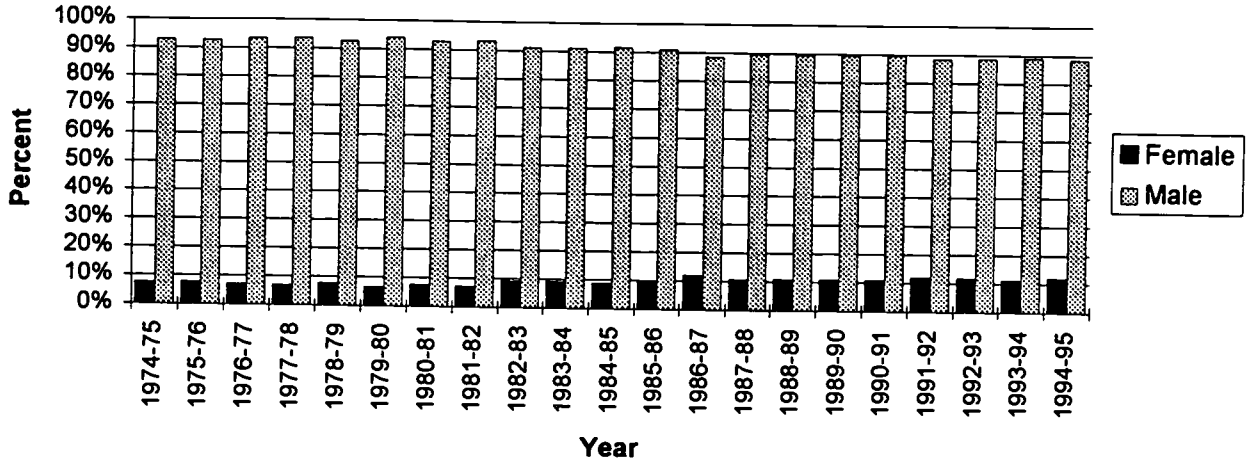

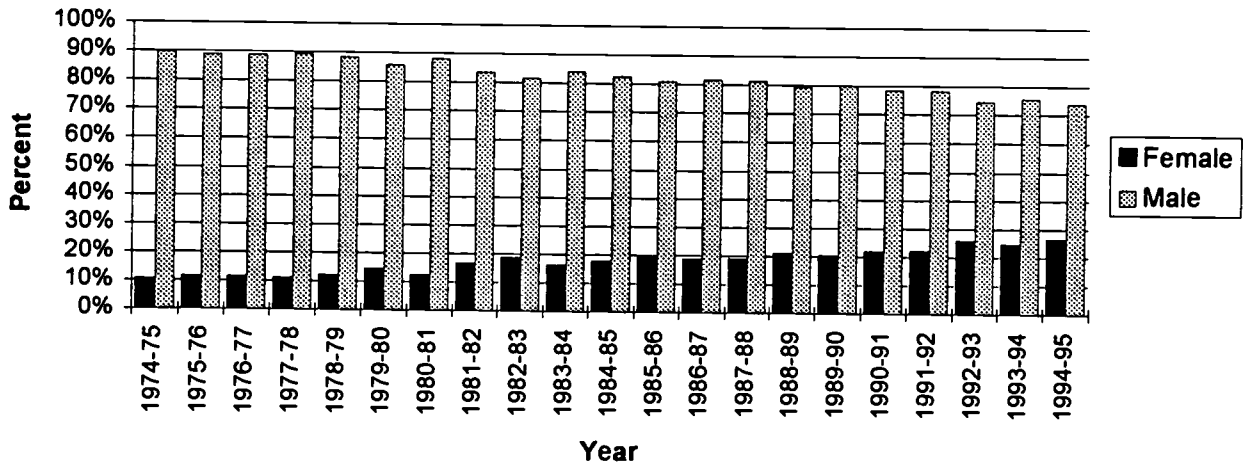

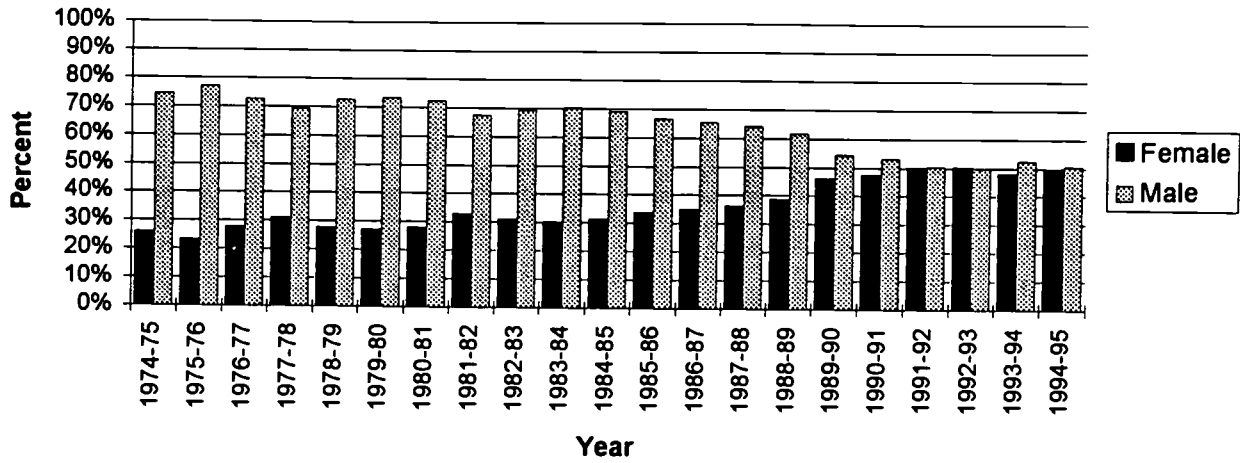

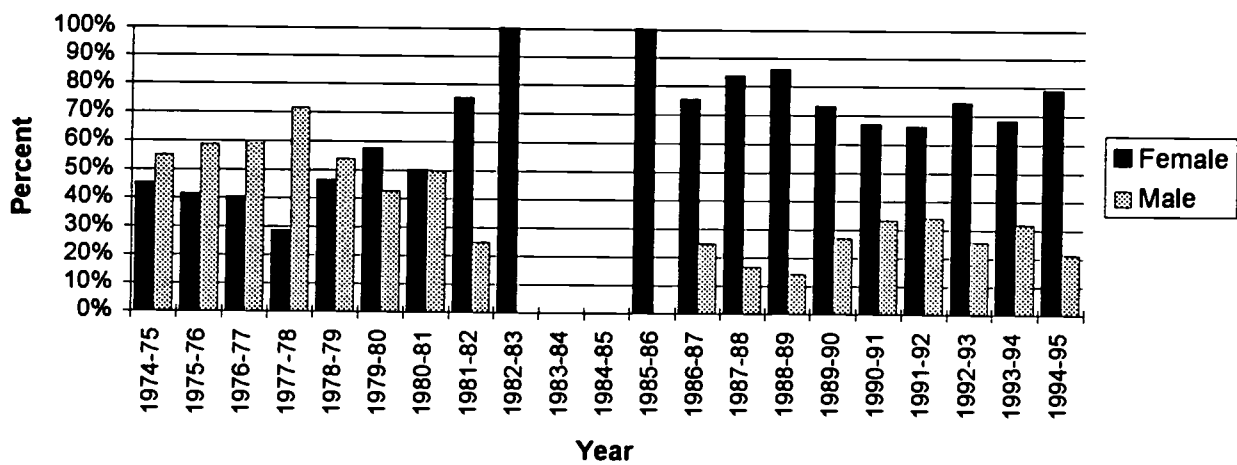
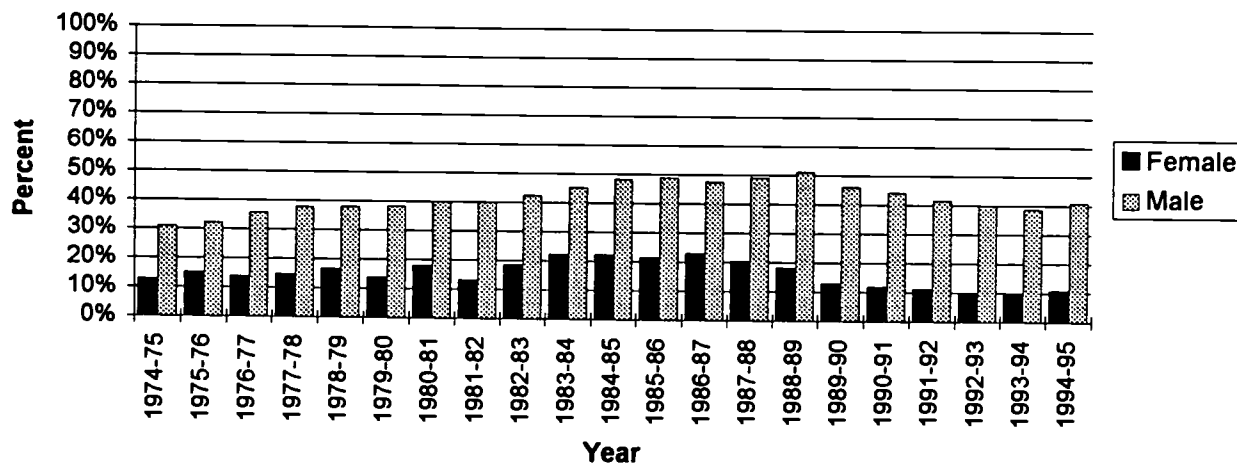

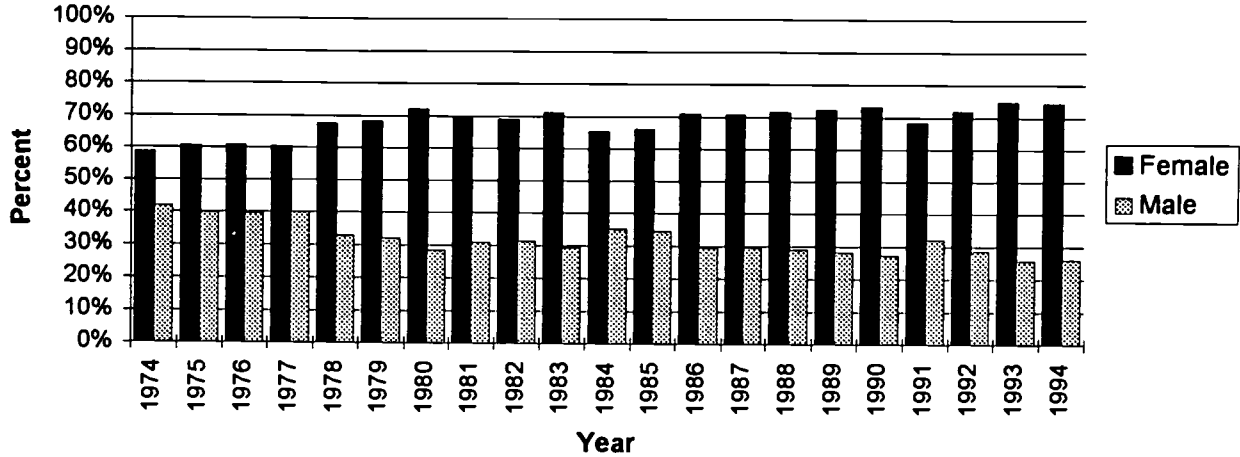

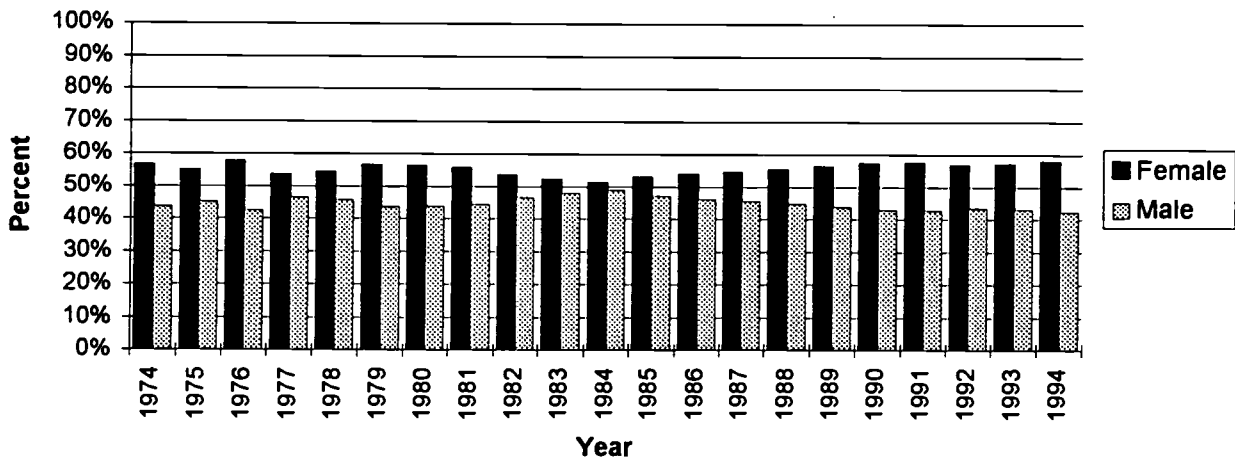
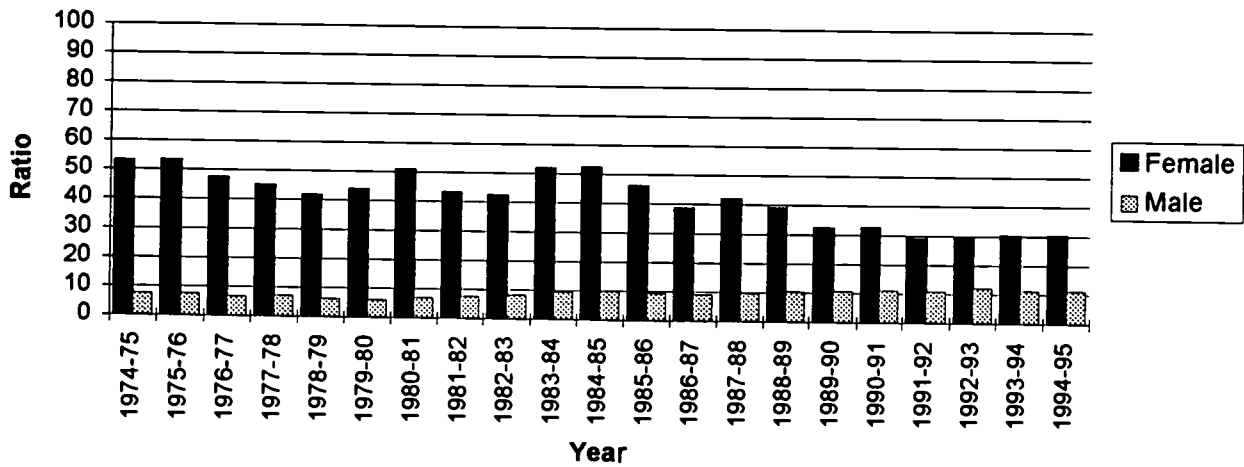

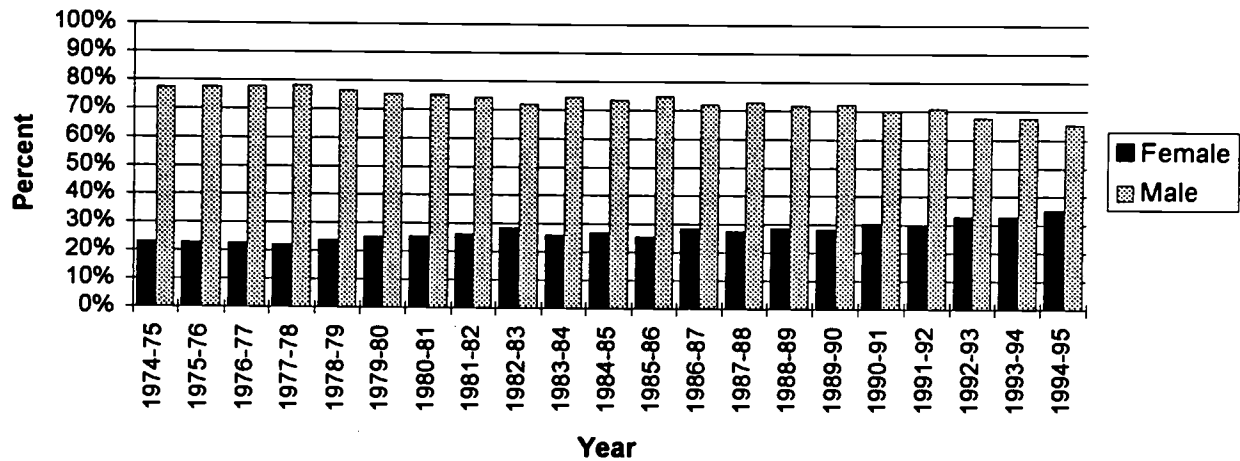

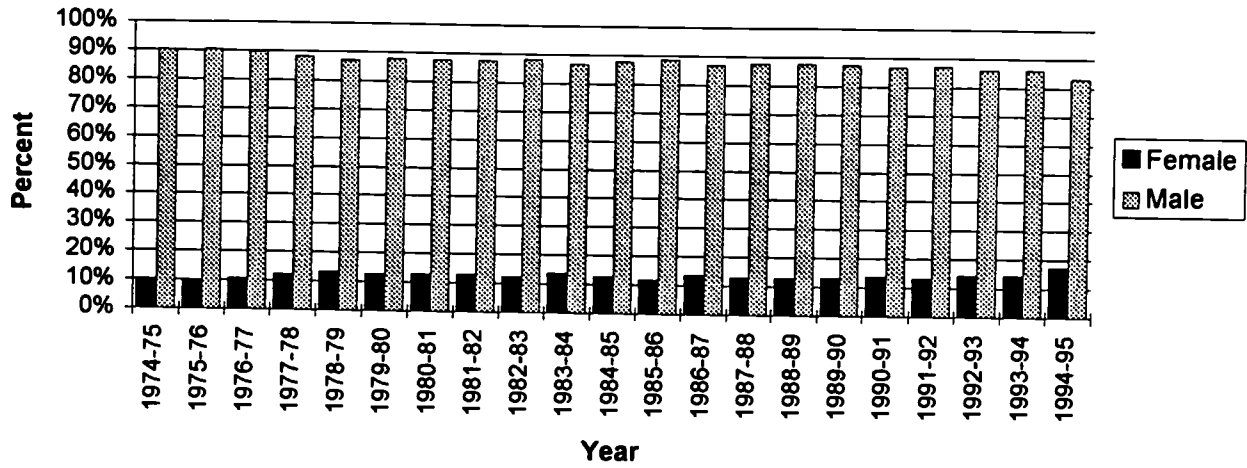

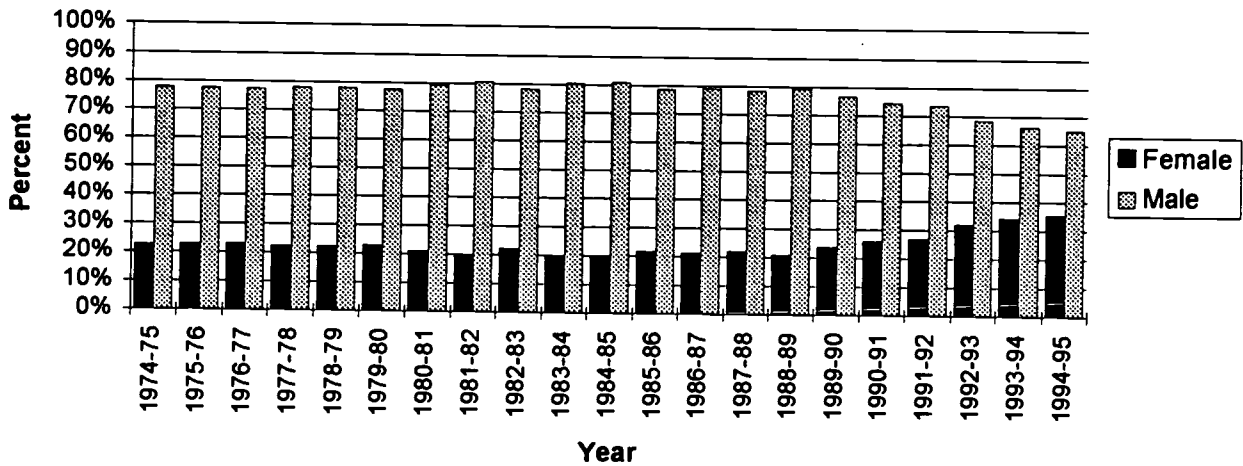

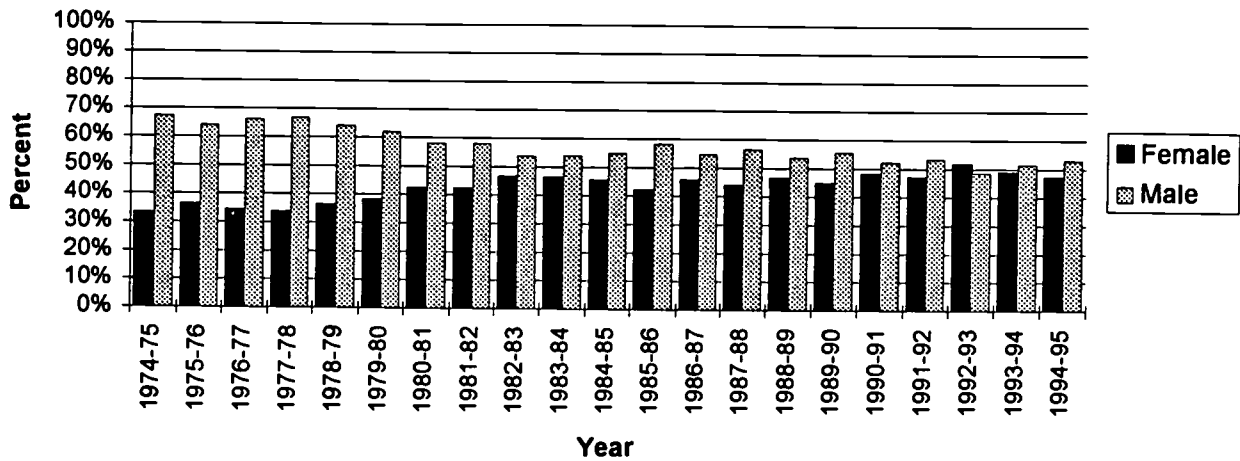

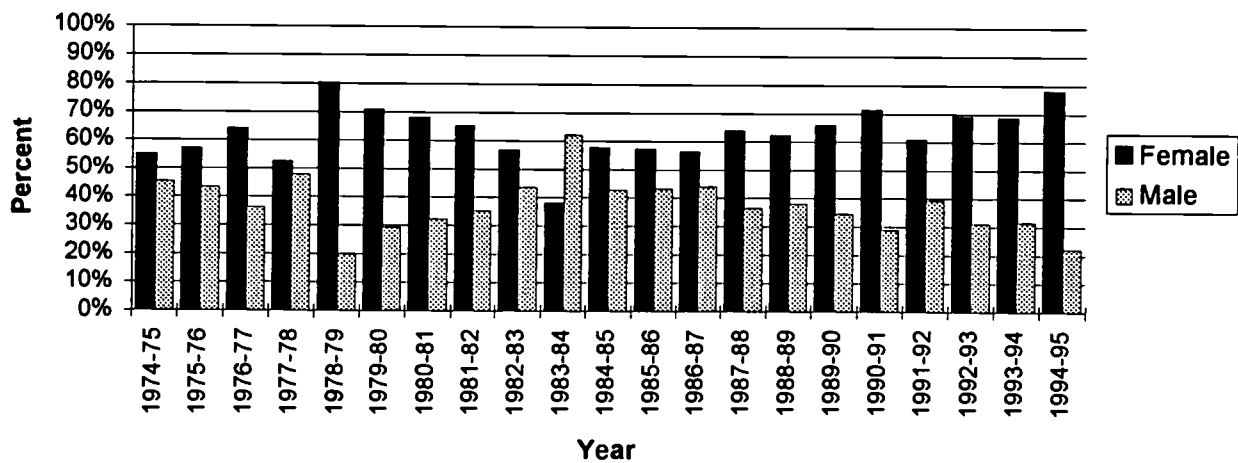
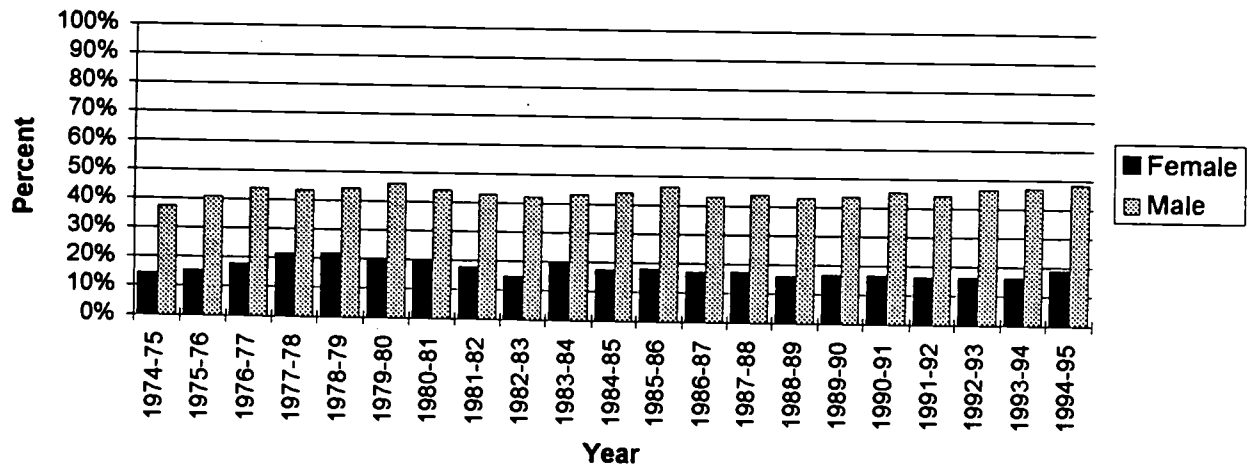

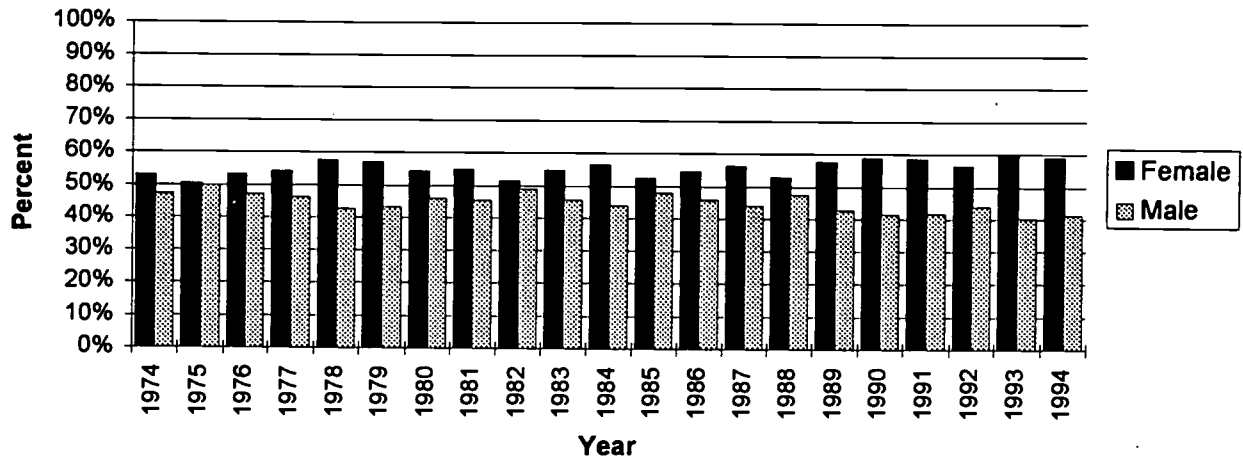

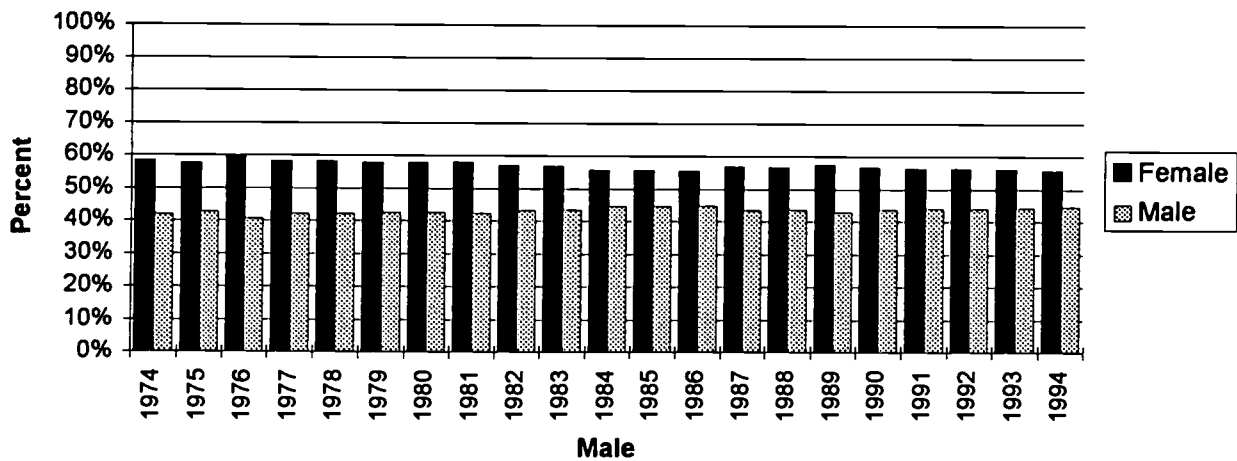
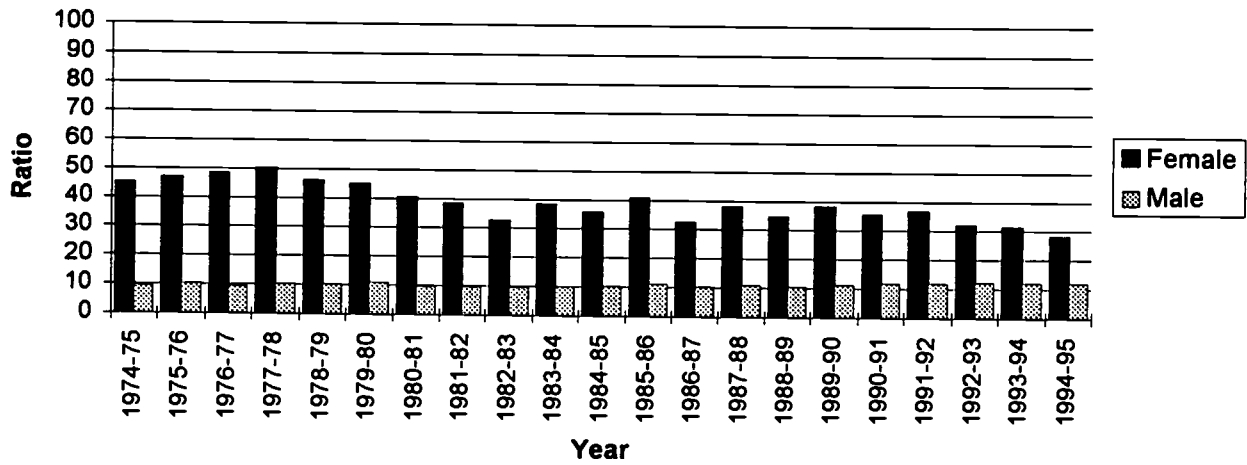

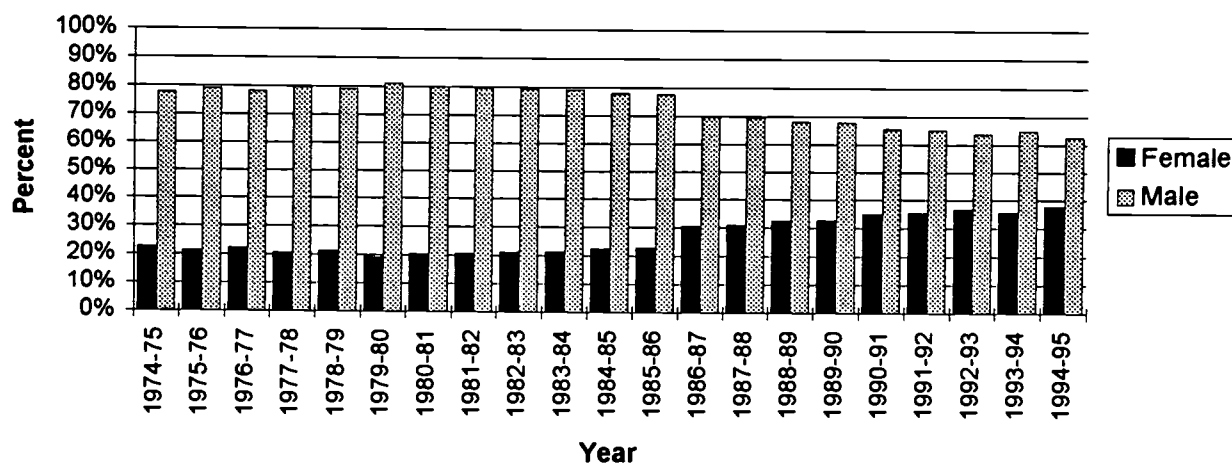

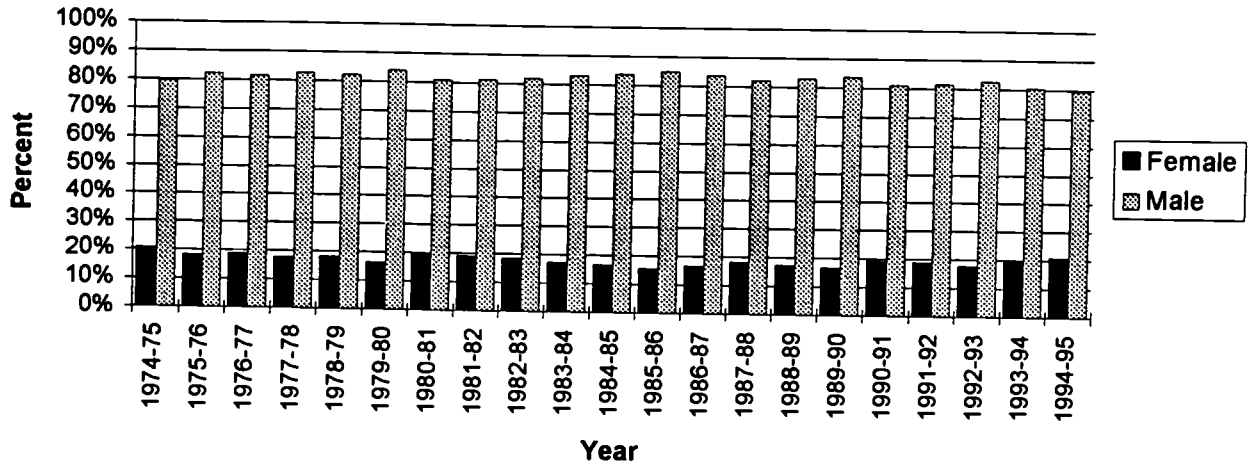

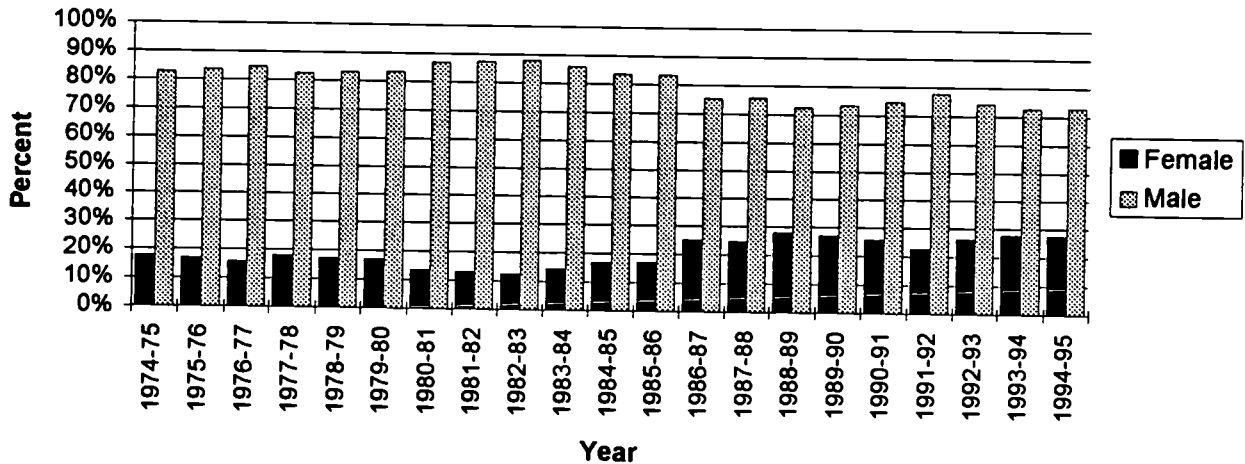

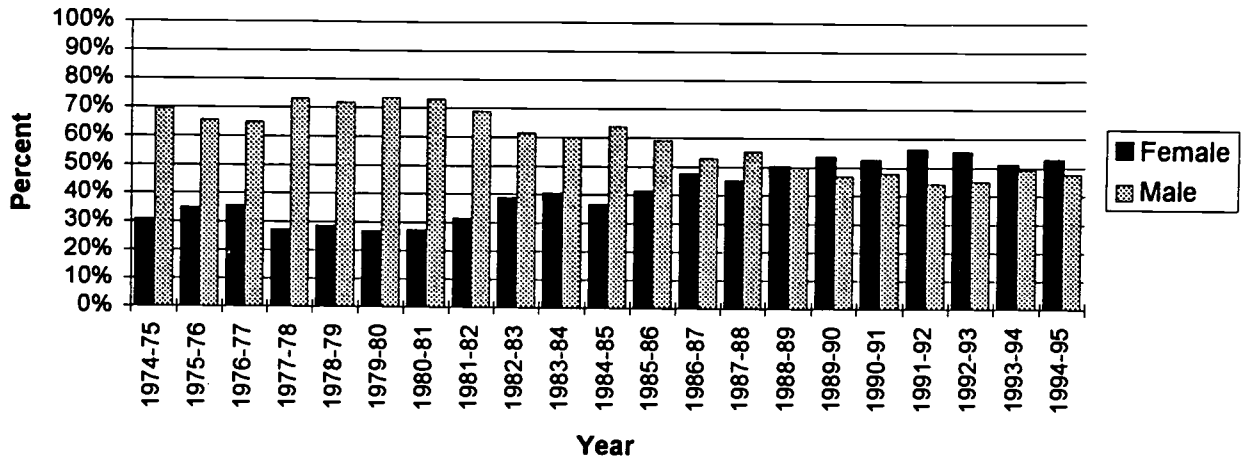

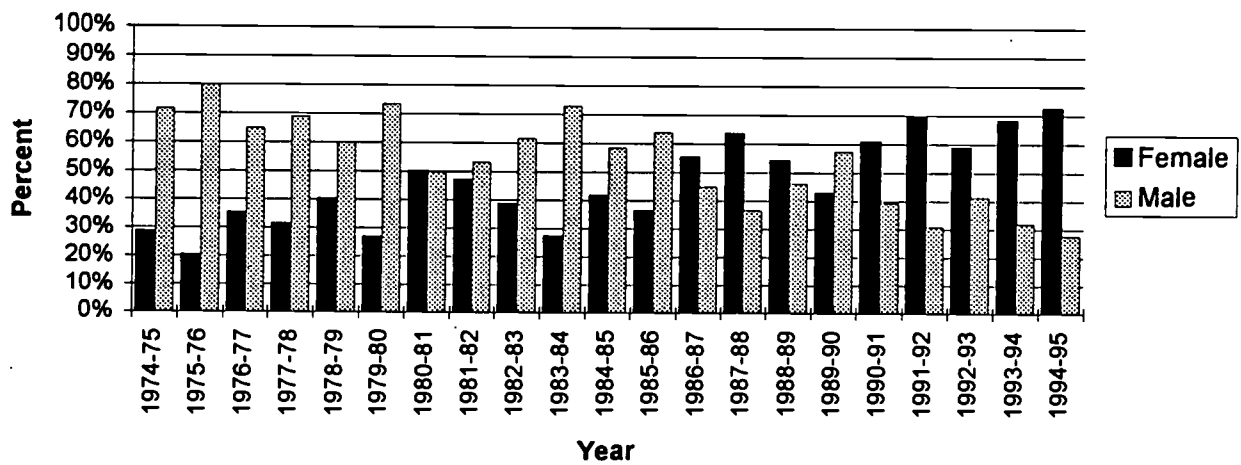
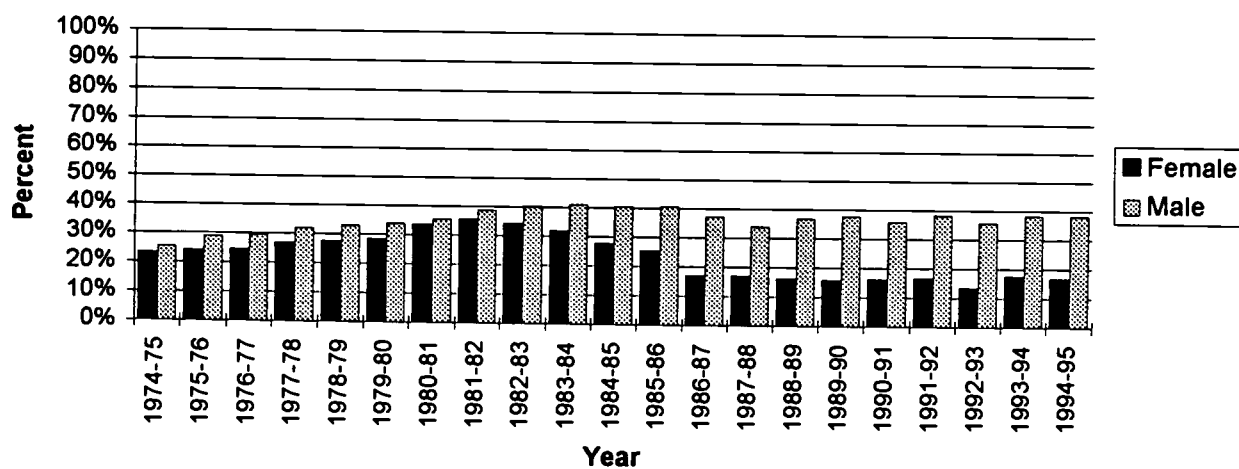

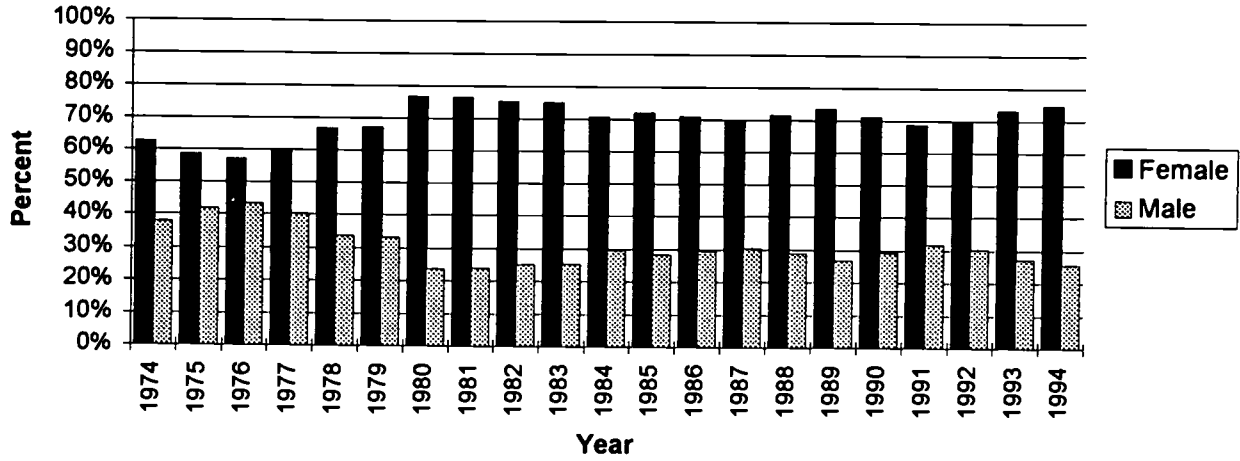

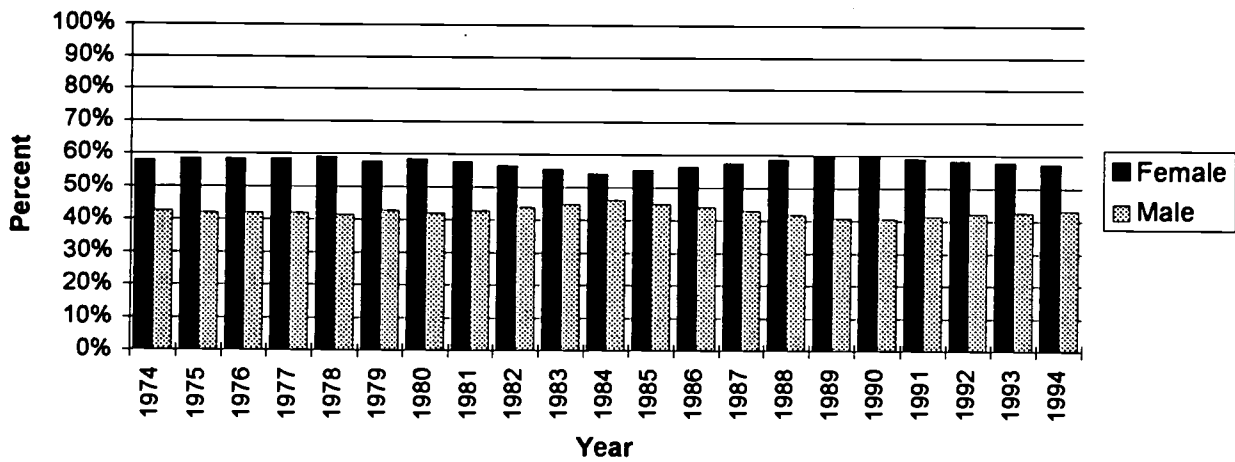
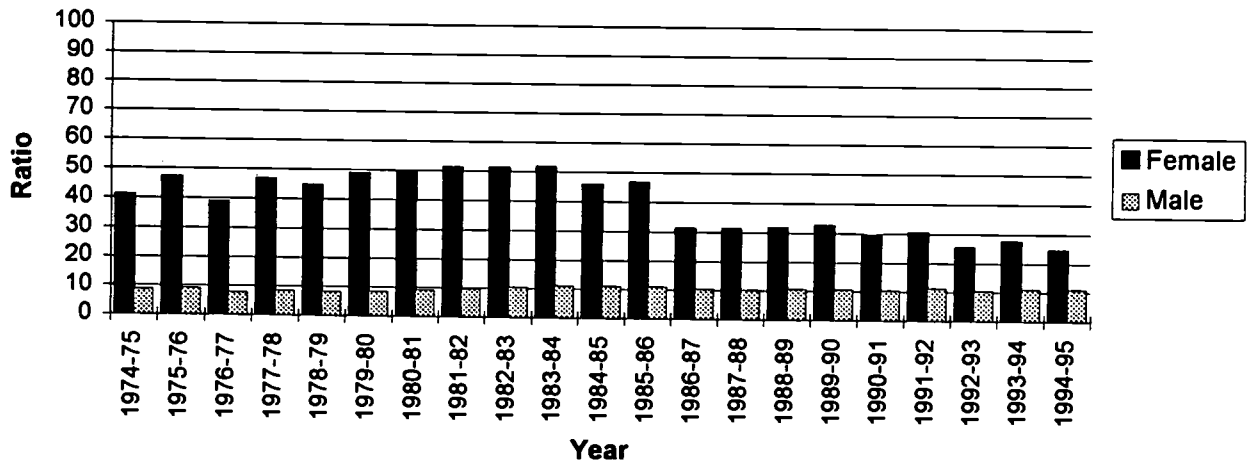

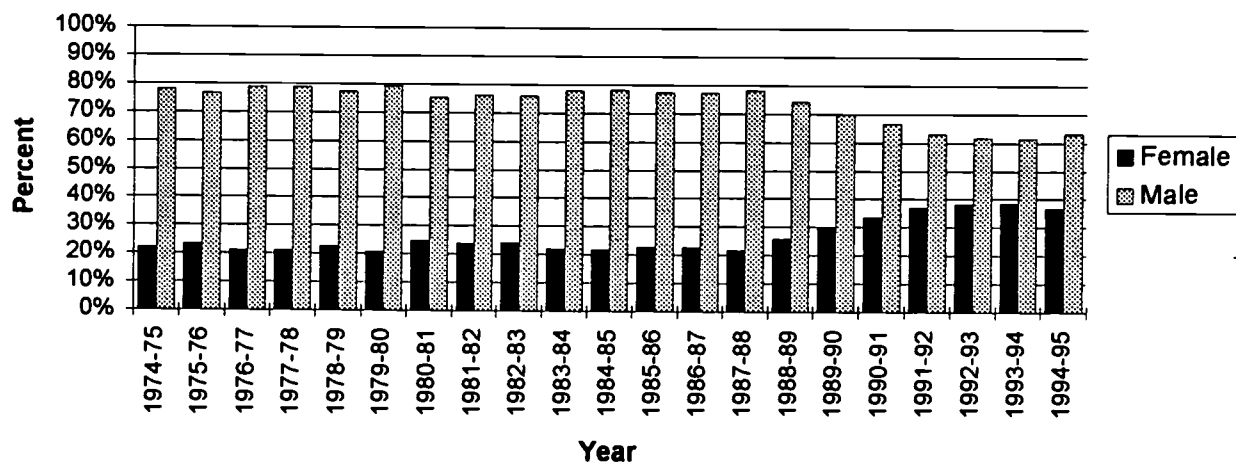

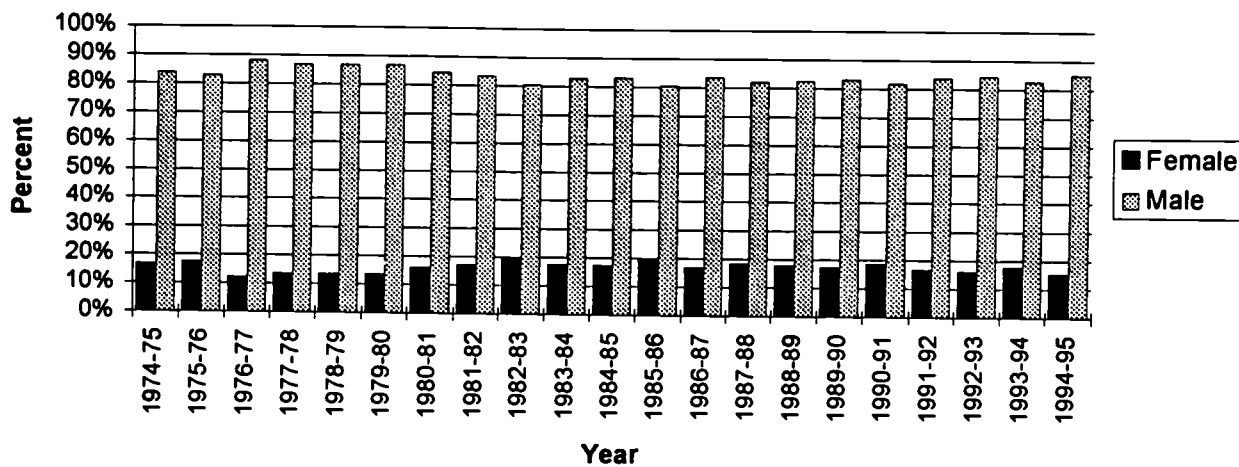

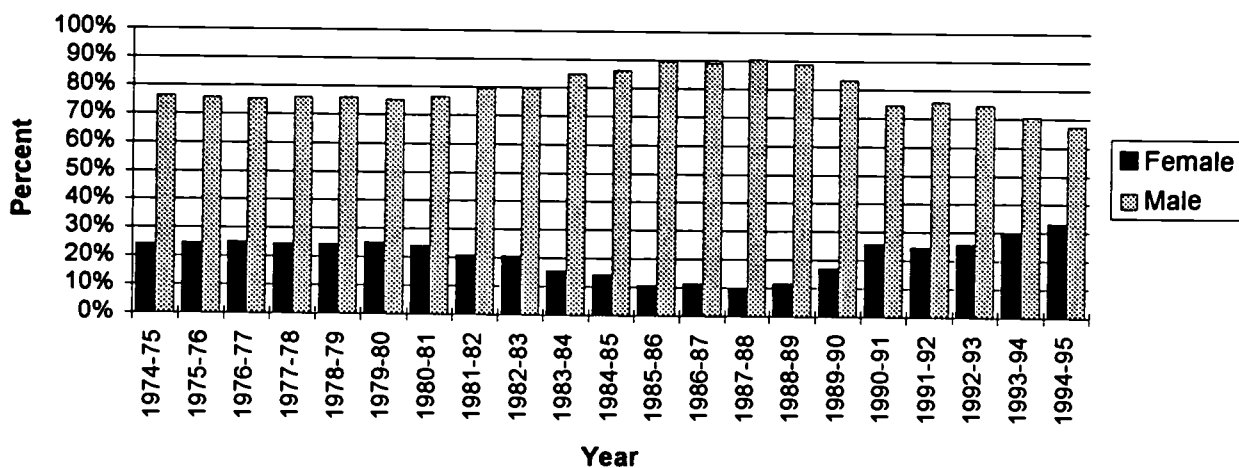

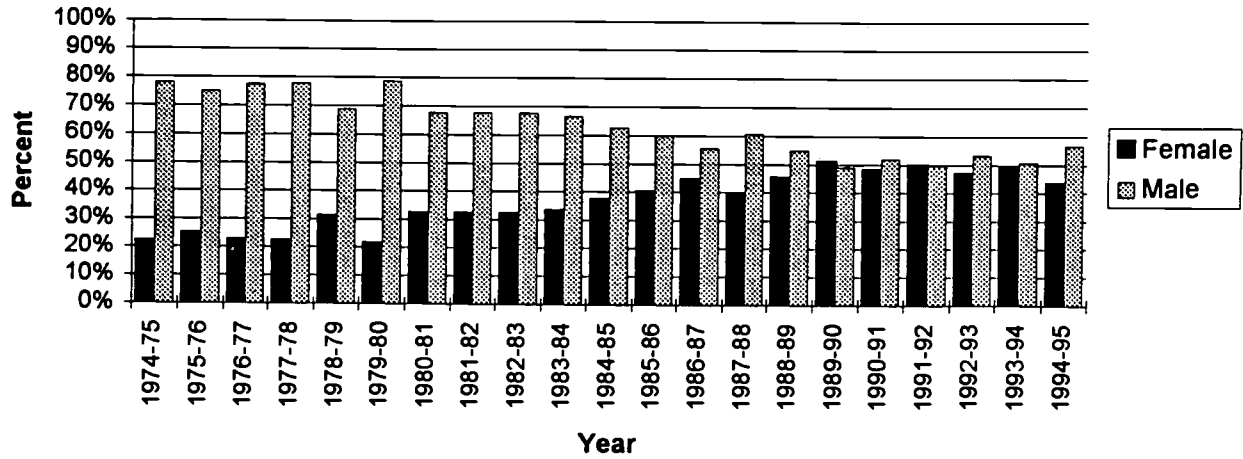

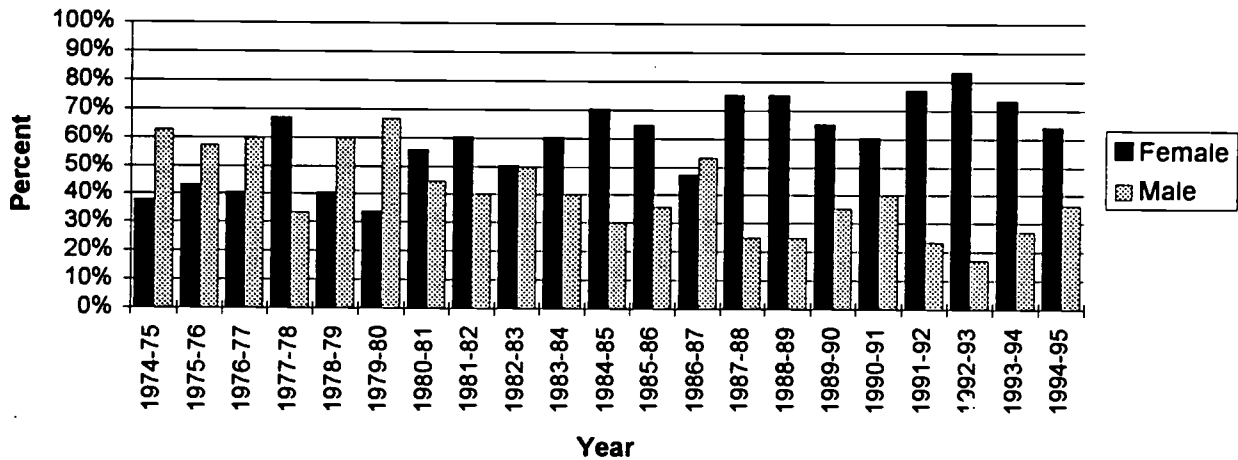
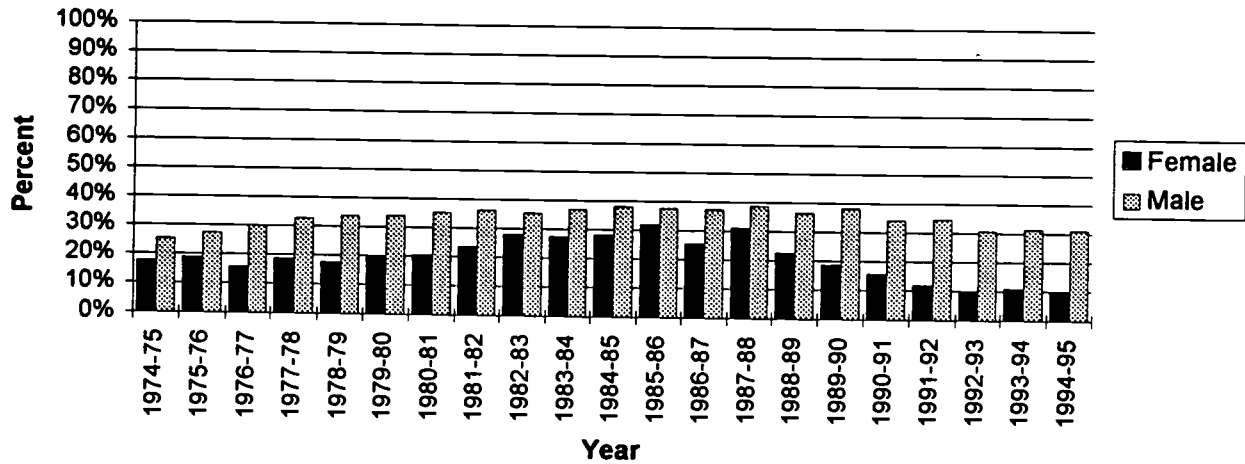

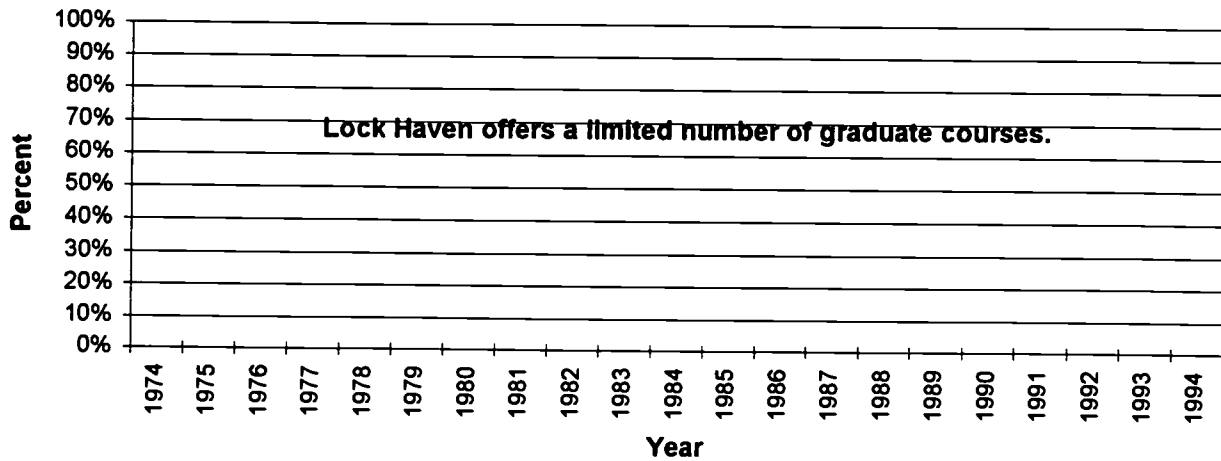

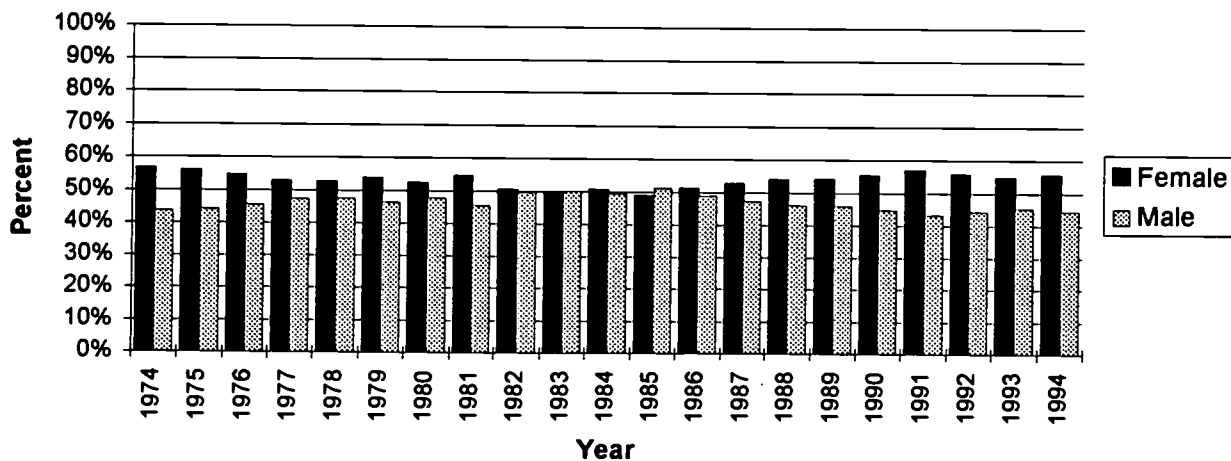
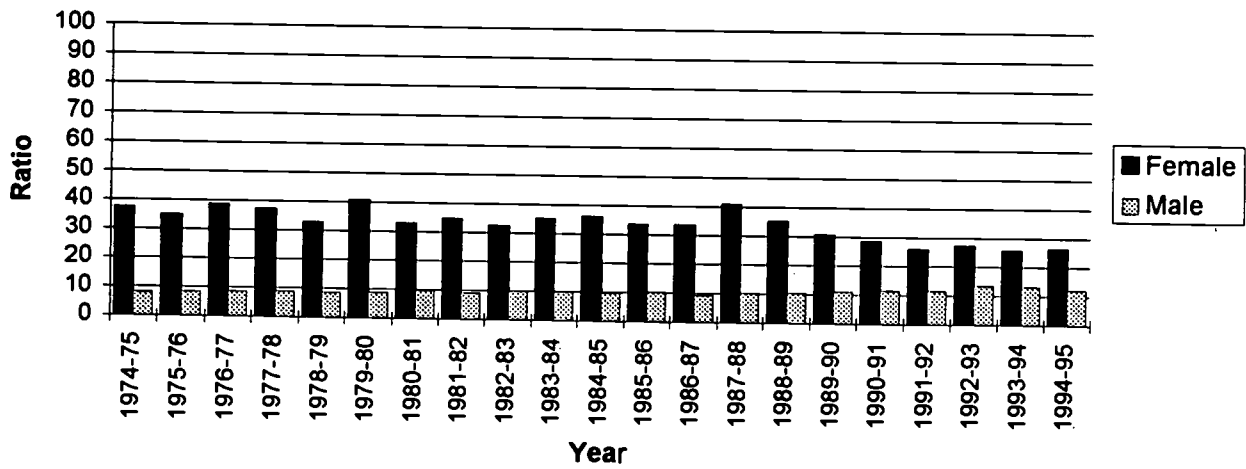

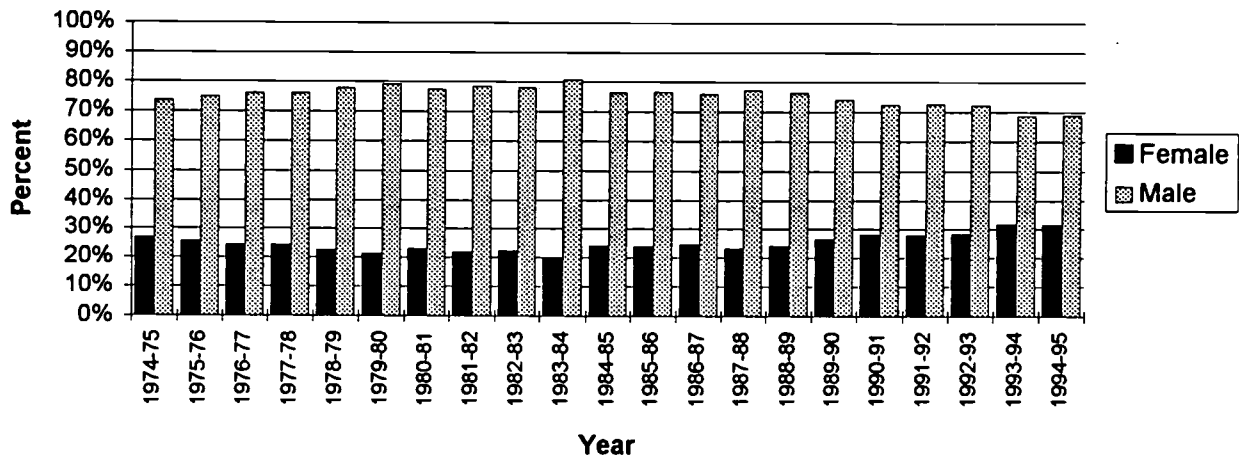

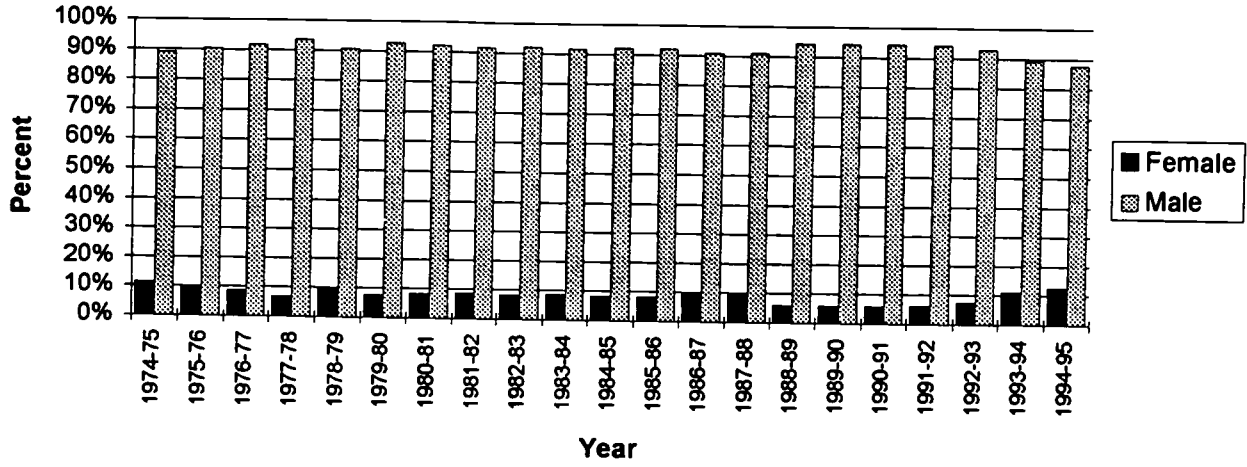

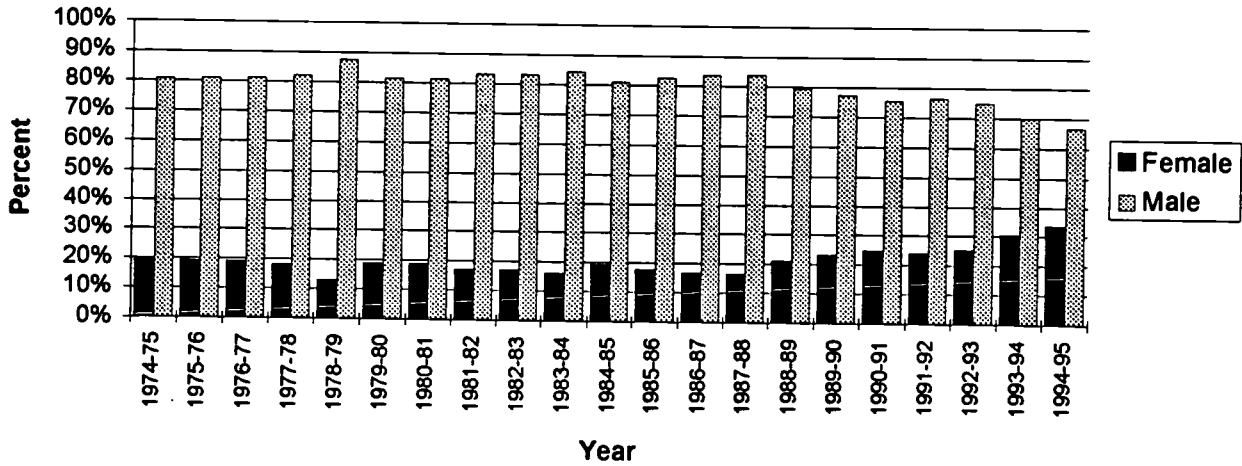

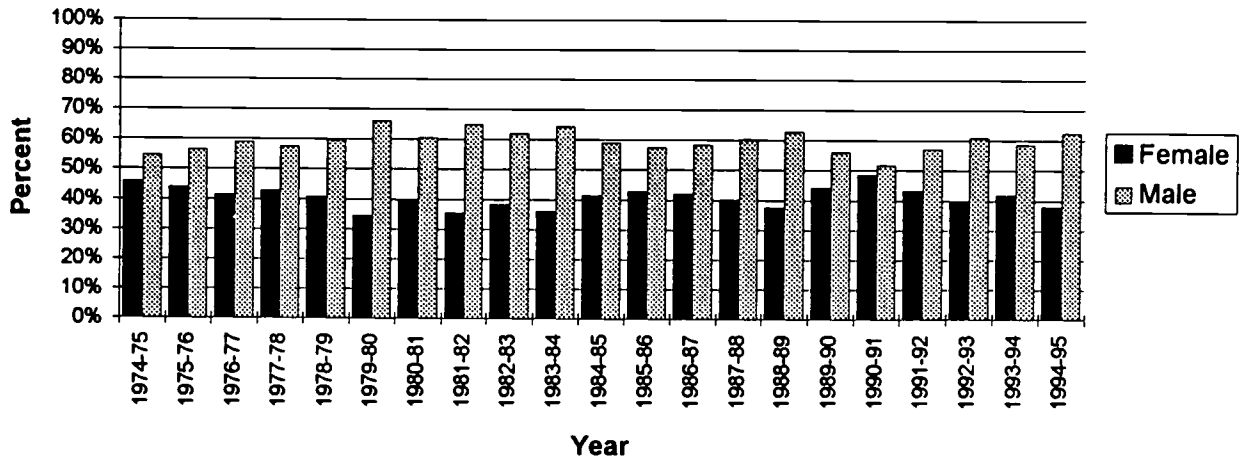

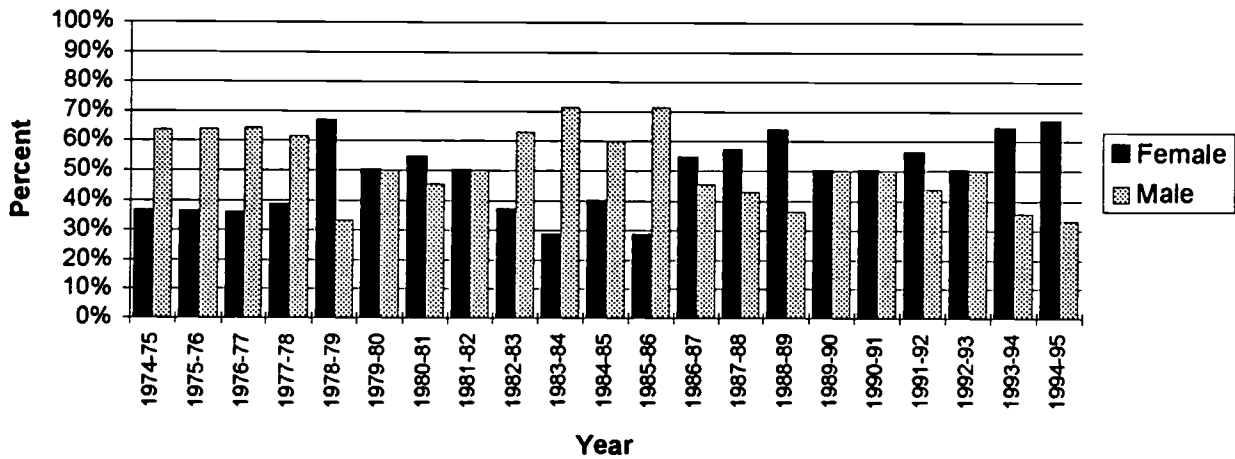
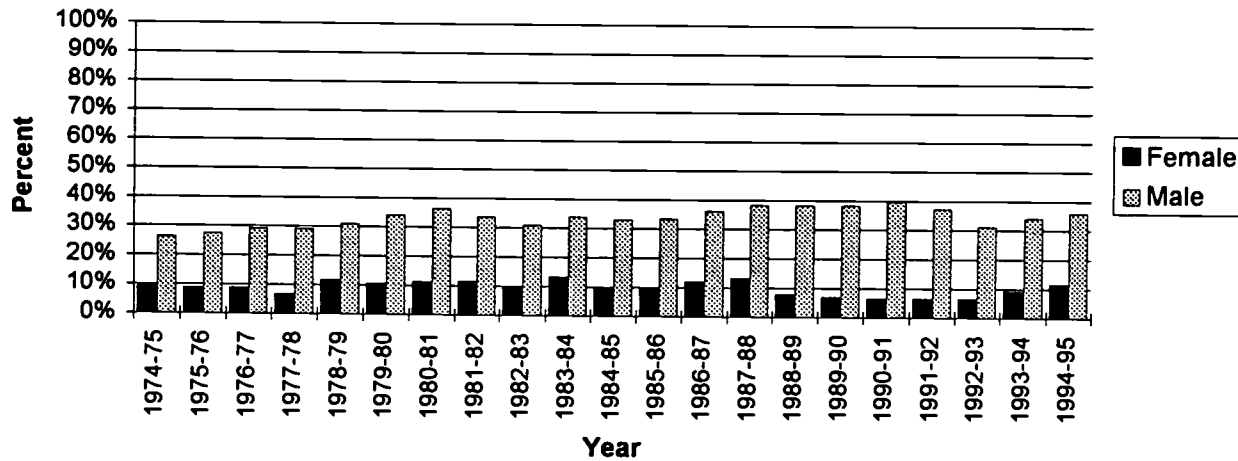

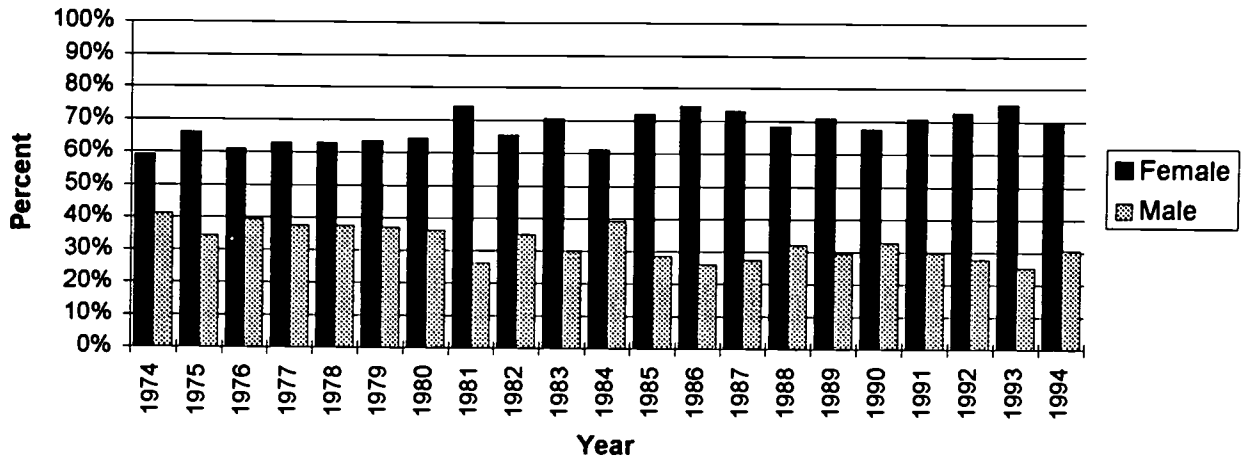

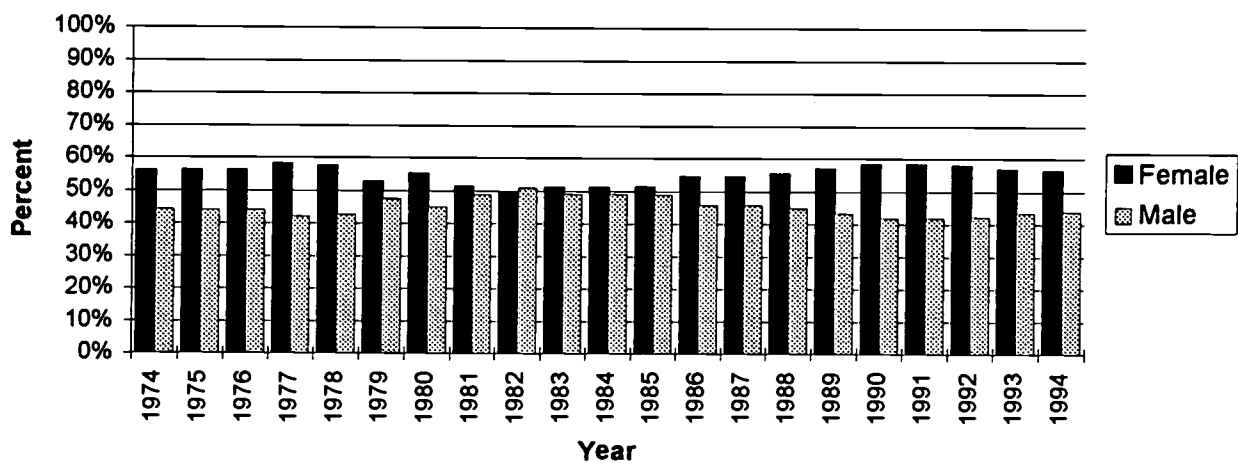
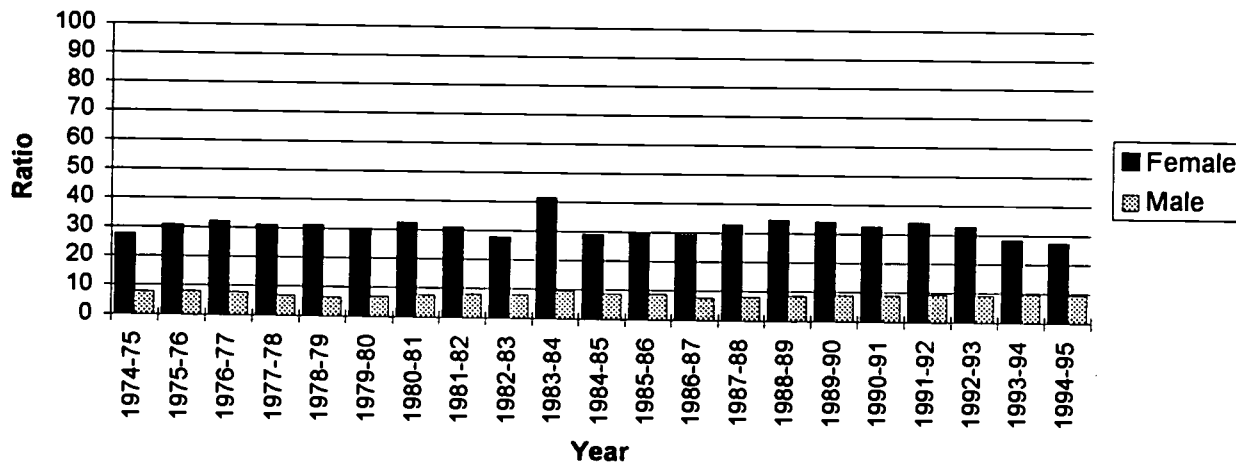

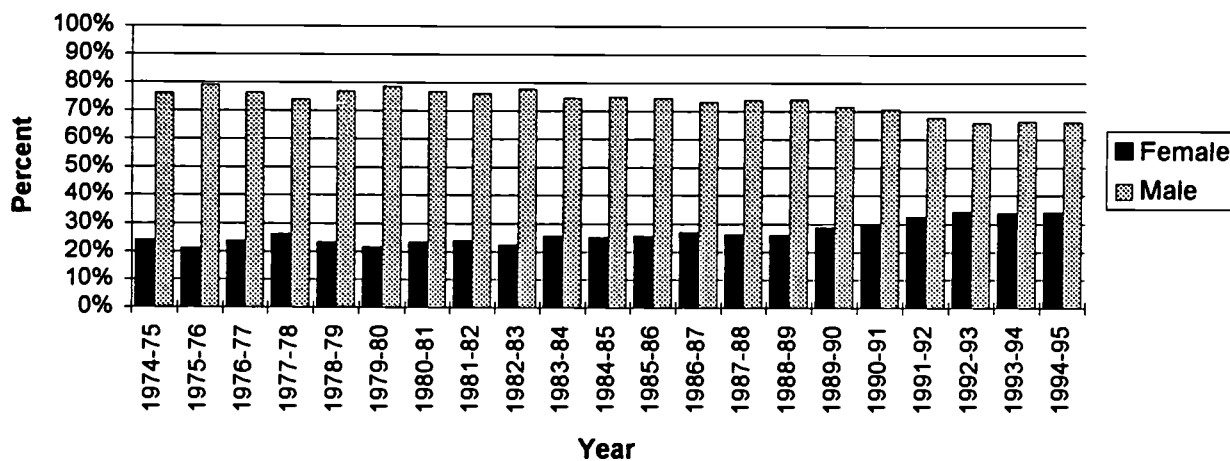

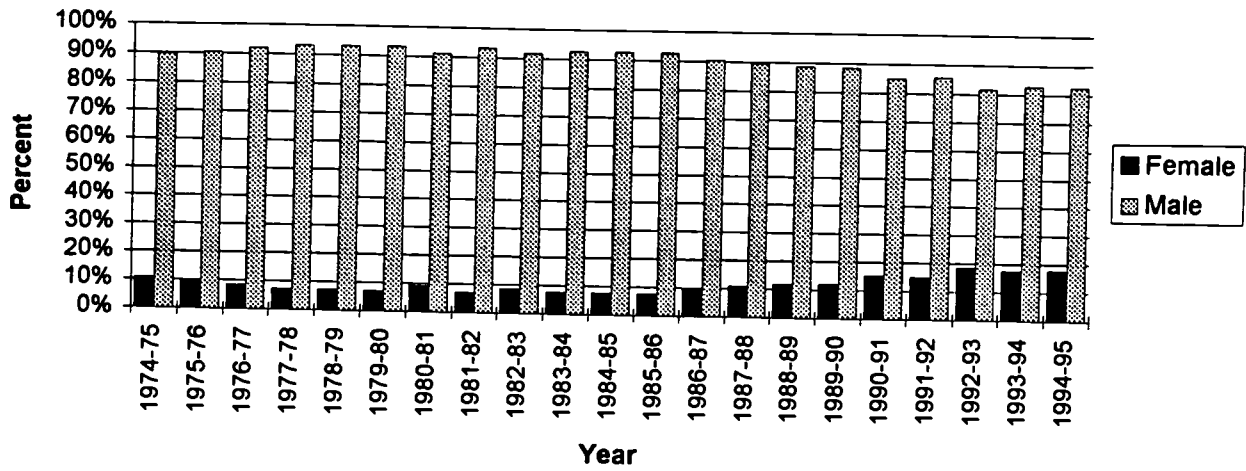

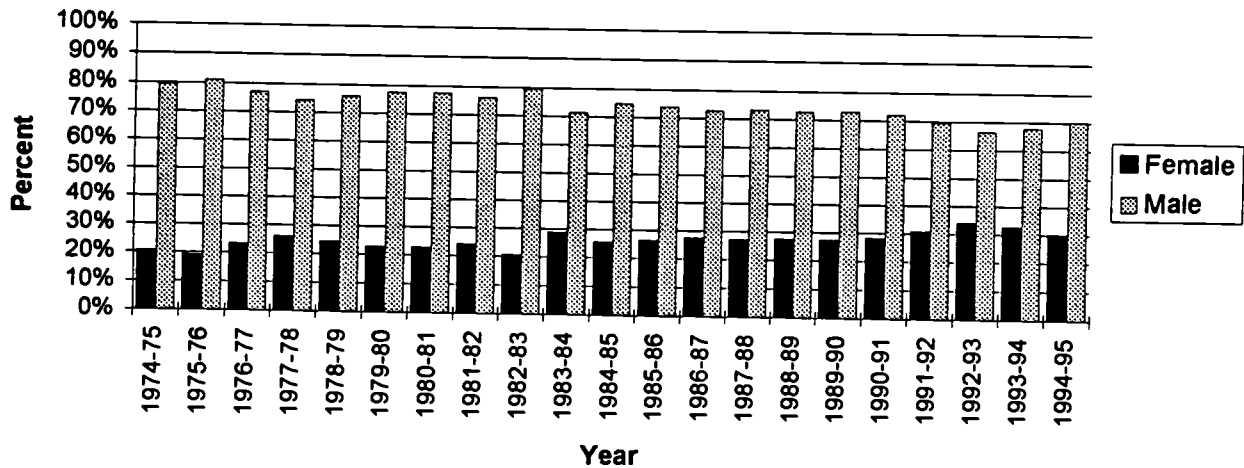

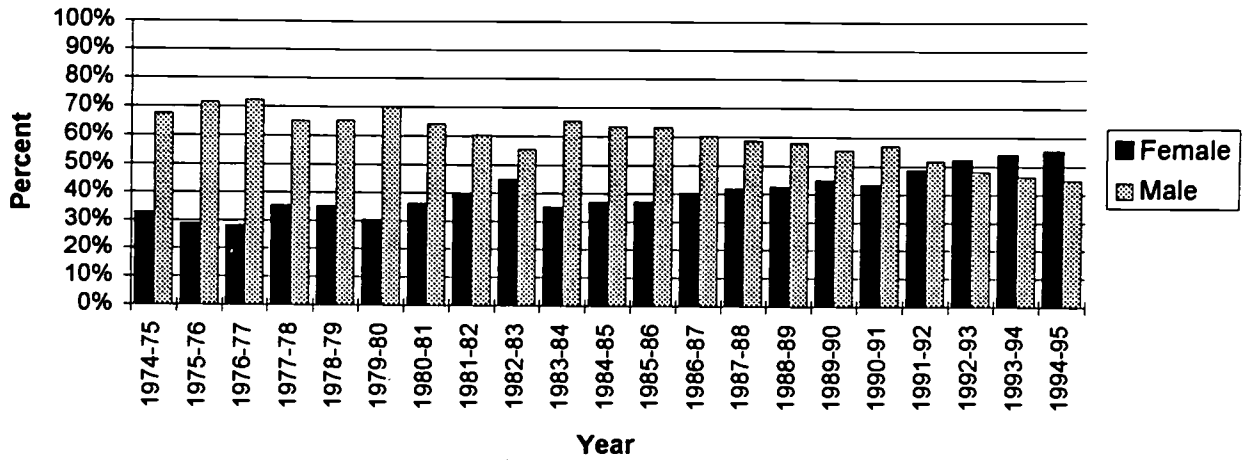

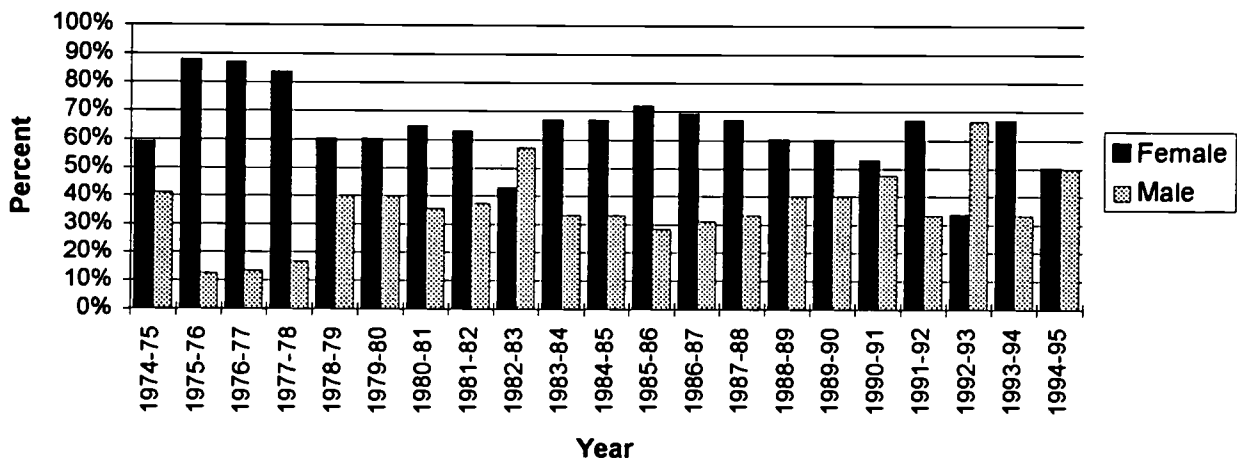
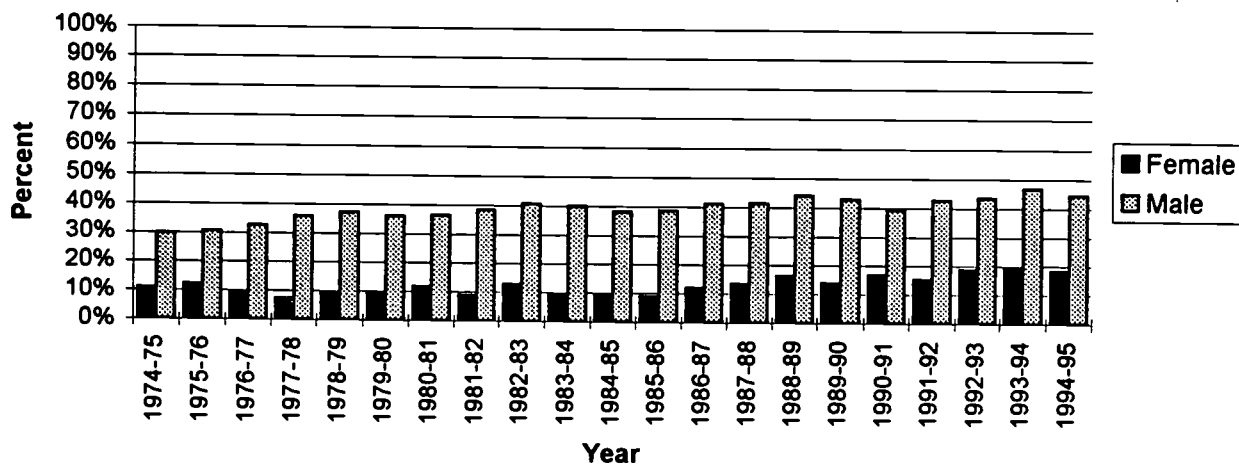

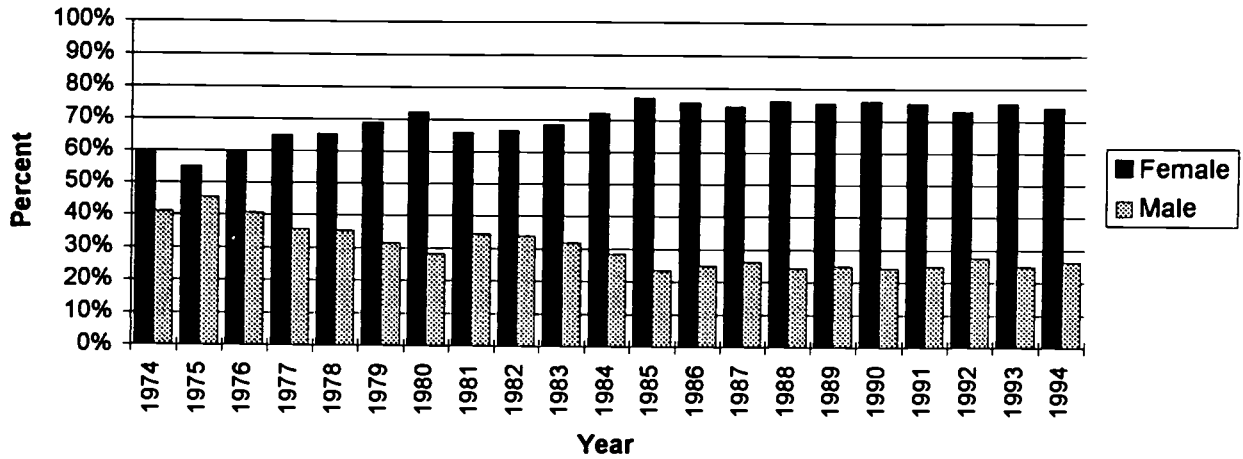

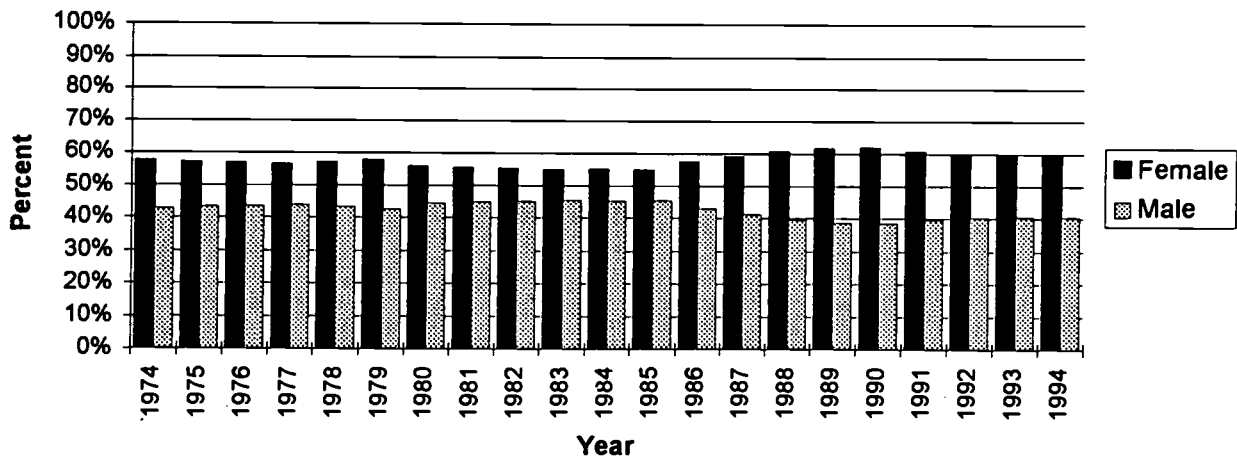
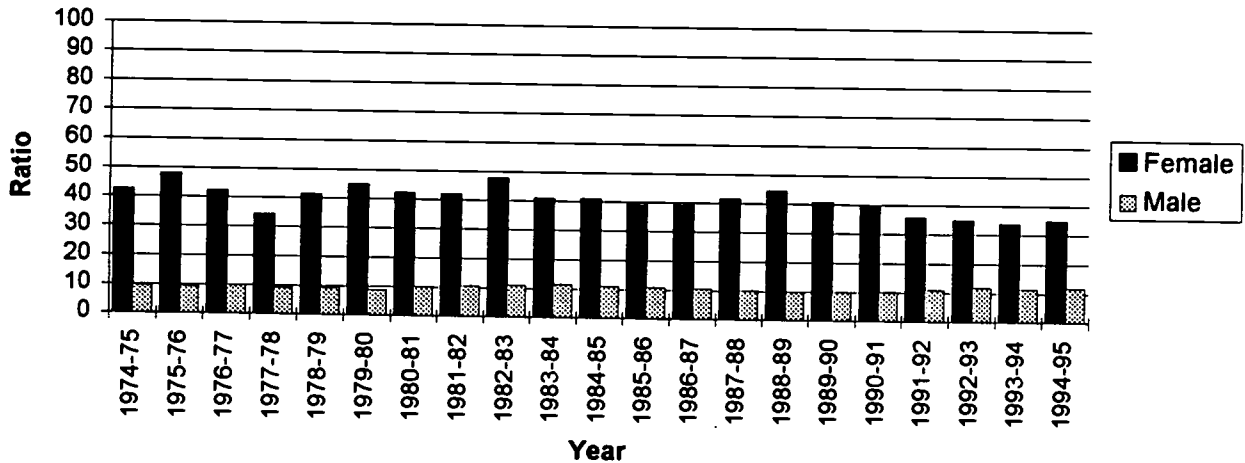

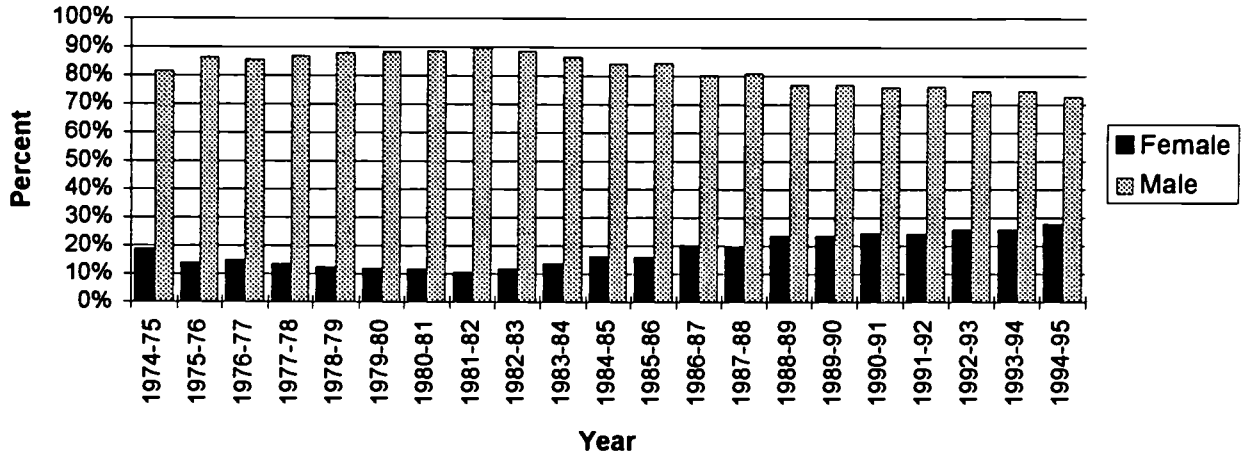

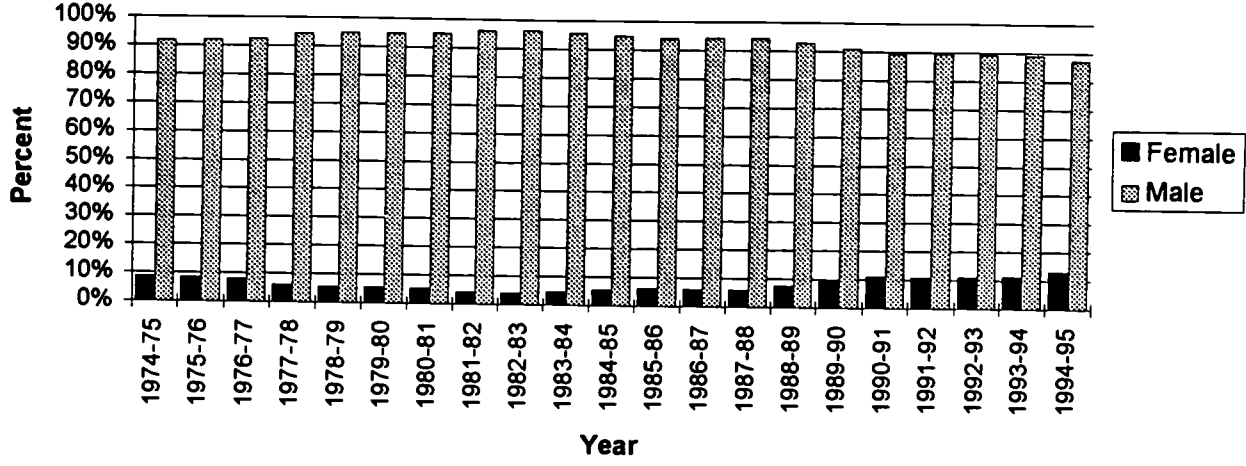

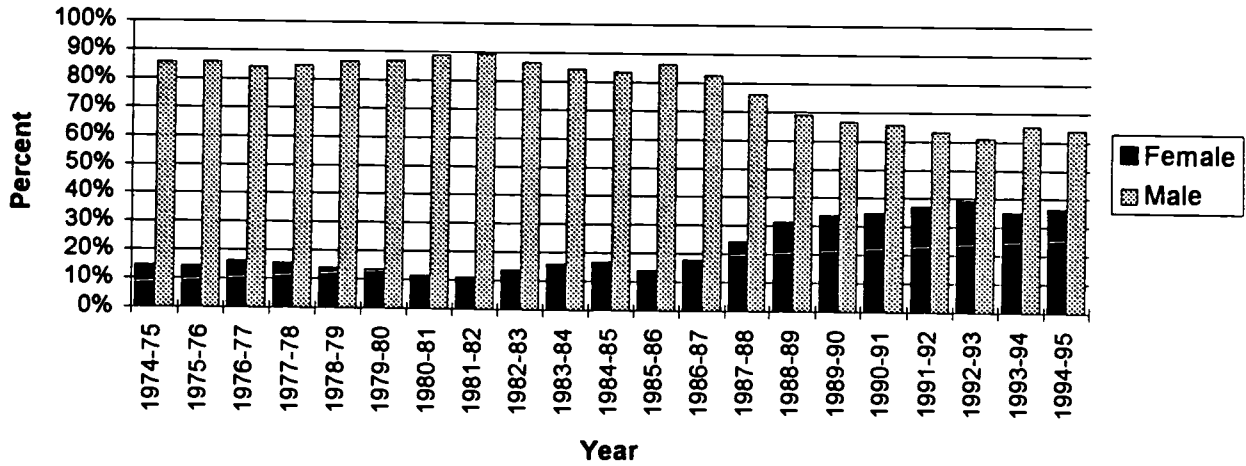

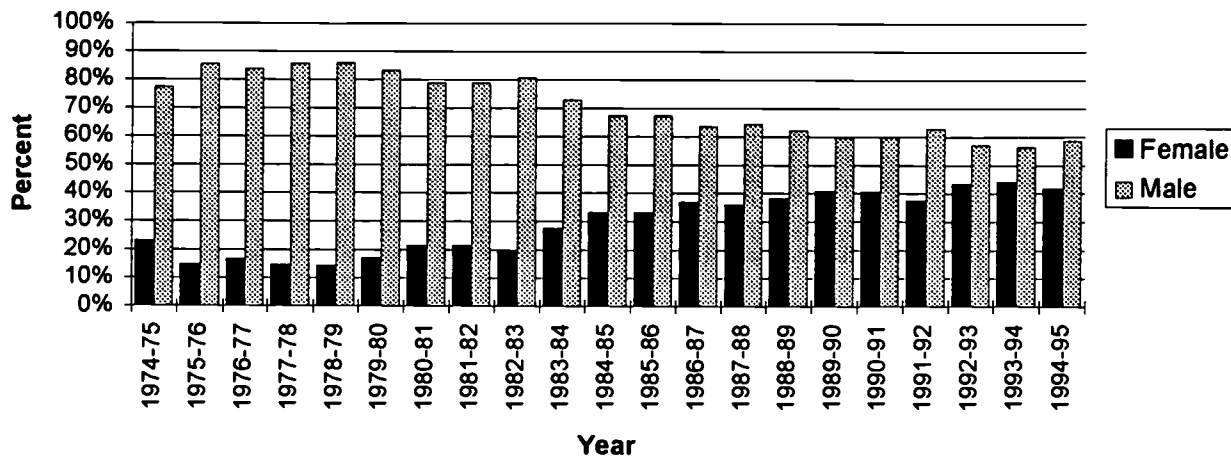

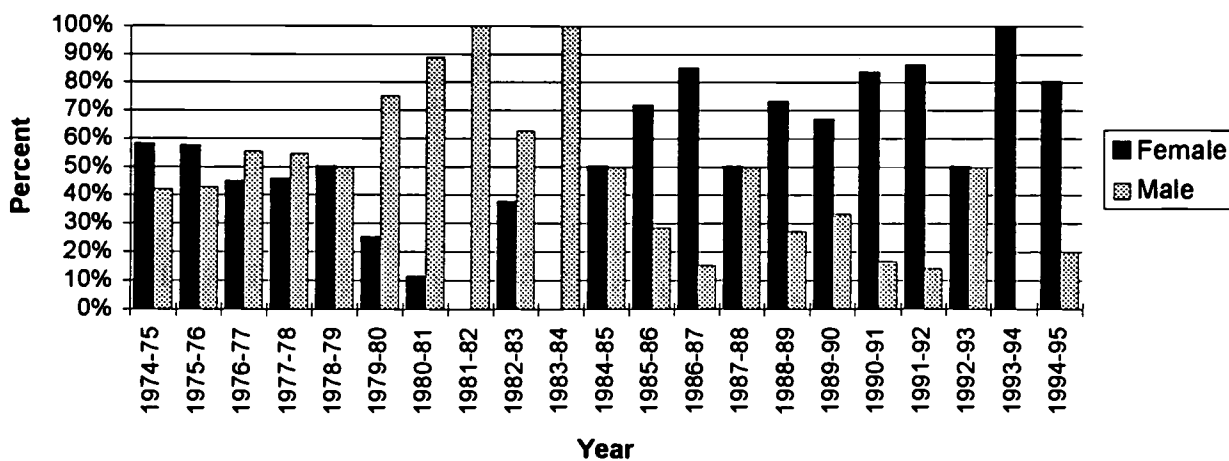
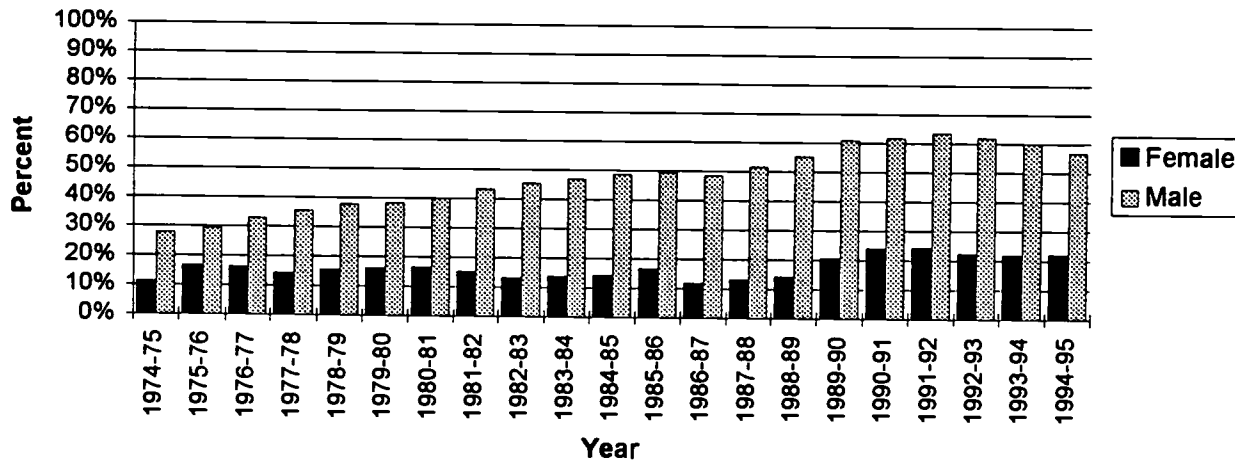

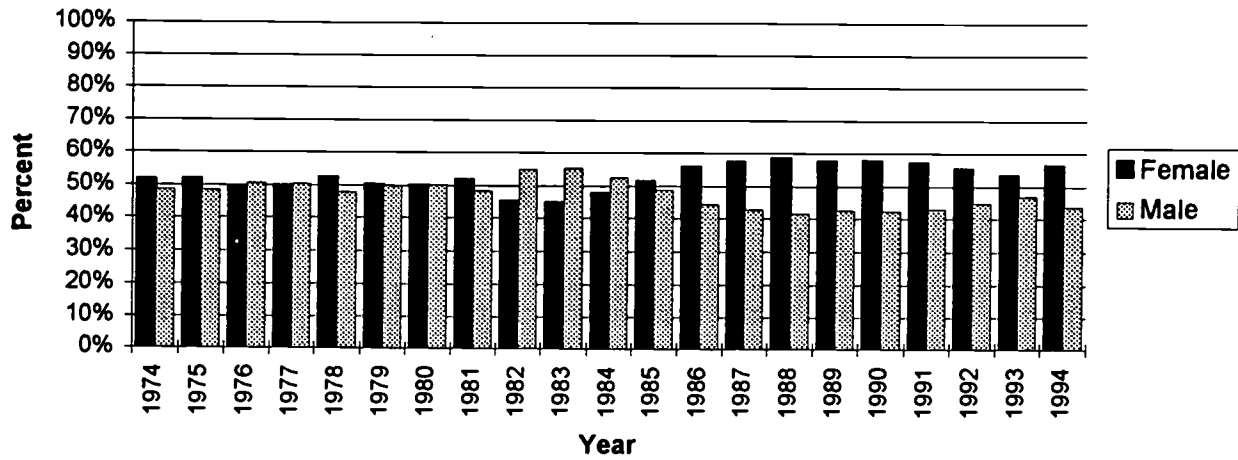

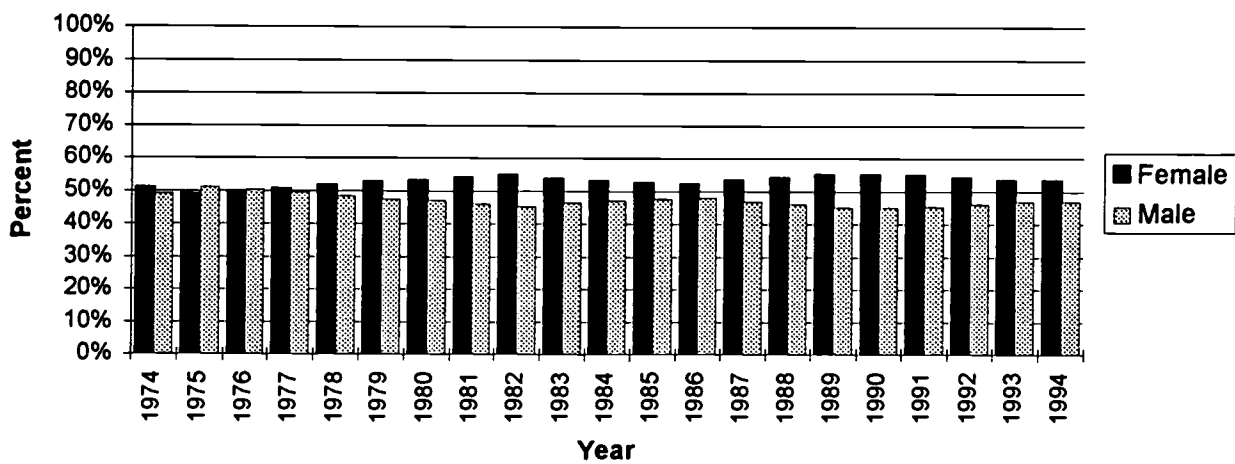
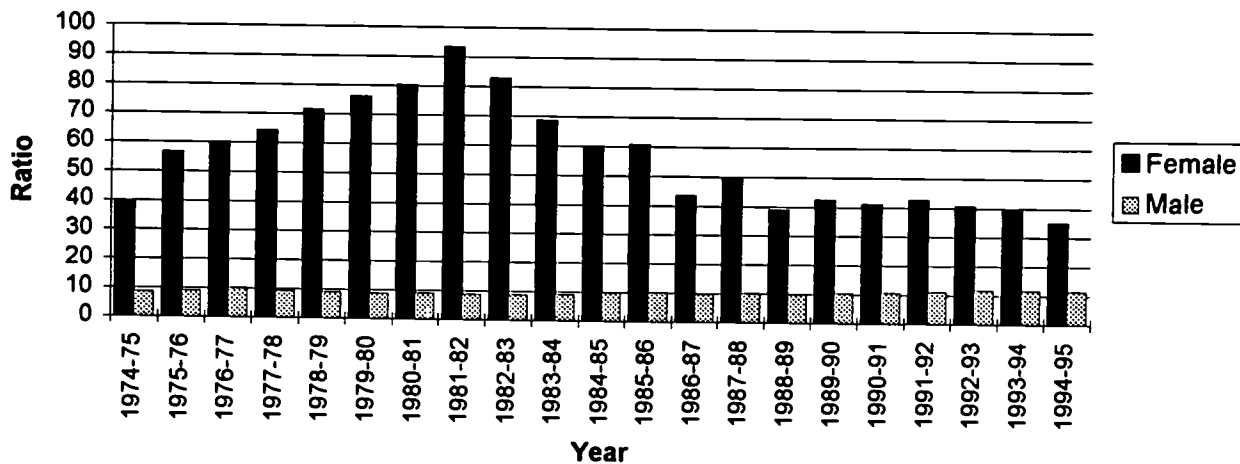

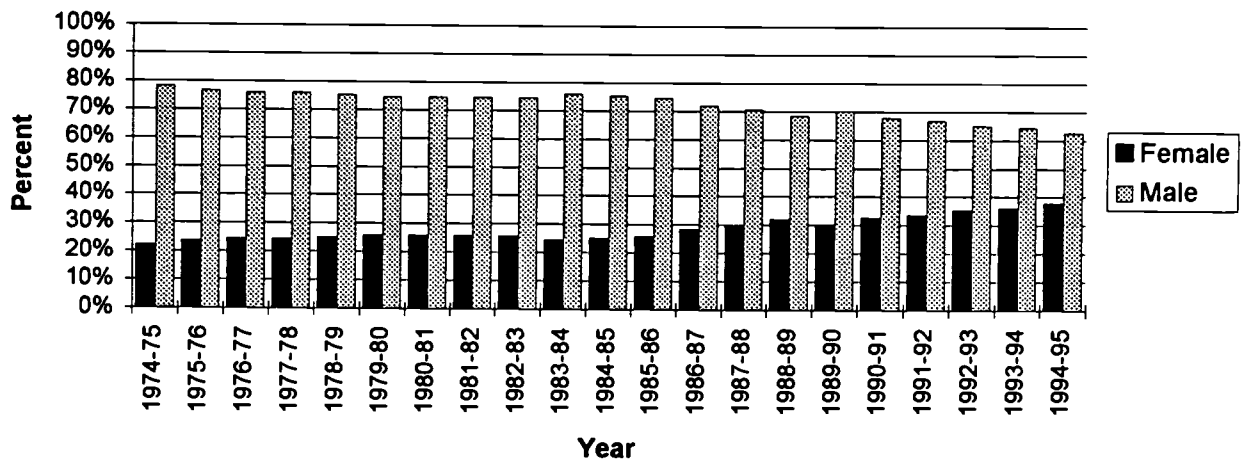

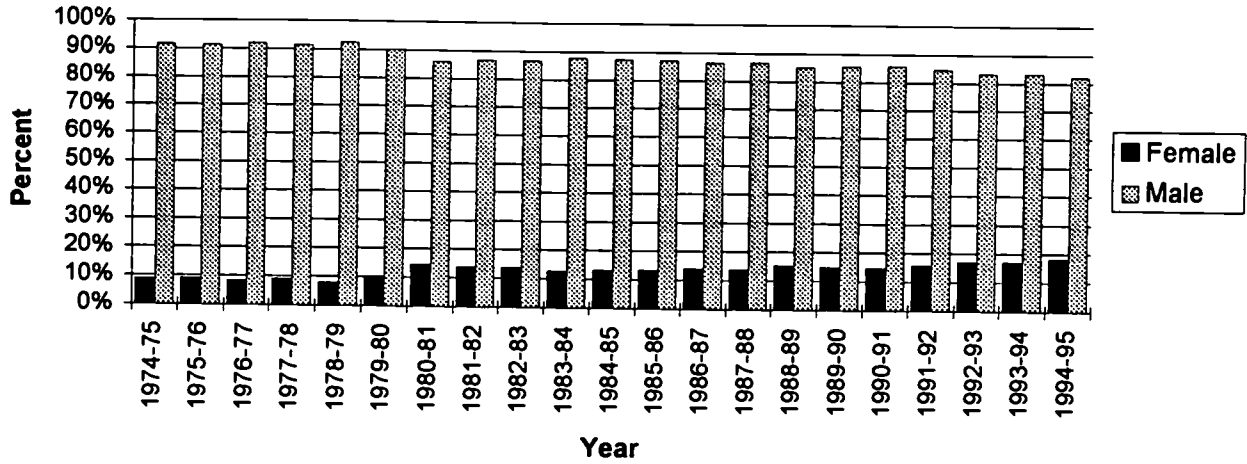

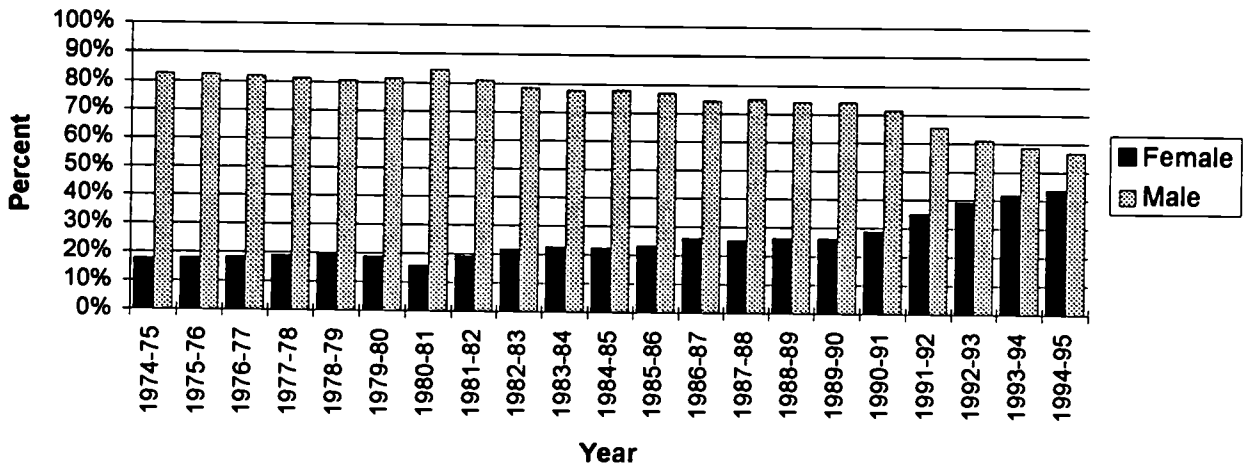

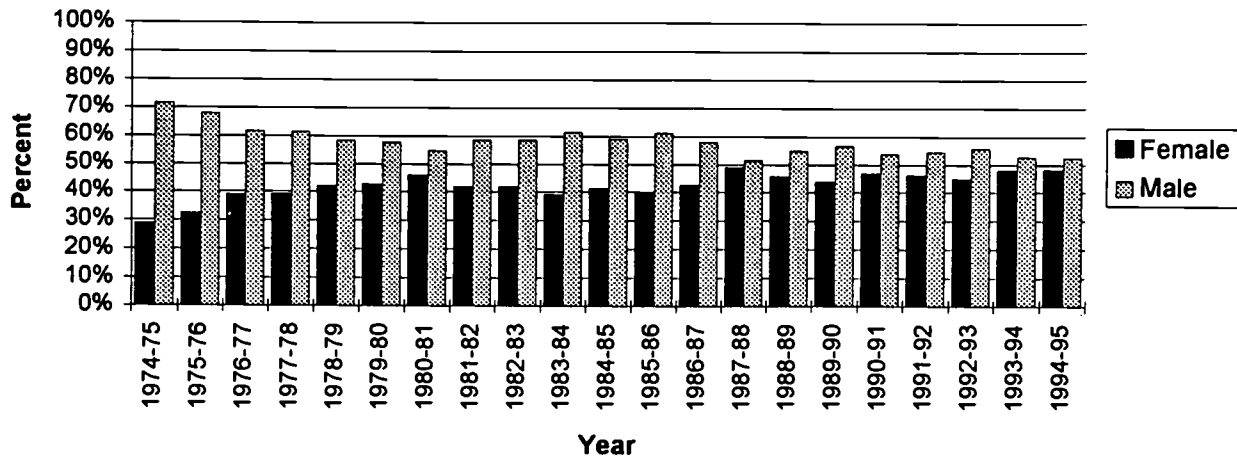

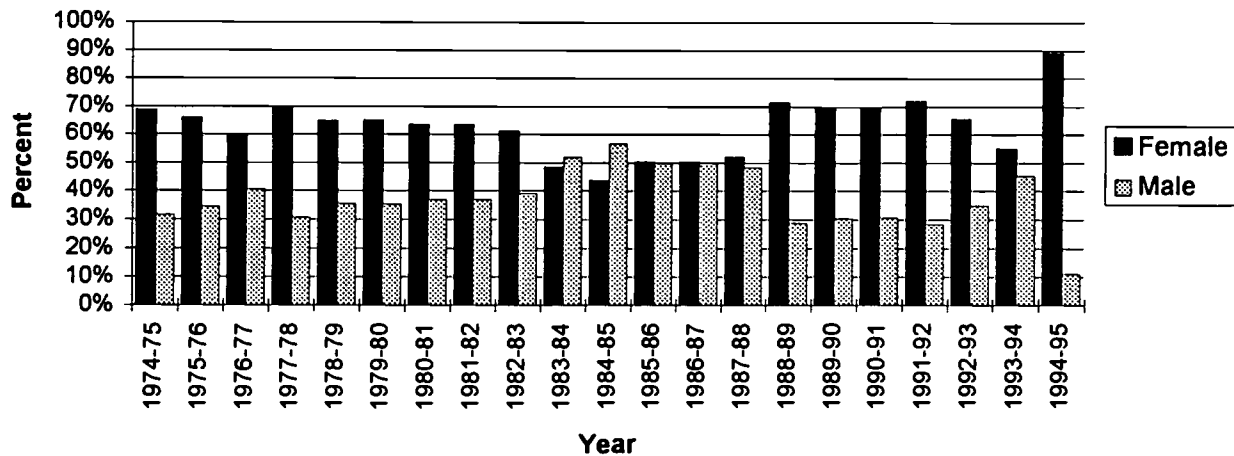
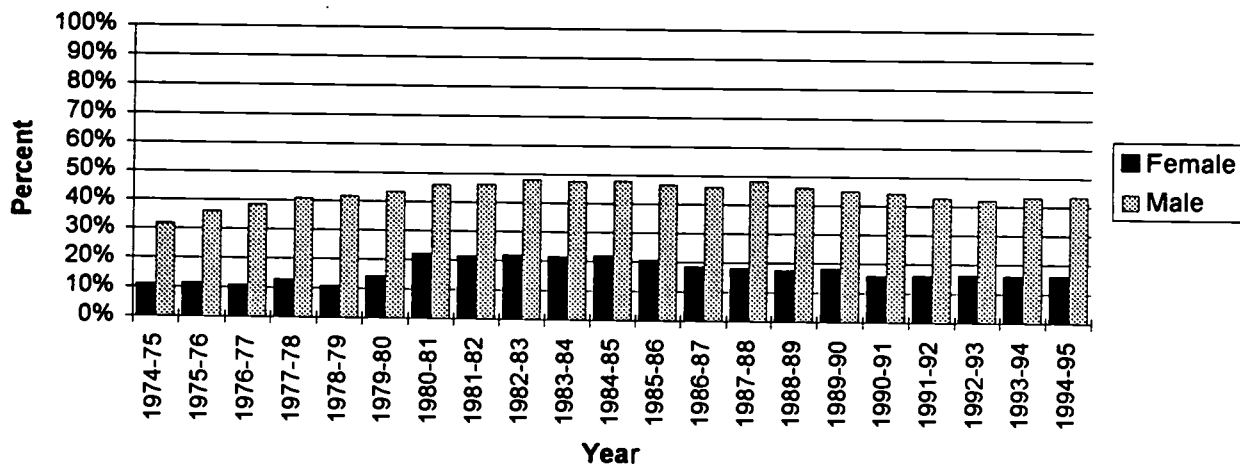

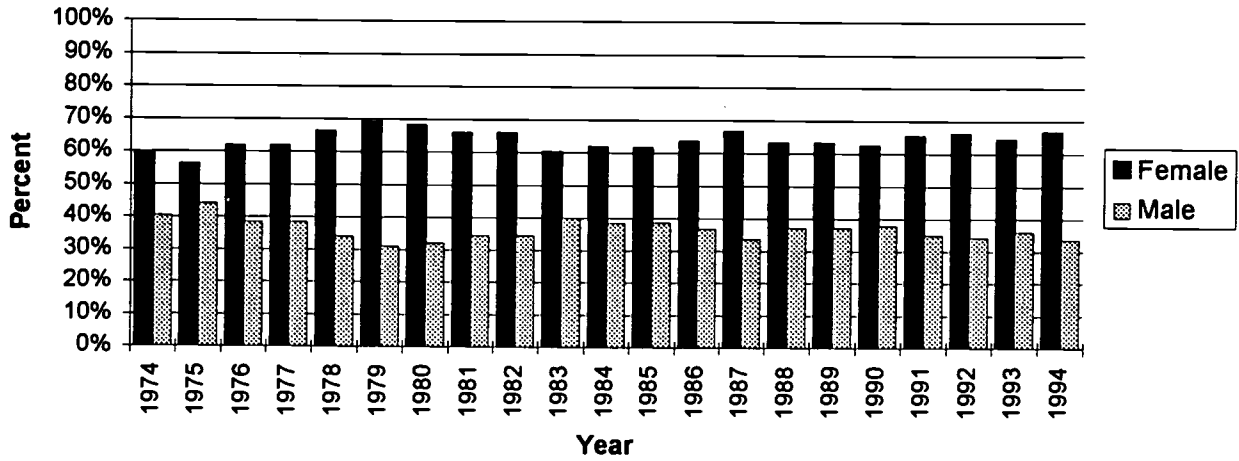

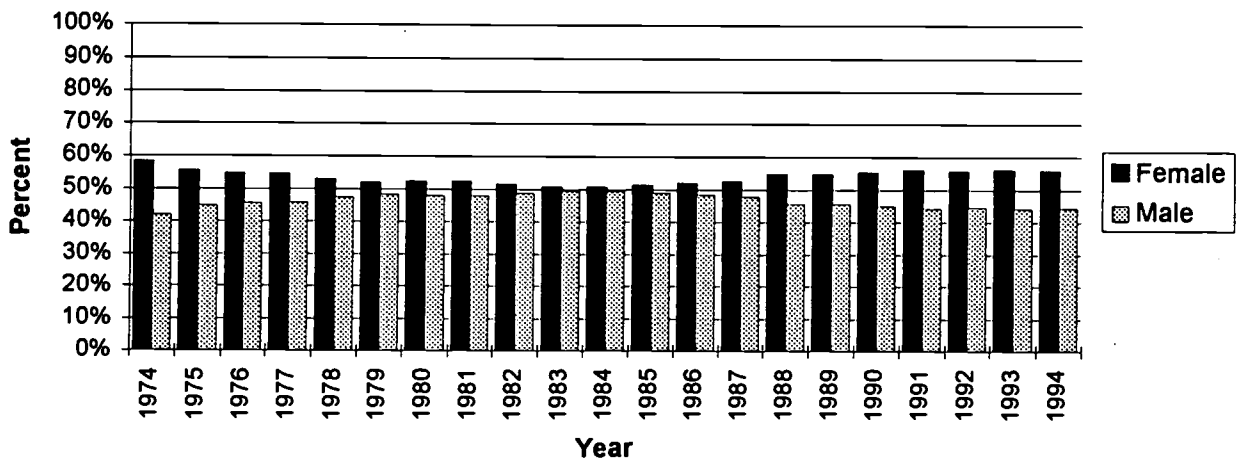
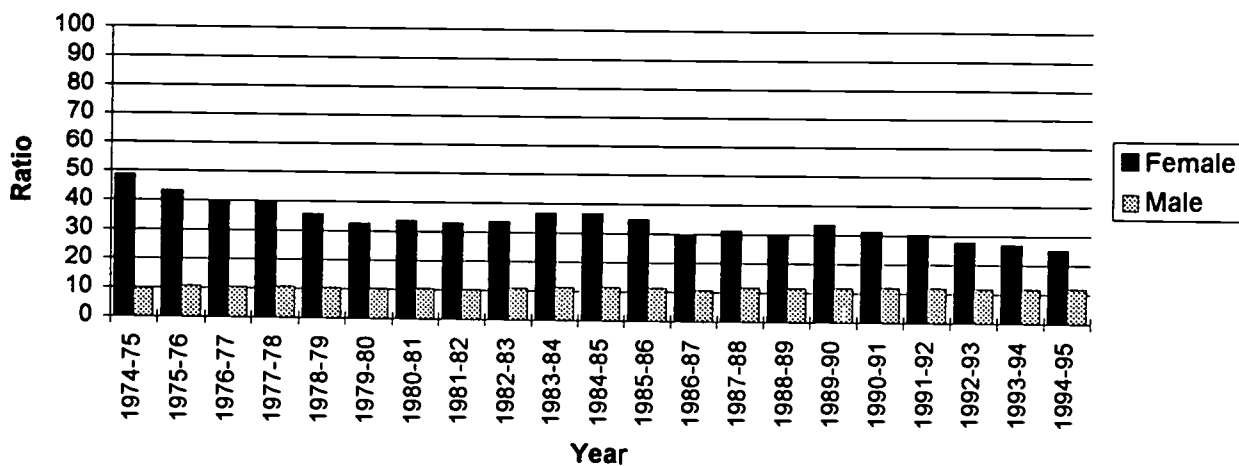

Full-time Total Faculty by Sex, 1974 - 1994

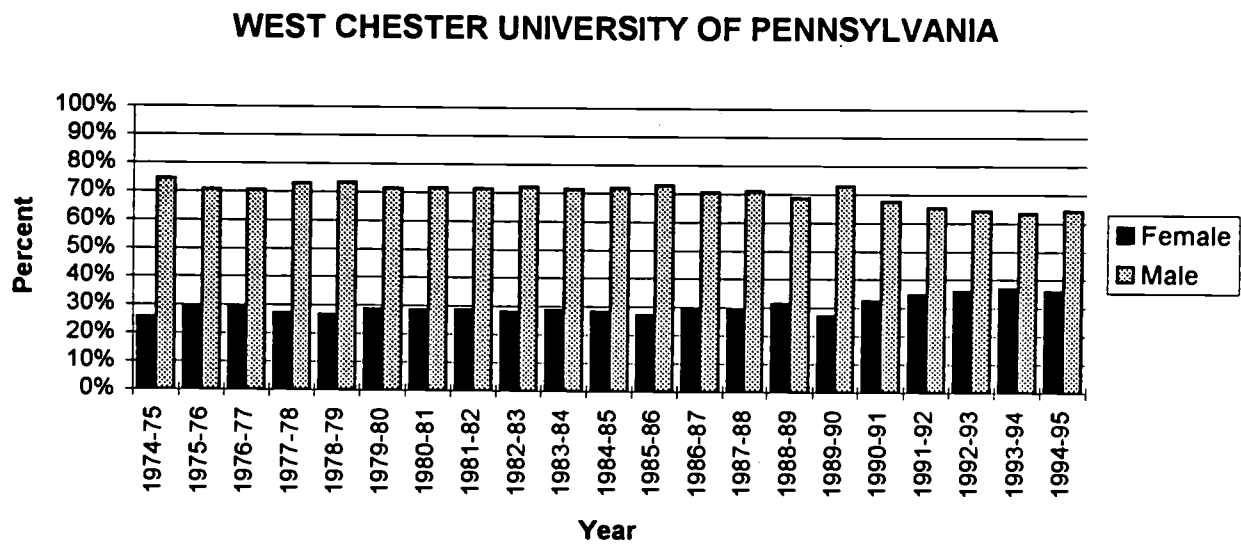

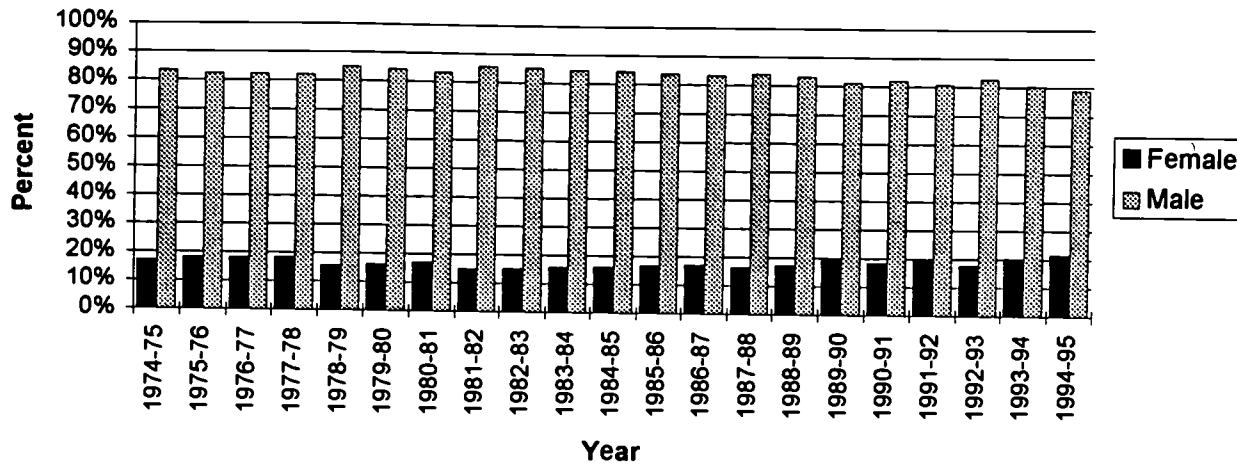

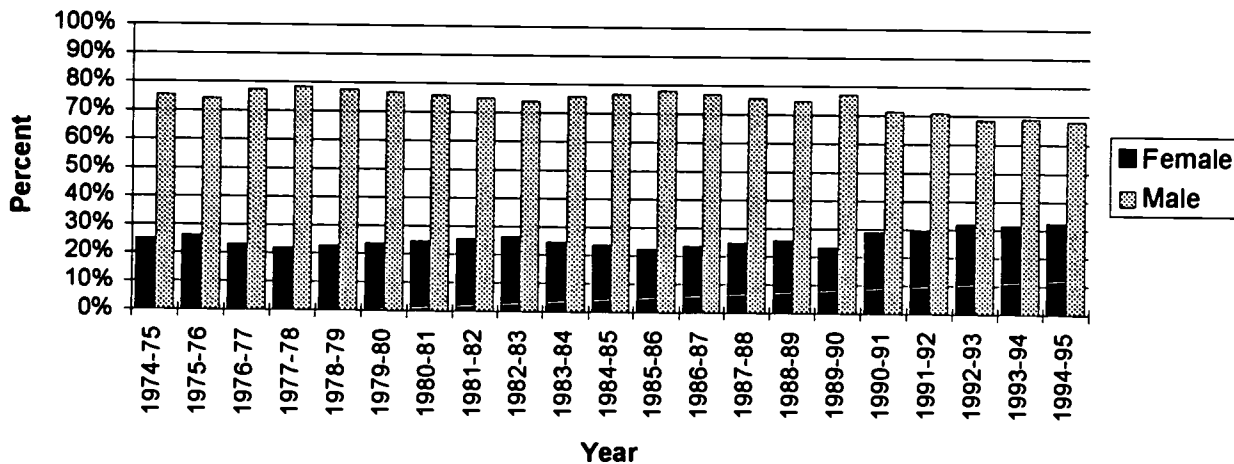

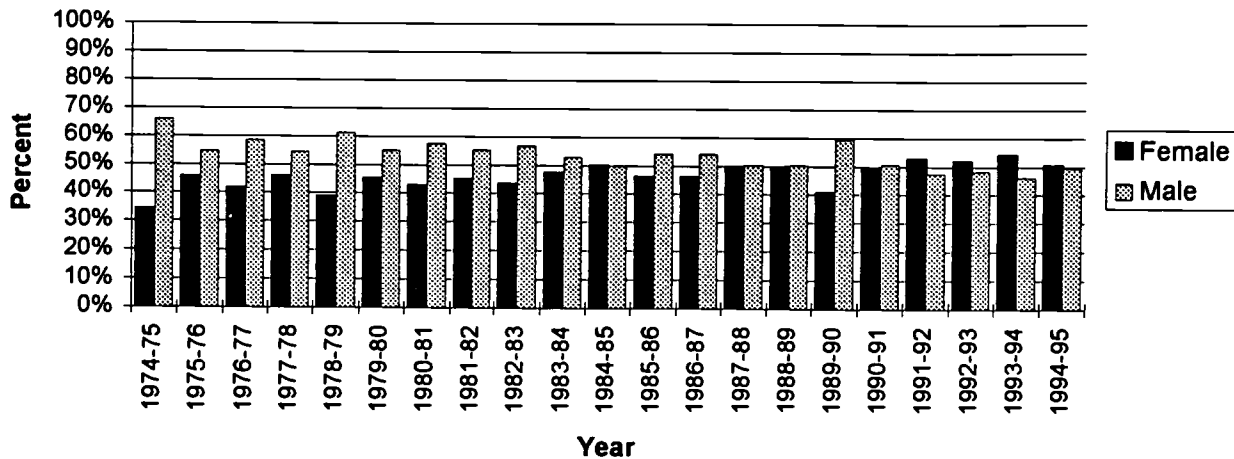

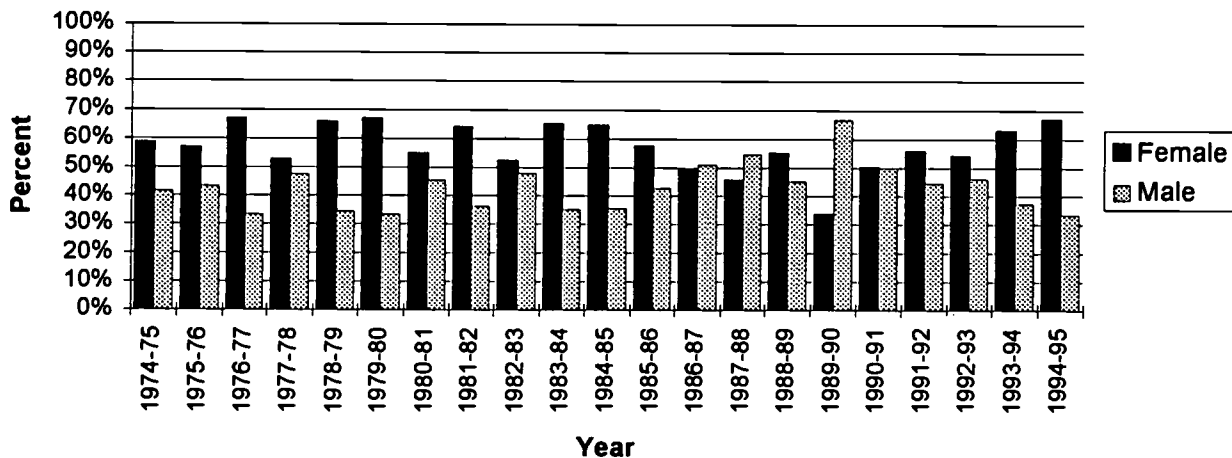
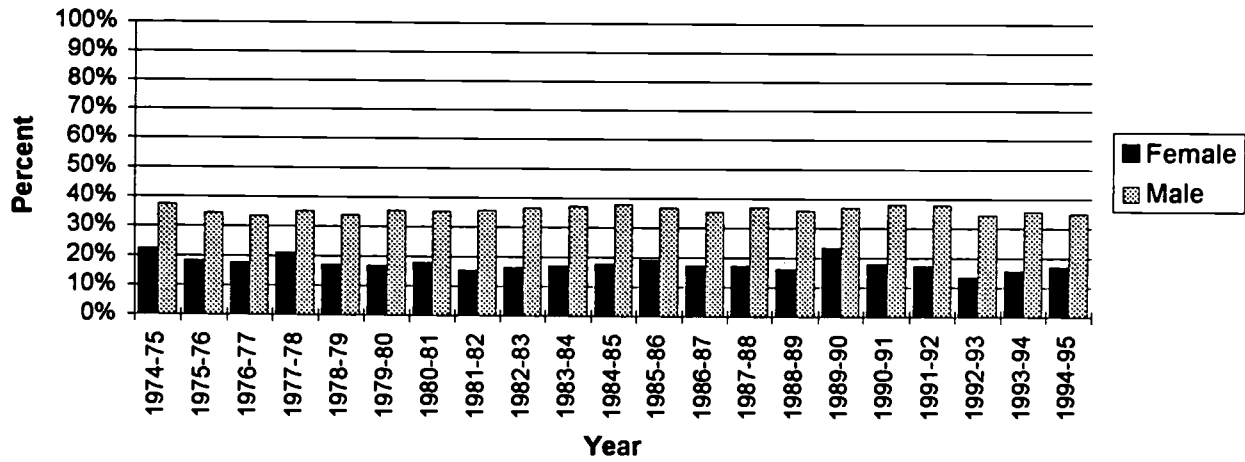

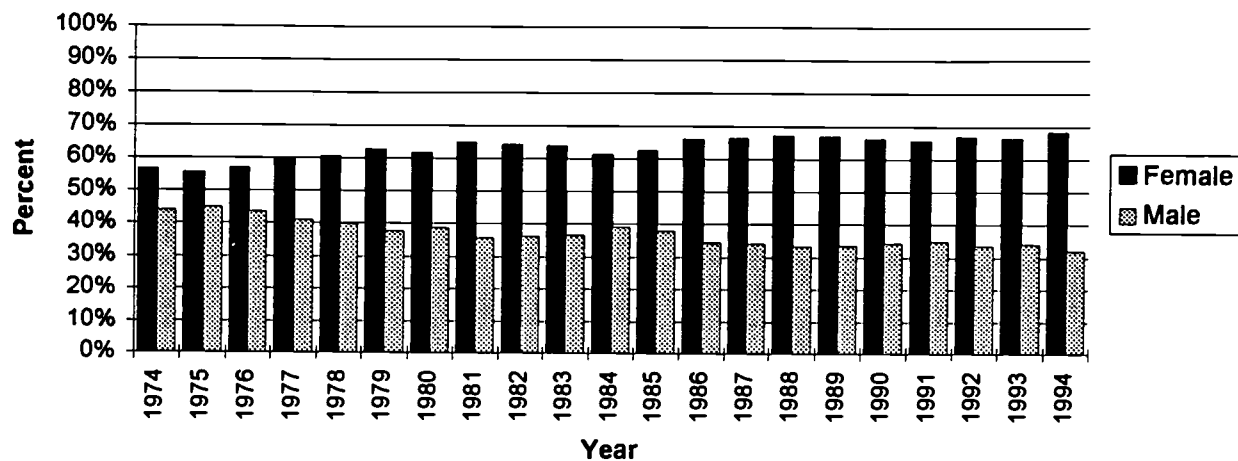

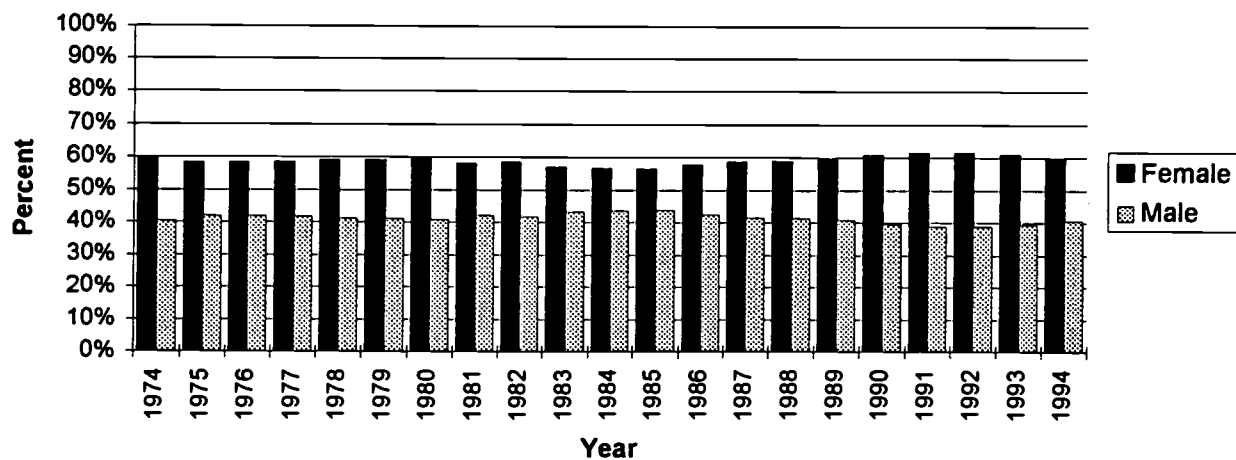
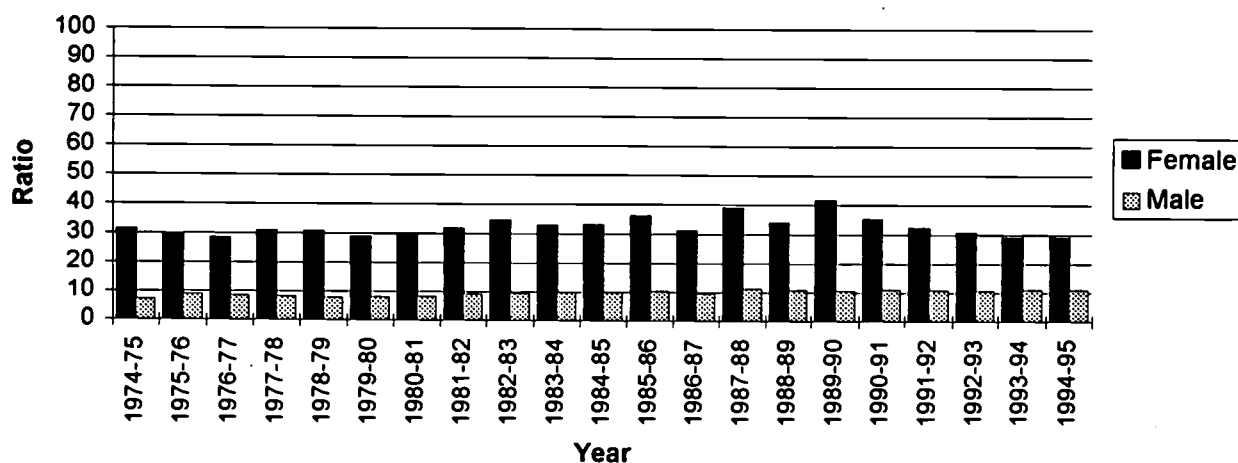

*Guidelines Developed by the American Council
on Education (ACE) Commission on Women
in Higher Education*

GUIDELINES DEVELOPED BY THE AMERICAN COUNCIL ON EDUCATION (ACE) COMMISSION ON WOMEN IN HIGHER EDUCATION

The ACE Commission on Women in Higher Education developed the following guidelines which the System Equity Plan presents as standards against which university policy and procedures should be developed:

- Demonstrate a strong commitment to understanding and addressing the concerns of women students, faculty, staff and administrators;
- Identify and correct inequities that may exist in hiring, promotion, tenure, and salary of women faculty, staff, and administrators;
- Provide a supportive campus climate for women in the classroom and in employment settings;
- Establish or reaffirm an institutional commitment to women's studies;
- Review university policies for their effect on minority women and majority women;
- Support a university planning process that addresses at each stage the question of impact on minority women and majority women;
- Review/develop and implement effective policies to address the problem of sexual harassment;
- Prepare an annual status report for the total university community;
- Initiate a campus values inventory intended to examine values issues which continue to prevent the inclusion of women in certain areas of university life;
- Develop policies, procedures, and programs that support children and families in the broadest sense;
- Promote activities which demonstrate the value of diversity to the campus life;
- Make leadership development and commitment to fostering women's leadership joint priorities;
- Establish or reaffirm the commitment to a commission on women;
- Appoint a high-level person whose formal responsibilities include advocacy for women on campus;
- Provide leadership in fostering an environment which encourages the discussion of and attention to sex equity issues.
